

At Alex's Cantina, the Cuisine Es Muy Fina


Few things in this world have the healing power of Mexican food. You those of you who know the meaning of the words "comidas finas" — will know what I'm talking about. That wholesome feeling after a proper Mexican meal has been consumed is an oasis of satisfaction in a world that seems to dole out too little. You know what I mean: salsa still ringing mildly in the mouth, stomach sated and feeling well-rested, eyes clear and focused, conversation hitting a fine, comfortable stride. "Yes, I would like some more coffee. Thank you. Fine." When you're out for Mexican, the hustle-bustle can take a nap, the rabid responsibilities that whip you around in your daily struggle can go take five. Your tattered spirit gets a darning. Batteries re-charged. Tank full. Water checked. Windshield washed. And then back on the road, refreshed, calm, at ease.

Since the big Mexican food boom of the late '80s, it sometimes feels like they have a taco joint or burrito barn every 12 paces. You have to be choosy. Most of it is passable, but too much of it is knock-off, ill-priced fast food, essentially. What makes it all worth the trouble, though, are those rare restaurants that know how to blend the best of all possible combinations. Places where the price, the spice and the rice are nice. Good, sit-down restaurant atmosphere, quality service, a unique style and abundant, serious food all need to be tended to. It is without qualm that I say Alex's Cantina is one of those restaurants.

Located over on Hollis-

ter in Goleta, it is wellknown that Alex's also occupies a place in the hearts of many locals, many of them college students like myself. There are many reasons why Alex's is so popular with the college crowd, not the least of which is the restaurant's fantastic price range. For just a couple (literally, a couple) dollars more than run-of-the-mill and fartoo-familiar I.V. fast food, students can get waited on in a warm booth, munch hot chips and salsa before dinner, get served margaritas, and dine on excellent and highly varied Mexican cuisine that doesn't come in a to-go bag. You can see the attraction. The selection is a big draw, too, because rather than the somewhat limiting burrito-or-taco-only fare available in I.V., one can choose from some three dozen dinners. It's beautiful. Flautas, enchiladas, tostadas (the Fiesta Tostada is an Alex's specialty, one of those larger-thanan-Easter-basket get-ups with tangy, sumptuous chicken, shredded beef or chile verde, and it comes with beans, guacamole, tomatoes, sour cream, cheese and all that stuff), chile rellenos, chimichangas, the works. They even have a vegetarian section of the menu that offers enchiladas and burritos, et al, that are very good and I know. To give you a general idea of the food at Alex's and the way they approach its preparation, let me just say that they have their own tortilla machine out by the dining area that just churns out these crazy flour tortillas. As odd as it might sound, there are few things more appetite-building than the smell of fresh, hot tortillas, straight from the machine.

Another big reason for Alex's popularity is their bar. Not only is it your

good standard bar, with dancing and craziness at night and local bands and weekly karaoke nights and all that business, but it is also the home of Alex's unbeatable happy hour. Put-ting my faith in numbers — sheer numbers, here — it is statistically impossible that you have seen a more generous, more inviting happy hour. They don't just put out some chunked cauliflower and watery ranch dressing and call it a

day, no. Happy may not be the word for it. I'm talking about abundance, with full-on tacos (not bitty ones on toothpicks, but actual tacos) and drink specials and more food than it would be polite to shake a stick at. That's why Alex's is just about the most popular gig in town. As far as I know, and you could say I've studied the subject, it's the best happy hour around.

But there are times for

parties and there are times for just getting down to brass-tack dining, and this is where I think Alex's scores its biggest triumph. Would you read my poem? If great Mexican is

what you're after, Alex's Cantina is

vour answer! Thank you.



E.J.'s relaxes Sophie - what with its rich Santa Barbara tradition, quaint decor, full bar and delicious menu, this place could relax anybody.

E.J.'s features the oldest bar in Santa Barbara. I'm not so good with dates, but if the historical pictures hanging on E.J.'s rustic walls are any sign, let's just say the place is pretty old.

And, of course, history has its virtues.

For instance, E.J.'s isn't one of those tourist stops owned by some conglomerate in Houston that has forgotten that their restaurant is only a quarter mile from the ocean; when the E.J.'s menu says "fresh fish," what they mean is some FRESH FISH!! I had the grilled snapper parmesan — a special item, mind you - and I thought that snapper might just leap up and take a snap at me!! I'm joking on that one, of course, but what I meant was, IT WAS FRESH AND IT WAS GOOD!!

