

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
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Sushi Tired of the I.U. food joints? Looking for a change of scene? Have we got a place for you. We're talking style, we're talking good times, we're talking sushi, we're talking O's. Walk down that same-old, same-old State Street, enter Q's Sushi A Go Go, and feast your eyes on a whole new world. You don't even know what class is until you step into Q's. You pass through the entrance, and the bartender greets you. What better way to say welcome? The rich, decorative walls and dim lighting set the mood for a night yet to begin. The place is massive with separate cocktail and sushi bars downstairs. private booths on the second story, and a third level designated for billiard tables. During the day, Q's is casual and open to all, but at night, the environment turns sophisticated, quests are dressed to impress, and only those 21 and over can get in. Arrive early on the weekends, because we're not the only ones who fell in love with this place. Mmm ... menu. Begin with drinks. Something hard and strong to get the evening off to the right start - like a Diet Coke. There are free refills, but don't overdo it. They can catch up on you. Next, appetizers. Feeling a little craaaazy? How about an oyster shooter? Q's serves you a shot glass filled to the brim with an oyster and a raw egg. Sure, it may sound a little strange, but it's an experience sure to impress your friends and future kids. If you're not feeling quite so daring, there are other less intimidating appetizers, like Miso soup or popcorn shrimp. Now, on to the main courses. Q's offers approximately 20 different kinds of sushi. Indulge in the California Roll (prawn, avocado and cucumber) or the Philly Roll (salmon, cream cheese and avocado). Q's decks out its menu with a number of fun selections, like Rock Lobster (broiled lobster tail wrapped in soy paper), Let the Good Times Roll (shrimp and halibut dipped in tempura batter) and Burning Up for Some of Your Love (spicy tuna wrapped in rice, covered in avocado and topped with a tingly sauce). For all those veggie lovers out there - try a Grilled Veggie or Vegan Roll. Those of you a little wary of raw fish, the menu is filled with everything from salads to burgers to pasta. Basically, your options are endless, and your taste buds are guaranteed to be left satisfied. Though you wouldn't guess from the lavish environment, the prices are reasonable. Sushi usually goes for \$4-\$4.50, and the variety of rolls range from \$3-\$11. Most of the other main dishes remain under \$10. So, don't worry about burning a hole in your wallet. The-best part about Q's Sushi A Go Go is that your night is not simply over with a good meal. After eating, it's time to get your body moving on the dance floor downstairs, or chill on the third floor and shoot

some pool. For all those couch potatoes or sports fans, several TVs surround the restaurant, playing nonstop sports, and can be seen from almost any area on the first and second floors. Q's caters to all, and is quite a remarkable surprise: The food is


outstanding, the service is friendly, and the atmosphere is social and
