





I had ideas about the upper ceiling of dining excellence. Little did I know that I was about to have my beliefs radically altered and my standards discredited at the Chase Uptown.

My date, the lovely and talented "Donna," and I were greeted at the door by a hostess of such charm and candor that I could scarce help wondering if she had not mistaken me for someone else. My heart sunk when I looked up to find that everyone was being treated this way, but I have now realized that it's probably for the better.

And then the feast began. I started with a hearty Minestrone topped with grated Parmesan cheese and accompanied by copious loaves of bread. My stunning counterpart, in her usual cu-niculous fashion, was nibbling the chef's Caesar (thankfully, the Chase made a special effort and went out of their way to satisfy Donna's special vegetarian needs) and I found that the greens were complemented

Donna's entree was the Chase's world-reknowned Fetuccine Alfredo and it was as smooth and creamy as a Gondola ride under the Bridge of Sighs. Slightly tangy from the Parmesan, the Fetuccine made it as plain as cheese pizza why it is the most highly regarded dish at the fine Chase establishment. In order to do my entree justice, I feel I must digress a bit.

As a child, just as many other children, I hated egg-plant. I really did. I felt the same about eggplant as our dear president feels about broccoli. Well, I'm a grown man now, and nobody forces me to eat anything I ces me to eat anything I don't want to eat. On this particular evening however, maybe because of the wine, I said to myself: "Johnny, if this is a truly classy estab-lishment, they will be able to make eggplant so you like it." So out I went, on a limb. That is, I ordered the Eggplant Parmigiana.

Wow, when those folks at the Chase do it up, they really do it up right. Not only was the eggplant edible, it was good! I'd have it again! It was so covered in melted mozzarella and robust tomato sauce that I almost forgot it was the food-nemesis of my childhood and I indulged without care or concern for other worldly troubles.

After our plates were

scoured and our breadbaskets sated, we turned our attention toward what we in this country modestly refer to as "afters." I would guess that the ancestral founders of the Chase referred to these particular niblets as "meals" because they were huge. So huge, in fact, that Donna was forced to put aside her Chocolate Suicide before it was vanquished from her plate. Fortunately,

the Chase has an extremely efficient Doggy Bag program which she used to her advantage.

I guess I am a true romantic at heart. I ordered Grandma Rosa's Rice Pudding for dessert. I was overcome with memories of the old country, when rice pudding was in its golden age. The Chase caters to sentimentalists like myself,

Max had grown tired of the local I.V. eateries and suggested that we head on downtown. My reply, of course: "Only if it's the Pa-radise Cafe!" We exchanged high-fives and climbed into Max's darling little European automobile.

As we made the quick jaunt downtown, Prince sang on the radio. "Touch if you will my stomach," he sang, "feel how it trembles inside." I knew the feeling. I asked Max to touch, if he would, my stomach, and he promised to do it later.

We parked with no trouble on Anacapa, and then we made our plan of attack. We thought it was going to be a big problem trying to Bean Soup and that tasty speechless. But never mind,

get a table at such a popular restaurant at such short notice. We moved quickly, stealthily and tried not to draw any attention. Suddenly, we were met by a smiling woman, who offered us a table and two menus. "This is going to be easier than I thought," I remember commenting to

Indeed, the restaurant's size is quite ample, with both inside and patio dining available, and is capable of handling a number of patrons. But anyway, we sat down and before we even had time to say "what great service," a woman came up to us to take our drink orders. I took my usual, water with lemon, and Max had a Heineken (that Max!).

The drinks were as quickly served as they were refreshing. Then it came time to make the painful decision of what we would be eating. Everything sounded so good. Max threatened to order the Red Snapper, but was soon taken aback when he saw that the Paradise offers Linguini with Tomatoes, Basil and Mussels, his favorite dish. Little did he know that he still had to make a tough decision: even though he had already selected his entree, he would later have to decide between the delicious Black

temptress, Gazpacho.

I, on the other hand, was in a world of trouble, trying to make up my mind. Just as soon as I decided on the oak-grilled Thresher Shark, the Cobb Salad popped right off the menu and screamed "delicious!" at me. I was in deep trouble. "Ahi Tuna! Ahi Tuna!" I heard a voice yell, and I realized it was me. Everything looked so good. Lamb Chops, Pork Chops, panbroiled Halibut, Mussel Pasta Salad!! There was only one way out and I took it: the Bacon Burger. The waiter came over and with a kind and understanding tone, guided me through the rest of the selection process (salad dressing, how I wanted my burger cooked, fries or pasta salad, etc.).