Sophie had the halibut, and that too, was fresh and good; I know because she was kind enough to let me sample some. But whatever. I mean I was buying. It was really the least she could do for a date to a place like E.J.'s. She's nice though, so I don't want to come off like I'm making something big on account of that she let me sample some halibut. I mean I'd sure as sugar let her sample my halibut. If I ordered it. I mean I gave her a bite of my red snapper before she could even ask. What I'm getting at is Sophie and I are doing fine.

But I think even if we were on the rocks or mixed up in some gawdawful triangle - I'm going to ask her dad for his blessing pretty soon here, mind you - a dinner with some drinks at E.J.'s would still be a fine time.

And not just because of the fresh fish. E.J.'s knows that some of you are allergic to iodine, and they have a whole menu of choice grilled steaks, fine pastas — some of them have fresh fish in them,

though - and sandwiches, along with omelettes, salads — one of them has fresh fish - and the chef's specialties which include, along with some fresh fish, the teriyaki chicken sandwich, the E.J. burger and the steak sandwich.

So the one thing bugging me about this whole E.J.'s thing is the price. I'm not a wizard with numbers or anything like that, but something just doesn't square when you got a really nice place charging only 12 or 13 bucks for a whole plate of fresh fish like halibut. You get a soup or salad thing, too, and the baked potatoes taste like they're straight off the Concord from Ireland or another great potato country or something. Lunches are even cheaper, like six or seven bucks.

I don't know. All I can say is that I would advise you to go ahead and take advantage of this good opportunity to have a wonderful night by eating, drinking and being super happy the way you're supposed to, and go to E.J.'s.

So Renzo comes up to me and says, "Let's go to China Castle."

And I say, "'China Castle?' Is that like Ivory Tower? Sounds too fragile for us." You see, Renzo and I are large people, over 400 pounds of meat between the two of us, and looking to increase that figure all the time. "China Castle" conjured up an image of porcelain parapets or something like that; would it be enough to satisfy our hunger? Little did I know.

We went in and immediately I knew my fears had been unfounded. Man, that place is solid. Wooden beams and rafters, thick wood, a supportive atmosphere, a place where a guy can feel free to expand. And the menu, like a tome it was — three pages alone for drinks! Our waiter, Lee, brought us some tea, which was good enough for Renzo but not for me. I ordered a

Coco Loco, featured in a beautiful illustration on

the first page of the menu. Lee brought my drink while I wandered through the columns of culinary of-ferings that lay before me. I looked up, and was taken aback — when they say Coco Loco, they ain't kidding. It was encased in a ceramic coconut, a tanker of creamy, frothy, rum, brandy, gin and pineapple and coconut juices, with a straw wider than any Camel, let me tell you. Served on a napkin with cartoon fish.

Renzo and I ordered the

dinner combinations, which provided us with three courses - more than I'm taking this quarter. First came the soup, wonton for me, egg drop for Renzo. I had become accustomed to won-ton soup in your average Chinese place, which means a piece of flabby dough in a cup of hot water, not at all like my Popo used to make. Actually, she still makes it, but I'm not there to eat it. Anyway, what Lee brought me was another story entirely, the soup was more than just there to keep the dumpling warm, it was soup! It had flavor, it had color, it was soup. Renzo slurped his up with

Then the appetizers. The eggrolls? Mutually assured delectable. The paper-wrapped chicken? It made me forget that it re-

The real delight? The barbecue sparerib. Normally, when you get a bonus rib, it adds up to one mouthful of edibility, and you have to work for it, but this time no way. Voluminous viand that it was, I sank my teeth right in up to the gums and came away with pure chewing satisfaction, right down to my bones. It seemed a waste to wipe its residue away with the complimentary moist towelette Lee had provided for

Renzo had decided on his entree with methodical precision, and had sat taunting me as I waded through the menu. The Kung-Pao Chicken, he declared. He was right, of course. This is the dish by which Chinese food is measured, and I thanked him for taking that necessary step. I was having difficulty, however, choosing between the Bear Paw-Shaped Bean Curd, which captured my imagination in the way only Chinese food can, and the Breaded Scallop in Chef's Special Cream Sauce, when I saw what I knew I must have the Castle Shrimp.

No Palace Dwarf was this dish! Shrimp on the vegetables, and under the vegetables, more shrimp. The sauce, it might be said, melted in my mouth, but it did not even require that much effort; an aromatic lubricant to the senses it was. The mushrooms, peapods, broccoli and zucchini had exactly the correct texture. Exactly! The shrimp must have been made from shellfish who wanted to be eaten, it was so cooperative to my palate. Let's be honest, shrimp can never fail to please, and veggies can often leave me cold, but both were fantastic at the China Castle. Renzo agreed.

