PHYSICS INSTITUTE DIRECTOR TO SPEAK

DR. W. C. KELLY WILL LECTURE ON "HIGH SCHOOL SCIENCE" JULY 15

An issue of major current consideration in the nation will be the subject of Tuesday's All-College Lecture, July 15, when Dr. William C. Kelly, Director, American Institute of Physics, will speak on "The Quality of High School Science." All students and faculty are invited to attend this event, which is also open to the public. He is a visiting professor here this summer.

In his national position with the Institute, Dr. Kelly is charged with the task of improving the teaching of physics, and research in physics, at all levels of education in America. As such, he is particularly qualified to discuss high school science programs. He is also working to expand the program of visiting (continued in next column)

scientists, whereby distinguished physicists spend time at colleges and secondary schools as lecturers for periods of one to three days. A program to appraise current methods of instruction by television is also under his supervision.

Dr. Kelly received three degrees from the University of Pittsburgh and has served on its faculty from 1943 to the present where he is an Associate Professor of Physics. His research field has been beta-ray spectroscopy and he is coauthor of two textbooks, "General Physics" and "High School Physics."

In 1954-55, he held a Ford Faculty Fellowship. He was director of the Study of Apparatus for the Teaching of Physics, under the American Association of Physics Teachers. He is a member of several scientific organizations and teachers groups. He belongs to several committees of the physics teachers society.
