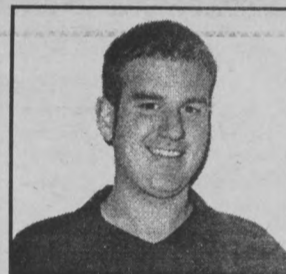

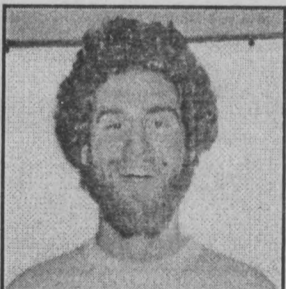
paths safe to walk and skate on, and student fees kept at a reasonable level.

"MAD COW" Patrick Schanes-Gallagher (People of Action)

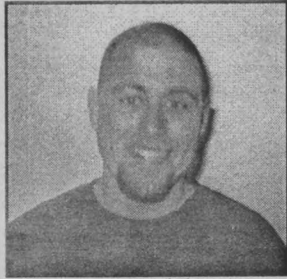

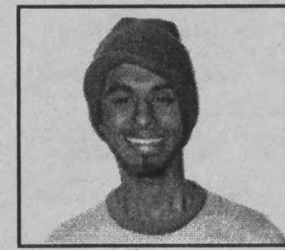


Eneri Rodriguez

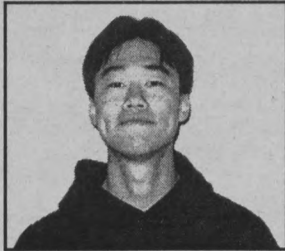

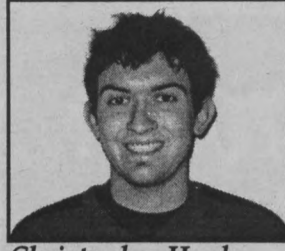


"Cheehang" Edward Yan

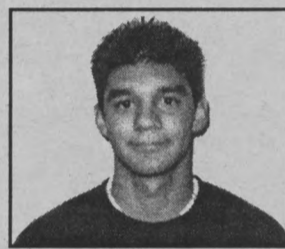


"Nick" Nicholas Negrete

about the seemingly small problems, and then fixing them, can add up to a big difference. Vote APRIL DUNLAP and vote GAUCHOHOLICS.



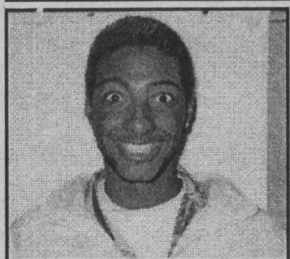

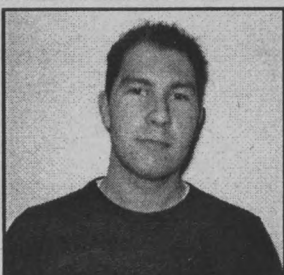

Campus Media Pro Statements

We, KCSB, the *Daily Nexus*, and *La Cumbre Yearbook*, are where students come to learn media. As UCSB's student media, we rely primarily or in part on student contributions. At present, the \$5.14 that constitutes the lock-in fee is distributed thusly: the *Daily Nexus* receives \$ 0.85; *La Cumbre Yearbook* receives \$ 0.84; KCSB receives \$1.20; Communications Personnel receives \$2.25. In return, KCSB, the *Daily Nexus*, and *La Cumbre Yearbook* offer students a chance to learn journalism and com-

munication skills in radio, print media, publishing, yearbook production, and even digital production. Because UCSB has no school of journalism and the communication department is theoretical, these campus media provide excellent training grounds for UCSB students who want to explore or pursue professional careers in these given fields.

In addition to providing students with experience not available in the classroom, campus media also provides students with high quality, inno-

vative publications and programming. The \$5.14 lock-in fee directly affects the quality of the student media, and is thus integral to the media's ability to reach students with pertinent and entertaining information. Given the low price of the lock-in over the course of the year, reaffirming the lock-in is a wise investment for the student body. We urge students of UCSB to reaffirm the student communications media lock-in.

Constitutional Amendments

Recall Amendment

Do you approve of a Constitutional Amendment to clarify the Associated Students Recall Election procedure? The amended Article VIII, Section 4, Letter A will read: Elected Officers of the Associated Students shall be subject to a "Recall Election" upon presentation to the Legislative Council of a petition signed by its constituent members in the number stated below. Members of the Judicial Council are also subject to recall by presentation of a petition, signed by ten percent (10%) of the Associated Students' Membership, to the Legislative Council.