His chicken confirmed my suspicions, it was Kung-Pao from another world. It didn't overpower you like the Kung-Pao at other, lesser establishments, no, it came to you at its leisure, satisfying completely. The peanuts were superlatively distinct, the chicken bits each worth personal attention.

Then the cookies, no stinginess here. Most Chinese restaurants grudgingly give you a for-tune cookie because the authorities would revoke their Lo Mein Licenses if they didn't, but China Castle not only gave us these, but almond cookies as well. Do you know how long it's been since I savored those baked delicacies? It's been a while. Renzo's fortune was "If you distrust a man, do not employ him," which made me glad I didn't work for Renzo. Mine was "Stick to things as they are, distrust novelties." I'll be sticking to China Castle.

I thought the waitress was going to pop.


"Can I start you off with something, maybe some fresh-squeezed lemonade or iced tea?" she offered while simultaneously smiling, blinking and nodding. "OK! Let me just point out some of our best-sellers. There's the Original BBQ Chicken pizza, the Thai Chicken pizza and the Santa Fe Chicken pizza."

She said the Tuna Melt pizza was "wild." As for the Roasted Garlic Chicken pizza: "Uh-huh. Sounds terrific!"

She was impossibly enthusiastic, sloshing cup after cup of iced tea into my glass, filling and refilling our supply of whole-grain bread, grinning encouragingly from ear to ear.

Itseemed she might well burst — like an overinflated balloon — right there in front of us, exploding into a shower of golden confetti that people throw around on New Year's Eve and during the Macy's Parade.

It might've matched the decor nicely.

The California Pizza Kitchen uses wood-burning ovens to cook their pizzas, yes. It takes about three minutes, they say. That's pretty fast, isn't it. They say it gives the pizza a "smoky" flavor.

California Pizza Kitchen is a gleaming, shiny-tiled stronghold for pizza gourmets, laced with 20-foot neon tubes and paneled with shiny, ceramic tiles and wall-length mirrors

With 26 different pizzas, ranging from Caribbean Shrimp to Goat Cheese, CPK's menu runs the gamut and back again. On top of that, the California-style pizzeria offers nine salads and 15 fresh-made pasta dishes, including a plate of spinach fettucine in a tequilabased cream sauce spiced with lime and jalapeño peppers.

Dur waitress was, to say the least, quite into the whole thing. CPK is a restaurant that calls its menu a "repertoire" and touts its waiters and waitresses as "well-trained, energetic servers."

Energetic is an understatement. Perhaps it's the noon-in-midsummer lighting that does it, or maybe the crisp metallic decor shining from its open kitchen, but the service at CPK is all about hustle and bustle.

The non-smoking establishment is quintessential Paseo Nuevo, emulating the department stores and cafes that surround it in Golden State style. It's upscale, fantastically clean, emphatically ebullient and irrepressibly friendly. For those who have dined there, the fact that the chain's first location was Beverly Hills might come as no surprise.

There are now 29 CPK restaurants either operating or under construction across the nation, from Las Vegas, Nevada, to Chevy Chase, Maryland.

Why has it grown so fast in seven years? Well, one might go so far as to guess it's because of their enormous and eclectic pizza list. When I went last with two friends, the CPK chefs—who cook the pizzas in wood-burning ovens that give the pies a slight smoky flavor—set us up with a Southwestern Burrito pizza, a Duck Sausage pizza and a Roasted Garlic Chicken pizza.

Served with sides of sour cream and a green to-matillo salsa, the Southwestern's combination of black beans, cheddar cheese, onions, mild chiles and grilled chicken might give a jolt to CPK newcomers. But being a seasoned veteran, I just dove in joyously

joyously.

The Duck Sausage concoction is another unconventional pizza — not that CPK doesn't also serve the old standbys, and serve them well — blending rich duck sausage, fresh spinach, sweet sun-dried tomatoes and roasted garlic. The combination of the to-

mato's sugary pungency and the full flavor of the duck is one of CPK's finest.

The Roasted Garlic Chicken is a milder mix, concentrating more on the succulent chicken than the creation of a surprising blend. But it's just as good as CPK's more untraditional fare.

There's one more draw to CPK that just might convince students to make the trip downtown for their very own Buffalo Mozzarella calzone: UCSB students get a 20% discount through the end of December. Go ahead, try and find as good a deal anywhere else.




