Hamburger Habit!

The Hamburger Habit serves, undoubtedly, the best hamburger in town. I'd like to talk about the Hamburger Habit, but first there are a few things that I want you to know about the hamburger in general and about the way I feel about it.

Unlike many popular foods, you can eat a cheese-burger three times a day forever and never get sick of it. The reasons for this phenomena are vast and expansive but, by and large, simple.

• They taste good. This is true. There is something just downright yummy about buns, meat, cheese and the like. There is something very yummy, indeed. Can you say that about falafel?

• They are everywhere. Hamburgers are as ubiquitous as Michael Caine, and they can be found on just about any city street in the nation. Can you say that about falafel?

• They make all types. You want a double burger with extra pickles? You got a double burger con extra pickles. You want some chili, no cheese, some tomatoes, hold the bacon? That's the way you get it. Can you say that about falafel?

The list goes on and on and — need I say? — on. But perhaps the greatest thing about the hamburger is that, once you've found your favorite burger in town, you can get it any time you want.

I know a lot of people who came to UCSB thinking that their favorite hometown hamburger stand served up the perfect cheeseburger. It was often



depressing to listen to them wax delicious about the Lucky Greek American Burger or George's Ham-burgers and Pastrami Sands or whatever was their favorite hamburger stand back home. Most of them said that you couldn't get a decent cheeseburger in Isla Vista. I watched many of them drive hours away to In-N-Out or even Tommy's when the burger jones hit hard. It was sad.

But then somebody told me about Hamburger Habit. Talk about local! I've had relationships that haven't been as close as this Hamburger Habit. Right there on Hollister in Goleta.

Man, you want to tell me about a hamburger? Who-000! This is the genuine article, my friend. Great bite-able beef dripping chili and tomatoes and mustard, hot and steaming in a soft-but-dependable bun. For the first time since I've been here, I actually feel like someone in town knows what side of the patty to flip. They've got chili burgers,

regular burgers, double chili cheese burgers, hot dogs of commendable variety, pa-strami sandwiches and french fries like you remember. Everything that would seem so out of place in a common pretentious Santa Barbara restaurant seems so




at home and perfect in this comfortable burger nook. Everything — including the little pepperocinis and maybe some A-1 sauce for those who crave it - is there.

Hamburger Habit is airy —as any outdoor restaurant should be — but it's shady and cool when the sun is out and somehow warm and cozy when the winds blow. It's got its own parking lot, which is nice.

One of the most intriguing things about the Habit is the fine line it rides between "hamburger shack" and "sidewalk cafe." It has ele-ments of both, but it shuns the worst aspects of the two restaurant genres. That is to say the Hamburger Habit avoids the greasy (some would say "endearing") dir-tiness of the classic hamburger stand and avoids the over-serious pomp of the sidewalk cafe. It is a good line to ride, needless to say.

So check it out. Get a







There is a new night club in town, and it's strictly alternative. No ifs, ands, or buts about it, Urge is the place to be for alternative music, dancing and performances.

Every Monday night, Bruce and Debbie Greifrent out Zelo's on State Street, redecorate it, pump in some crazy alternative music, and open the place up from 8:30 p.m. to 1:30 a.m. to people who want to enjoy culture of a different flavor - on the "cutting edge," as the Griefs' describe it

"There's nothing else like this in Santa Barbara," says Bruce. "We have a lot of energy here, and people like it," Bruce added

Each week the club draws around 150 people from all walks of life — some people in jeans and t-shirts, others in black leather jackets, but a good cross section of Santa Barbara's most interesting people. This Monday, the

performance-art ensemble, XKP, will grace Urge with a thought-provoking and shocking performance art piece. The last time XKP performed at the club, it was a record breaker, with 200 people turning out for the show. XKP also performed at Pluto Books in Isla Vista last November.

Next week's performance is about "Who is sane and who is insane in the world." Craig Ellenwood, an orche-strator of the piece, says Monday night's work will be stimulating not only to the ears and eyes, but to the body. The six-member group has been experimenting with very low-frequency sounds that can't be heard, but are sensed.

Several video screens will be showing clips of different videos Ellenwood has been able to track down. Some footage will be war scenes spliced with short sex scenes, drawing together

the two images.

XKP's performance is probably closest to Skinny Puppy, Ellenwood ex-plained. The difference is that Skinny Puppy has a different performance for each song, and XKP incorporates all of its songs into one comprehensive work that explores the depths of a topic. In fact, the group continues one show where its last one left off.

"XKP means escaping your mind for awhile. Just throwing off the chains of society for awhile," Ellenwood said.

"The stuff that I want to do is on the cutting edge. I am trying to appeal to people who would not come out to see a regular performance-art piece," Ellenwood added. People find the group extremely musi-cally appealing, and the rest of the show just adds to the experience; its not the kind of performance that gets boring or repetitious.

Some might find it odd

that such an alternative club springs from the Zelo's establishment every Monday night, but it makes perfect sense that the area's most progressive and enticing restaurant would switch into a club of the caliber Urge offers