Executive Officers shall require ten percent (10%) of the total Associated Students membership.

Representatives-At-Large shall require ten percent (10%) of the total Associated Students membership.

Off-Campus Representatives shall require ten percent (10%) of the number of students living off-campus.

On-Campus Representatives shall require ten percent (10%) of the number of students living on-campus.

University-Owned Apartments and Family Student Housing Representative shall require ten percent (10%) of the number of students living in off-campus University-owned housing.

Legislative Council Appointments Amendment

The Associated Students Constitution allows for the President to appoint replacements to the Legislative Council after all runners-up have been exhausted. Do you approve of the following amendment to Article VII, Section 4, letter c of the Associated Student Constitution?

In the case of no official runners-up, a Legislative Council Ad-Hoc Committee, chaired by the First Pro-Tempore, shall be formed to interview possible replacements and submit their recommendation for approval by a required two-thirds (2/3s) approval by the full Legislative Council. The quorum for this Ad-Hoc Committee, including the chair, shall be no less than 1/5 of the membership of the full Legislative Council. Campuswide Mandatory Fee Measures

STUDENT ATHLETICS FEE INITIATIVE

The Student Athletics Fee Initiative covers the renovation and maintenance of the major student use fields as well as construction of a new Aquatics/Tennis Court Complex. The goal is to provide students and student athletes premier sporting facilities that will enhance their participation and safety. Renovation/maintenance areas include Pauley Track, Storke Field, Robertson Field, Harder Stadium, Robertson Gym, the baseball field, and the softball field. (Renovation and maintenance of Robertson Field will be in coordination with the proposed Recreational Sports Fee Initiative.) The fee also covers construction of a new restroom facility between the baseball and softball fields and includes funds to maintain the fields once the renovations are completed. In addition, the fee will fund the development of a new Aquatics/Tennis Court Complex planned for the area adjacent to Robertson Field and Pauley Track.

To fund this facility construction and these field improvements, the Student Athletics Fee Initiative proposes a student-imposed mandatory fee of \$29.56 per undergraduate student per quarter (\$17.74 Summer Quarter) beginning in Fall 2001 and continuing through Summer 2005. The fee will increase as of Fall 2005 to \$39.56 (\$23.74 Summer Quarter) for the repayment of principal and interest and to cover the maintenance of the Aquatics/Tennis Court Complex and the renovated fields. The debt portion of the fee will continue for approximately thirty years (depending on availability of financing terms) after which the per student/per quarter amount collected will be reduced to cover maintenance and ongoing costs and submitted to a student vote for approval. STUDENT RESOURCE BUILDING FEE INITIATIVE

The Student Resource Building will provide new and improved space for key student support services such as Campus Learning Assistance Services (CLAS), Educational Opportunity Program (EOP), Greek Affairs, Women's Center, Graduate Division satellite, Orfalea Family Children's Center satellite (OFCC), Education Program for Culture Awareness (EPCA), Office of Student Life (OSL), Office of International Students and Scholars (OISS), and Early Academic Outreach (EAO). By supporting the Student Resource Building you will have access to new student space that includes meeting rooms, student lounges and offices, an open-access computer lab (approximately 40 computers), a smaller writing tutorial lab, a performance/practice hall, multipurpose rooms, kitchen facilities, and a library/information center.

Do you approve a student-imposed mandatory per student per quarter fee of \$33.33 (\$21.49 summer quarter) to begin in fall of 2004 to fund a new Student Resource Building as described above? The debt portion of the fee will continue for approximately thirty years (depending on availability of financing terms) after which the per student/per quarter amount collected will be reduced to cover maintenance and ongoing costs and submitted to a student vote for approval.

NOTE: Over the next thirty years, if outside fundraising for the building is successful, the fee assessed to students may be reduced.

RECREATIONAL SPORTS FEE INITIATIVE

Do you approve a student-imposed mandatory per student per quarter fee increase of \$12 (to augment the current \$7 per student per quarter mandatory fee) for a total of \$19 per student per quarter (including summer) to support Recreational Sports (Intramurals, Open Recreation, Sport Clubs and Adventure Programs)?
