Art. 2. The Marshal or Judge of the Plains shall, immediately upon receiving notice, go and examine the beef or beeves that are to be killed, and make note of the brands and marks of said beef or beeves, also the name of the vendor and vendee, in a book to be kept for that purpose.

Art. 3. Butchers shall pay to said Marshal or Judge of the Plains, for each beef that they may kill, the sum of twenty-five cents. Private individuals shall pay the sum of twelve and one-half cents for each beef killed by them.

Art. 4. Any one failing to give the above mentioned notice to said Marshal or Judge of the Plains, before butchering beef, for the first offence shall be attached to each successive offence.

Art. 5. At the first meeting of the Common Council after the passage of this ordinance, they shall appoint a Judge of the Plains.
