### THEOLOGIAN APPEARS TODAY IN AUDITORIUM

Dr. Reinhold Niebuhr, world renowned theologian will give a special lecture today at 3 p.m. in the Campus Auditorium on "The Problem of Nationalism and the International Community in the Nuclear Age." Admission is free.

The theologian earned his degrees at Yale Divinity School and has been honored through the years with 18 honorary degrees conferred by leading universities and colleges throughout the world. He is now Vice-President of the Union Theological Seminary in New York where he has served as a faculty member since 1928.
