Gauchos Hustle Lafayette in Hard-Fought 81-78 Victory

Gauchos Show Promise but 'Still Have a Lot of Work to Do'

The Gauchos' 81-78 victory over the Lafayette Hustlers Saturday night seemed to be a general indication of a couple of

things about UCSB.
First, as a team, there's still quite a few things that could stand to be improved upon. And secondly — but more importantly — they're on track to do just that.

The three-point win sure wasn't pretty, but the Gauchos showed good resolve after having trailed throughout most of the game against the more experienced Hustlers — a team comprised of ex-college

players.

"We still need a lot of work on a lot of phases of the game," Head Coach Jerry Pimm said. "The good news is that this team is willing to work. I think that they're going to be a good team, they're going to be a good team, they're

going to be an exciting team to watch."

Lafayette's Tim McRoberts converted on a pair of free throws to put the Hustlers up by a point at 69-68 with 3:20 remaining in the game. But after a sub-par shooting performance in the first half, UCSB guard Chris Ford came alive. He hit a threepointer from the corner to put the Gauchos ahead by one, and after a steal by point guard Phillip Turner, Ford put on the exclamation point with a slam dunk to push the UCSB lead to four.

A flurry of three-pointers by Lafayette kept it close in the waning moments, but clutch free-throw shooting by the Gauchos—and a fantastic shot by Turner with two seconds left on the shot clock preserved the win.

Clinging to a three-point lead with just under thirty seconds remaining, Turner

shook loose of his defender as the shot clock ran down, pulled up from eight feet and buried the lean-in jumper.

"He made a nice read where he went up and faked under and made a nice, soft little jump shot," Pimm said. "Our point guards late in the possession have to look to score. I went with Phillip a little more in the second half and towards the end because I thought he was doing a good job of handling the club. His experience showed, I thought, tonight."

"We had a little incentive since they beat us last year," said Turner, who finished with 10 points and seven assists. "We came together at the end and it's

good to come out with a win."

Lafayette's Ricky Hall hit a three with :22 remaining to bring the Hustlers back within two points, but after a Lafayette foul, UCSB forward Wayne Butts sunk their hopes as he made one of two free throws. The Hustlers' put up desperation shots at the end, but the Gauchos were able to secure the victory. Hall led all

scorers with 17 points.

Butts led UCSB in scoring, as he went
7-8 from the floor to finish with 15 points
while pulling down five rebounds. Butts, along with Mark Flick, combined for 26 points at the small forward spot. Flick finished with 11 points, all coming in the first half. Kyle Milling's 11 points on the night all came from the free-throw line and he finished with eight rebounds.

Center Doug Muse helped bring the crowd to life with a couple of dunks as he chipped in with nine points and five rebounds in 18 minutes of play. Duane Car-

ter added six points and had five boards. Redshirt freshman Rob Ramaker played impressively as he finished with eight points and grabbed a team-high 10

rebounds. The 6-9 Ramaker and the Gauchos have significantly bulked up from last year, and it was evident Saturday as UCSB controlled the glass, outre-bounding Lafayette 53-36.

"That was one of my goals coming into the season," Ramaker said. "I figured last year we kind of let down on the boards a little bit. It's just a real important thing for me, to come in and rebound well.

"Rob was strong tonight," Pimm said. "Rob played big and was strong on the boards. I finished the game with he and Kyle because they were both doing a good

job and they were holding onto the ball."

The Gauchos turned the ball over 13 times in the first half, but took better care of it in the second half as they finished

SB Spikers Net Co-Conference Crown

A few short months ago, the UCSB women's volleyball team was picked to finish fourth in the Big West behind Long Beach State, the University of the Pacific, and Hawaii. The poll was wrong.

With a 15-3, 15-3, 15-2 sweep over Cal State Fullerton on Saturday night, the #4-ranked Gauchos (26-3, 17-1 Big West) captured their first ever Big West title. UCSB and Long Beach finished in a tie for first and are thus the conference co-champions.

Not only did this game capture a conference title for the Gauchos, but it also ended the collegiate careers of senior outside hitters Ana Elisa Franca and Beth Kohs. Opening ceremonies honored the two women who have each played an important role in the success of the women's volleyball program this

Not only did the two seniors lead the team throughout the season, but they led the team during their final regular season match of 1993.

It did not take long for the Gauchos to take a 7-0

Poloists Cap Off Year With Upset Win Over #4 UCI

The #7-ranked UCSB men's water polo team accomplished what it set out to do on Saturday afternoon as the Gauchos clinched the best record in the MPSF Pacific Division with a 10-7 win over #4-ranked UC Irvine.

With the win coming in its final game of the 1993 season, Santa Barbara upped its overall record to 19-12, 6-4 in MPSF. UCSB also evened the season series against the Anteaters to 2-2 with the win in Irvine (17-9 overall, 6-4 in

"I think we went into the game without a lot of stress," senior Marty Asplund said. "We were pretty laid back, and I think we went straight into our gameplan and played an all-around solid match."

UCSB opened the contest with a modest offensive surge, grabbing a 3-2 first-quarter lead. Irvine, however, reversed that figure in the second quarter as the two teams entered the half tied up at 5-5.

Despite a go-ahead goal from the Anteaters in the opening minutes of the second half, UCSB junior Co-captain Doug Wierenga retied the game with 5:14 remaining in the third. Sophomore Jeff Geary added a two-point goal 1:05 later as the Gauchos entered the fourth quarter with a 8-6 lead.

Junior Nikola Ivanovic's goal with 5:31 remaining in the contest padded the Gaucho lead as the defense allowed only one Anteater goal in the fourth quarter.

"We could afford to press out more than we were used to, so they weren't able to get off many good shots," explained sophomore Adam Estabrook, who scored one of the first-quarter goals. "And the shots they did take from the outside, Matt [Flanders] was able

to get to."

"We quickly became aware of their hole-setting, and since our defense against that wasn't working that well, we began to press them further and further outside and force more outside shots," Asplund added.

The setup consisted of a 20 minute first half and a 15 minute second half, with several players changing sides to give dif-ferent looks, and the Gold team won both halves, 53-26 in the first and 35-27 in the second.

"I was really pleased

with our intensity," French said. "We're going to keep the tempo real high this season and use our depth. We've got a lot more talent than we've ever had before, and a certain amount of it tonight was sort of a misdirected hustle kind of thing, and we weren't really focused on our execution. But it's really early, and if we play that hard with as much talent as we have then we're going to have a very good

The leading scorer in the game was transfer Kellie Cook, who lit it up from all areas on the floor. Cook tallied 17 points, including 3-5 shooting from beyond the three-point arc. As a transfer, Cook will have to sit out this season as a

Seven other players logged double figures in scoring, including 15 from Lauren Goldstine and 12 each from Anna McConnell, Sasha Scardino and Amy Hughlett, who also led the team with 11 rebounds. The offense as a whole looks as solid as it ever has, with the newcomers looking as comfortable in the system as the veterans.


"It's totally different from high school — the defense and everything, so it's a lot to adjust to," said freshman Amy Smith, who scored 14 points and
