Phi Gamma Delta

The brothers of the fraternity of Phi Gamma Delta are extremely excited about the upcoming school year, and for good reason. This past year the Fiji house saw not only the largest all-greek soccer tournament in school history, but also in-house concerts by bands who would usually only be seen playing in large-scale venues.

The soccer tournament, which benefited Isla Vista Youth Projects, boasted 28 teams — from UCSB, UCLA and Cal Poly San Luis Obispo — and was successfully capped off by a concert featuring Blink-182 and 98 Mute. Spring Quarter of 1997 saw our sixth annual Islander benefit concert, which featured performances by Goldfinger, Buck-o-Nine and Isla Vista's own Henchmyn. Proceeds of the Islander concert went to the Surfrider Foundation. In the past, artists to perform at the event have included Sublime, 311, the Mudsharks and Pato Banton.

In addition, the first Fiji Blood Drive began an annual tradition that will benefit

many. Helping those less fortunate than us has been and will remain a very important facet of Phi Gamma Delta life.

The Fiji social calendar not only includes social events with the many sororities on campus, but also brotherhood events including paintball, surfing competitions and road trips to Yosemite and Las Vegas. Social events with sororities include not only the regular TGs and happy hours, but also trips to see Lakers basketball, Dodgers baseball and Kings hockey games. Date parties and formals round out each quarter's social calendar.

The most important aspect of Fiji lies in our focus on the education that our brothers achieve here at UCSB. Study hours, in-house tutors and experience in a broad variety of majors make Phi Gamma Delta a very complete house.

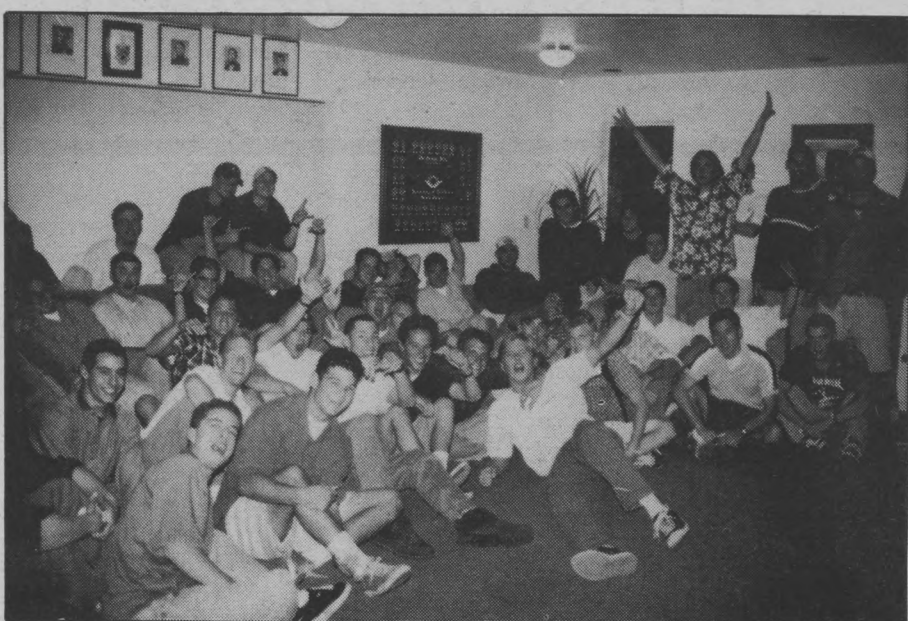
Sigma Nu has an ex-

through the university.

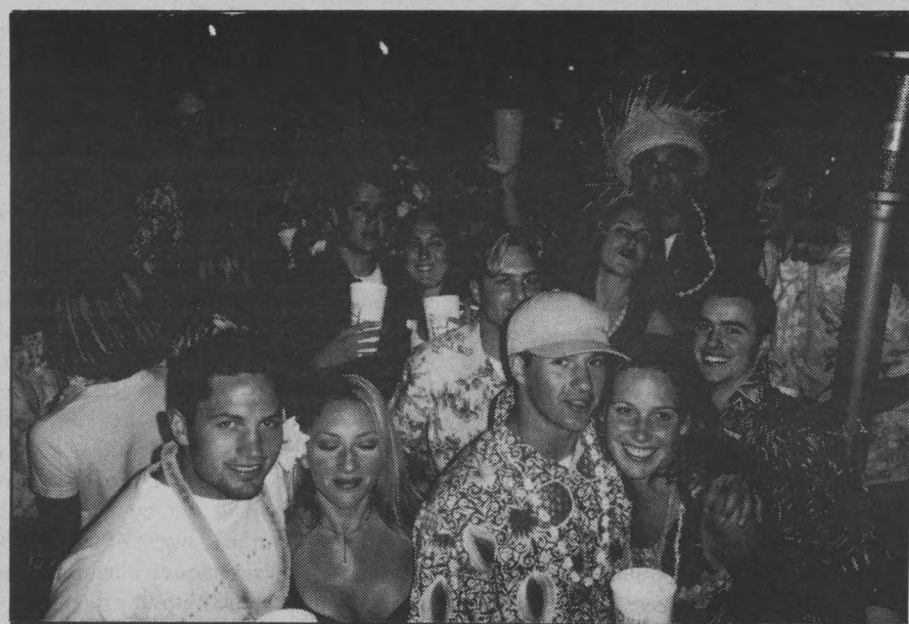
