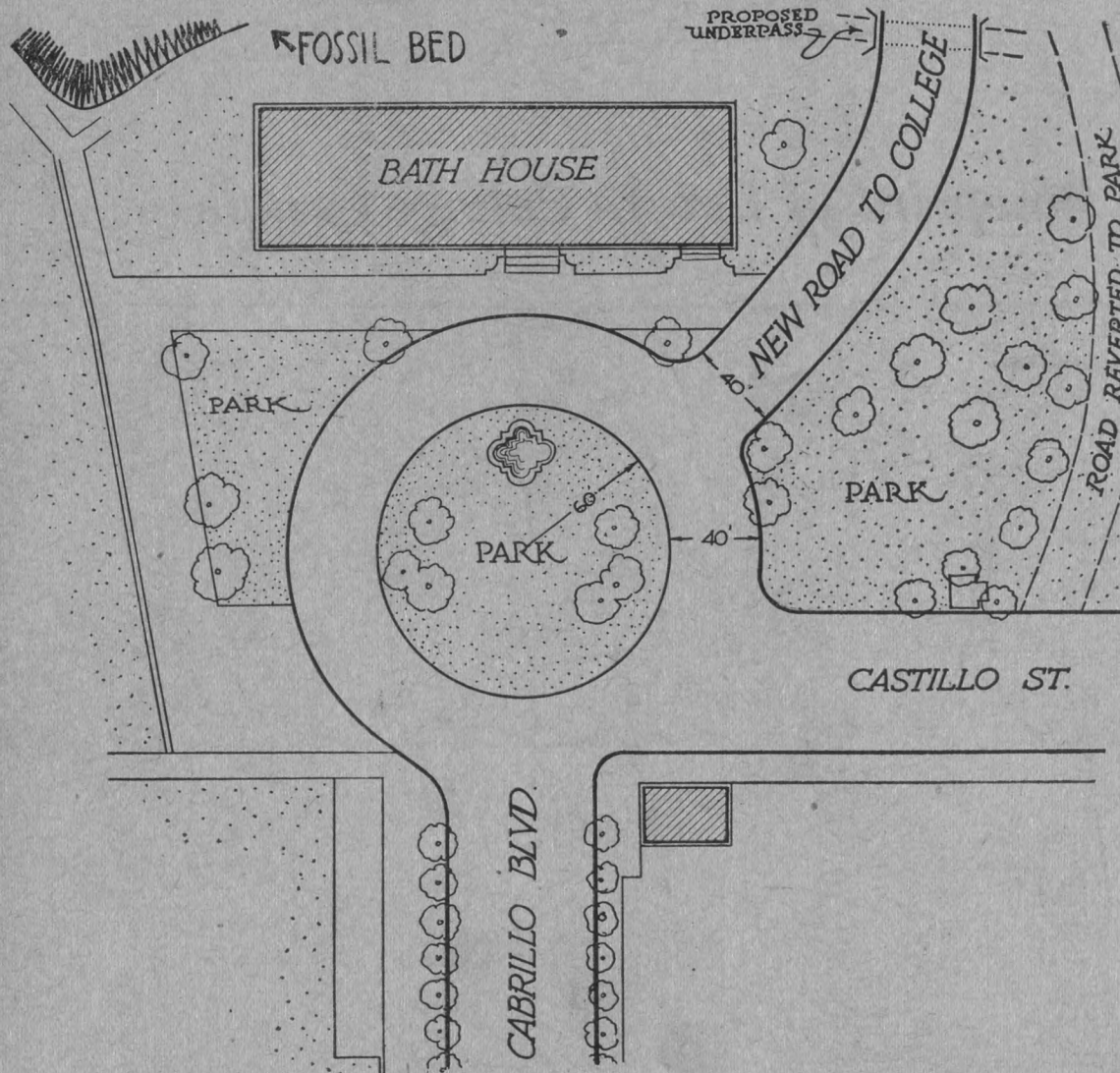

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Administration of the funds will be under the guidance of the government bureaus, P.D. Q., S.O.S., and S.O.L. In announcing the grant, Federal "G" men pointed out that the State of California had delayed too long and thus had lost their opportunity to have the honor of backing this rapidly progressing institution.

In a speech to the House of Commons in London, Sir Anthony Eden, foreign secretary, said that unless Germany moves quickly to ease up the tense situation in the Rhine zone, negotiations will prove futile. He was of the opinion that the joint proposals of Great Britain, France, Belgium and Italy have delayed the prospect of war, but unless there are more cooperative efforts between Germany and France the results will be serious. He stressed the necessity of co-operation by France.