When the food came, I was in some kind of bizarre heaven. The incredible meal was something that I am only-now beginning to understand. I hadn't seen that many fries since that last Dead show! Max was having a field day over there with his meal. It looked great from where I was sitting: a generous pile of tender pasta topped and bottomed with a Beatle-esque medley of sauces, mussels and spices. I thought; I have a burger to contend with. A halfpound(!) of pure beef, topped with cheese and all the garden goodies and Thousand Island and still that big pile of French fries! The waiter came by again with a bottle of ketchup. He smiled and nodded, seeming to understand.

Let's just say that if the Paradise Cafe weren't so tranquil and easy a place as it is, both Max and I would have scarfed down that food, chewing only out of respect to the other diners. But as it was, we took our time, which was better by far in the long run. Each bite was a specific enjoyment, reminding me for no apparent reason of that perfect weekend Max and I spent in Catalina.

When we finally finished and got our surprisingly minimal bill, we tipped the waiter handily for a job well done and left feeling better in our minds and bodies than we had in weeks. I guess it was Max who summed up the affair the best: "Now that's good Santa Barbara cuisine!"

By now you must know that I'm a bon vivant, a man-about-town, a gentleman and a scholar. OK, maybe neither of the last two, but I'm definitely a bon vivant and a man-about-

The thing that grants me bon vivant status is that from time to time, I'll eat French. A little Camembert, a croissant or two, and I'm done right.

One of my favorite daylong trips, as a man-abouttown, is to actually get about town and sit at a sidewalk table at the Charlotte Cafe on lower State Street. I love lower State. I like to go out there and meet the "working man," the "average Joe," the "Santa Barbara Everyman," and stand around making air quotes for hours on end. One of the best places to do this, aside from the County Jail or the Goleta Valley Community Center, is on lower State Street. It's America in action, the great mixture, the grand salad bowl.

Wait, did somebody say "salad"?

Just let somebody say "salad" and then you gotta let a man come in and do the Charlotte. The Charlotte's

one of those cool places you see in early Truffaut films (not movies), where an actor sits at a cafe table, looking perfect in thick sunglasses and a striped short sleeve turtleneck. The actor snaps his or her fingers and music starts. They dance around for a couple of minutes, then rejoin the con-

versation seamlessly.
Figuring this would happen, I started snapping my fingers, trying to get the music going. Instead, one of the attentive Charlotte waitresses came to ask if everything was all right. From that moment on, I was caught in Charlotte's web.

Desperately hungry, I fought off the urge to order everything on the menu. I was tempted by the famous Zucchini Blossoms, and even more so by the exotic sounding Pizza with Duck Sausage. I've also heard very good things about the Salad Nicoise, which includes vine-ripened tomatoes, tuna, French green beans and fine greens, but today was no salad day. Since the Charlotte has conveniently marked the vegetarian dishes on the menu, I was able to avoid them easily, and chose the delicious Croissant Burger.

As I sat drinking my Cafe Au Lait, waiting for the food

to come, I watched the carsthat-go-boom drive by slowly. With each ffffffoooommmmmm coming off the street, my stomach matched it with an even louder rumble.

As has happened several times in the past, my life was saved by the pre-entree bread basket. The Charlotte does all of its baking on the premises, and one of the great things it does is set out these baskets of the most marvelous little French

The crumbs were piling up, and I voraciously yet politely scooped them up with my left hand. I looked up to find my waitress, carrying the most exquisite Croissant Burger I've seen since, well, since the time I was in Bordeaux.

I don't know about you, but for me one of the most elemental ingredients in life is horseradish, especially in Dijon mustard. So I piled the Poupon higher than I did at my last essay exam, and I looked out on State Street with watery eyes. It was bliss, and a couple sitting across from me thought I was going through a breakup. "It's just ... just the ... (sniff) Dijon mustard. I love it." The couple looked at each other, clearly disappointed.


So I sat alone, sinuses burning on State Street. happy in the knowledge that the Charlotte had Frenched me well beyond expectation.
