



Phi Gamma Delta (FIJI)




Our biggest events of the year are the Applical Fiji Soccer



Alpha Kappa Alpha




the motto "supreme in service to all mankind."

The seven discovered that the Asian American population of the UCSB campus was growing rapidly and that an organization to fulfill the needs of Asian American women was needed. These ladies shared a common desire to unify the women on campus and began the process of establishing a sorority.

With much enthusiasm and dedication, the founding mothers of Sigma Kappa Chi learned the meaning of sisterhood, respect and everlasting friendship. Their intent for the sorority was to provide everlasting sisterhood, cultural awareness in the community and the pursuit of academic excellence. Today Sigma Kappa Chi continues these traditions.

Sigma Kappa Chi engages in both sisterhood activities as well as social. Such sisterhood activities include pledge/active retreats, monthly potlucks and fun trips throughout the year, for example, one to Knotts Scary Farm around Halloween. Social events include interacting with fraternities, other sororities and other campus organizations. Sigma Kappa chi offers the chance for others to get to know the girls through a program called the "Sun Buddy Program." Through this program those who join get paired up with one member of the sorority. This gives others a chance to build friendships with the sorority. In addition, throughout the year they plan activities in which they hang out with their "Sun Buddy" as well as the sorority as a whole.

Sigma Kappa chi outreaches to the community around them. The sorority plans at least two community service events a quarter. Our target community is women and children, but do not limit ourselves to just that.

With cultural awareness as one of their traditions, Sigma Kappa chi has activities throughout the year in which they learn about the Asian culture. Trips to Asian art museums in Los Angeles and San Francisco, to attending Asian American films playing on campus, to participating in the Asian American culture week only names a few ways Sigma Kappa Chi keeps themselves culturally aware of their

Delta Sigma Theta

The history of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. is a tribute to the spirit and imagination of 22



visionary college women. Eighty-seven years ago, at Howard University in Washington, D.C., Delta's youthful, dedicated Founders were committed to establishing

and maintaining a high standard of morality and scholarship among women. These young women envisioned a national organization founded on Christian principles, emphasizing sisterhood and public service.

Through the tremendous efforts of Delta's Founders, the organization continues to thrive as a sisterhood of more than 250,000 predominately Black college educated women. There are over 950 chapters located in the United States, Japan, Germany, the virgin Islands, Bermuda, Haiti, Liberia, the Bahamas and the Republic of Korea. The major programs of the Sorority are based upon the organization's Five Point Thrust.

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., Kappa Omega Chapter was founded on the University of California, Santa Barbara campus on Feb. 14, 1974 by seven influential women. Over the years, Kappa Omega members have initiated many activities which lend aid to the Black community in Santa Barbara, as well as the underrepresented minority population on campus. Some of our activities include, but are not limited to: assisting with voter registration, participation in the annual AIDS Walk, Intellectual Delta House, Turkey Drives as well as Thanksgiving Dinner, and an annual Condom Balloon Sale, candlelight vigils, and participation in the Endowment for Youth Black Achievement Awards.

Along with the many Delta sponsored activities, Kappa Omega Chapter members have also been active leaders for the campus politically. Members have expressed their interest in being positive role models by participating in campus groups/organizations such as: Black Student Union, Black Business Association, Black Pre-law, EOP Peer

Advisors, Resident Assistants, career Peers, Black Graduation Committee, and participants in Associated Students as members of Finance Board, Community Board and Legislative Council.

The National goals and standards of Delta Sigma Theta that are illustrated in our Five Point Program shine through in our Sisterhood within the members of the Chapter. 
Theta Chi
