Track and Field Does Well at Big West Challenge Cup

After last weekend's Big West Challenge Cup it is no longer a mystery as to where the UCSB men's and women's track and field

team stands in the Big West Conference.

The two squads traveled to Cal State Fullerton Saturday and came away with a second place finish for the women and a third place showing for the men's squad. UC Irvine captured first place on the women's side, while Long Beach State was the top men's

"The women's team had a real good performance," said UCSB Head Coach Pete Dolan. "I knew we competed well on both sides [men and women] so I can't be disappointed. "I know when we go against Irvine in conference, I will be expecting better results."

The Gaucho men put together a dominant performance in the 3,000 meter race, capturing the top three spots. Senior Dave Cullum ran across the finish line first in 8:23.77. Senior Brad Glosser followed him with a time of 8:28.83. Junior Trent Bryson finished in 8:29.70. for third place.

"I'm happy with the race, but I'm more pleased with my teammates' performance," said Cullum. "We knew all three of us were capable of beating our opponents. It was kind of assumed that we would be in the top three.'

In the field events senior Charlie Gardner captured first place in the hammer throw with a mark of 158'02". Sophomore Nathan

Traxler was the top shot putter with a heave of 43'08' Senior Andy Richen was victorious in the high jump, leaping 6'8". In another outstanding performance by UCSB, Peter Ozsvath

UCSB Softball Wins Second of Two Games vs. Cal Poly

The UCSB softball team took one out of two games Saturday against #7 Cal Poly San Luis Obispo. Game one saw the Mustangs cruise to a 10-0 victory, while Santa Barbara bounced back to win game two, 4-1.

In the opener, the Mustangs (30-7, 12-5) jumped out to an early three-run lead in the top of the first and never looked back. They pounded out 10 hits, including three home runs in the victory. Third baseman Gina Doglione went deep twice and had six RBI for Cal Poly.

Senior pitcher Megan O'Brien was forced to go the distance on the mound for the Gauchos (21-20, 5-11). It was clear that it wouldn't be O'Brien's day from the onset, but since Santa Barbara only has two pitchers and the team's other hurler was needed to

throw game two, O'Brien had to stick it out.


