DEAN NOBLE NAMED ACTING PROVOST

Dr. Elmer R. Noble, Dean of Letters and Science, today was named Acting Provost of the University of California, Santa Barbara College, by President Robert Gordon Sproul. He replaces Dr. John C. Snidicor who is going on sabbatical leave beginning July 1. Dr. Snidicor has been Acting Provost since February.

Dean Noble, also a Professor of Zoology, has just returned from a year's sabbatical research in marine biology at United Kingdom laboratories in Plymouth, England.

The new chief local administrative officer received his BA, MA and PhD degrees from the UC, Berkeley. He joined the Santa Barbara College faculty in 1936 and became Dean of Letters and Science in 1951.

A Summer Session music recital will offer the talent of two UCSBC faculty mem-

bers and a guest artist on Wednesday, July 11, at 8:30 p.m. in the campus auditorium. Students and the public are invited to attend without charge.

Frances Cassard, dramatic soprano, will be the guest performer offering a program of operatic arias and folk songs of various countries. She is visiting Santa Barbara en route to Tokyo where she will become chairman of the music department of the International Christian University.

In addition, a group of two-piano works will be played by Dr. John E. Gillispie, chairman of the UCSBC music department, and Miss Shirley Munger, instructor in music.

SPEECH DEPARTMENT OFFERS READING

A reading of Budd Schulberg's story, "Your Arkansas Traveler," will be given in the campus Little Theater on Monday, July 2, at 4 p.m. The performance is open to students and the public without charge. It is the first of a series to be offered during the summer session.

Schulberg is the author of the famous novel, "What Makes Sammy Run?" and the recent motion picture, "The Harder They Fall." He also wrote the award-winning movie, "Waterfront." "Your Arkansas Traveler" is a short story based on the radio and TV industry and displays the same elements of drama, humor and characterization that made his other writings popular. It is now in preparation for a motion picture to be directed by Elia Kazan.

GRAPHIC ARTS SYMPOSIUM EVENTS

Three points of view on "The Graphic Arts at Midcentury" are being synthesized in the Thursday symposiums being presented jointly by the fine arts, industrial arts and education departments. Summer student and auditors (who are charged 50 cents a lecture) are invited to hear the lectures being presented weekly at 1 p.m. According to Dr. Paul Scherer, assistant professor of industrial arts, the symposium is designed "to present the interrelation and interdependence of the printed word and pictorial representation through readings, lectures and exhibits."

Slated for July 5 in building 431, room 102, is Jake Zeitlin, Los Angeles rare book dealer, who will speak on "The Fine Art of Books." Others include children's book illustrator Taro Yashima, cartoonist and illustrator Don Freeman, print collector Fred Grunwald, layout expert E. A. Adams and a serigraph specialist.
