"Wow," I thought to myself. "This guy sure is cocky."



As we started in on two more drinks (she couldn't resist trying one out for herself), two heaping plates of delicious-looking food were placed on our table. I stared slackjawed.


"Eyes were bigger than your stomach, huh?" she asked.
