DISTINGUISHED BRITISH PHILOSOPHER TO LECTURE IN SOUTH HALL TODAY

Professor John Wisdom, the distinguished British philosopher who is serving as a visiting professor at the University of California, Santa Barbara, this summer, will deliver a university lecture on the subject, "A Feature of Wittgenstein's Technique," today at 4 p.m. in the lecture room at UCSB's South Hall.

In his talk, Professor Wisdom will particularly examine Wittgenstein's warning against the idea that problems of describing such concepts as "justice," "goodness," and "mind" must be solved by providing a definition. The lecture will be based on an address delivered before a joint session of the Mind Association and the Aristotelian Society in Cambridge.

Professor Wisdom is a fellow of Trinity College in Cambridge and also a professor of philosophy at the University of Cambridge. During the past year, he has been a visiting professor at the University of California, Los Angeles. He previously served as a guest lecturer at the University of Virginia where he offered a series of talks on "Proof and Explanation." After the UCSB summer session, he will return to Cambridge.

An alumnus of the University of Cambridge where he received his B.A. in philosophy in 1924, the British philosopher also earned his M.A. at that institution. He has lectured at the University of St. Andrews in Scotland and conducted research at the National Institute of Industrial Psychology and been associated with Cambridge as a lecturer and professor for almost 30 years.

The UCSB Committee on Arts and Lectures will provide refreshments for those attending the lecture immediately following the talk in the entrance to South Hall lecture room.

PAGANINI QUARTET CONCERT JULY 15 WILL HIGHLIGHT STRING WORKSHOP

A highlight of the first annual Paganini Quartet Workshop beginning this week at the University of California, Santa Barbara, will be two concerts by the distinguished group, now in its fourth year at UCSB.

The first concert in the series, is scheduled for 8 p.m. Monday, July 15, in Campbell Hall when the quartet will play works by Haydn, Prokofiev and Beethoven. Tickets for the concert may be obtained through the Graduate Manager's Office in the Student Union.

A noon concert in Campbell Hall on Wednesday, July 17, will be the second in the series, and the final performance during the summer session is set for Friday, July 19, when a student group will also perform.

The quartet includes Henri Temianka, co-founder and first violinist; Stefan Krayk, UCSB associate professor of music and second violinist; Albert Gillis, graduate of Yale University and Juilliard School of Music and violist for the quartet, and Lucien LaPorte, co-founder of three chamber groups, formerly soloist with the New York Symphony and cellist of the Paganini group.
