## Gaucho Spikers Battle With Vandals, Cruise By Broncos

■ Gauchos Remain Undefeated at Home After Victories

Nobody said it was easy. But then again, nobody thought it was going to be that tough either.

The #19 UCSB women's volleyball team barely held on this weekend to defeat the University of Idaho on Friday and Boise State on Saturday in the Thunderdome. In the process, the squad improved its home squad improved its home squad to a perfect 11.0

record to a perfect 11-0.

Both victories were hard-fought for the Gauchos (16-6 overall, 8-2 in the Big West), as they were stretched to the fullest by the Vandals, playing a five-set match, 15-12, 13-15, 15-2, 14-16, 16-14.

Santa Barbara responded on Sunday with a lackluster effort against the Broncos (9-14, 5-5), 15-6,

15-11, 15-5

"We still lack the ability to put away a good team," said UCSB Head Coach Kathy Gregory. "We are still not ready. We need to be more consistent as a team and to improve our communication on the court."

Against Idaho (19-3, 8-2), the team was caught off-guard by a strong, balanced offense. Five different Vandal players registered a total of more than 10 kills, compared to only two for Santa Barbara,

"Idaho's offense was a lot faster than we anticipated," Gregory said. "They have a quick set and a very fast slide attack. It gave us problems all night."

But the Gauchos had weapons of their own: blocking and serving. The team registered a season-high 32 blocks at the net,


along with nine service aces.

Leading the way for Santa Barbara was sophomore middle blocker Katie Crawford, who finished the game with 22 kills, 11 digs and nine blocks. Crawford, junior setter Maile Mortensen (seven) and sophomore outside hitter Erin McCown (seven) all established career highs in blocks.

"It was nice to get the win," McCown said. "We knew we could do it. But we should've never let it go to five sets."

The marathon took more than two hours and had an exciting finish. With the Gauchos down 9-5 in the rally-scoring fifth set, freshman outside hitter Kathrine Maaseide dished out two consecutive service aces to turn the

## Santa Barbara Poloists Blanked by Waves, Shot Down by Air Force

No need to tell this to the UCSB women's soccer team (4-12-1 overall, 2-4 in Big West), which snapped its sevengame losing streak with a pair of shutout victories over St. Mary's College and Utah State at Harder Stadium this weekend.

Having already been eliminated from playoff contention, the team went into the weekend with nothing to play for except pride, according to Head Coach John Cossaboon.

"These games are more of a matter of

pride than anything else," he said. "We have played some very good soccer and some very close games, so it's gratifying to finally end up on the winning side."

The Gauchos showcased a solid all-

around game in their 1-0 victory Friday night over St. Mary's (7-8 overall, 1-2 in West Coast Conference).

Santa Barbara's defense kept the Gaels offense frustrated, allowing only six shots in the entire match. Senior midfielder Kenna Bertell came up with the only goal of the match 10 minutes into the second half, on a shot from the top of the penalty box.

After losing 4-0 last season to St.

#### Men's Water Polo Update

### Offense Breaks Through in Sweep; Pair of Wins Ends Losing Streak

After coming on strong recently and claiming two straight victories, the UCSB men's water polo team headed into the weekend looking to continue its roll.

The team, however, hit a roadblock and found itself — and the streak — stopped short by Pepperdine University and the Air Force Academy.

The Gauchos (2-15 overall) just couldn't get

their offense moving in Saturday's game against #7 Pepperdine: Santa Barbara was shut out 6-0.

Pepperdine scored two first-period goals and stuck it to UCSB in the second quarter by adding another four. The Gauchos matched the Waves' defense in the second half, when neither team found the back of the

Pepperdine's unexpected defense appeared to contribute quite a bit to Santa Barbara's problems in the match.

"We weren't really prepared for the defense," said sophomore goalkeeper Lance Wahlert. "We thought they were going to

do something else."

UCSB Head Coach Joe
O'Brien also mentioned
Pepperdine's pressure as
being a key factor in the
game. "Pepperdine probably changes defense better than any team we've
seen. They're disciplined
about getting into [their
defenses]. We were a little
bit slow to adjust."



"Serving was what bailed us out," Gregory said. "For both games, we were serving well, but our passing and timing were still off. It was a heartbreak to lose those two games to Idaho. We could've put

them away."
The Gauchos had a considerably easier time against the Broncos, who came into the game third in the Eastern Division of the Big West, trailing firstplace Idaho by two games.

UCSB dominated early with a considerable size advantage and good service as it ran away with the first game 15-6.

However, with the score 10-1 in favor of the Gauchos in the second game, momentum shifted. UCSB seemed disorganized as the Broncos closed the gap to 12-11 before Santa Barbara recovered in time to finish the game.

Freshman sensation Roberta Gehlke played another spectacular game, leading the Gauchos with

18 kills and no errors for a .600 hitting percentage. She also contributed 10

digs.
"Tonight's game showed us what we're lacking," she said. "We had a lot of balls dropping in the middle. We need to cover better and pass better. There is a lot of mental work we need to do, but

we'll get it sooner or later."

Also in the second game, the UCSB injury bug struck again. Just when every member of the team was healthy, freshman middle blocker Heather Bown suffered a sprained ankle, causing her to miss the third game against the Broncos. Bown had been the only player to play all 79 games of the season prior to her injury. She is not expected to miss any matches, al-though it will be at least a week before she is 100 percent.

Santa Barbara will have to be on the top of its game this weekend, when it will be faced with the biggest matches of the season, against conference rivals #4 Long Beach State and #16 University of the Pacific.

"We need to quicken our tempo and improve our blocking against the slide," Gregory said. "Next week will be two very crucial matches."
