DR. SOHN OF HARVARD LAW SCHOOL TO GIVE SPECIAL LECTURE ON RUSSIA

Prof. Louis B. Sohn of the Harvard Law School, expert in international law and author of numerous books and articles on legal subjects, will give a special lecture tomorrow (July 24) at 3 p.m. in the New Classroom lecture hall.

His topic will be, "Russia: Enemy or Competitor?" The talk, sponsored by the faculty committee on arts and lectures, will be open to the public without charge.

SPECIAL PANEL TO DISCUSS READING CONTROVERSY

"The Controversy About Reading: A Panel" will be the nature of a special discussion to take place in the new classroom lecture hall on Tuesday afternoon at 3 p.m. This debate is staged by popular demand, stemming from views put forth by Dr. E.W. Dolch in his recent All-College lecture.

Participants will be Dr. Dolch, visiting professor of education and well known authority on the teaching of reading to children; Dr. Walter H. Muller, associate professor of botany at UCSB; Mrs. Glenn Reitz, teacher of primary grades at Laguna Blanca School and writer of a national syndicated newspaper column, "Occupation Housewife;" and Dr. Thelma Damgaard of the Santa Barbara City Schools. Dr. Homer D. Swander, chairman of the Committee on Arts and Lectures who are sponsoring this special presentation will act as moderator. The public is invited to attend.

NATURE STUDY INSTITUTE BEGINS AUG.3

Summer session nature lovers in need of a good excuse for tarrying longer hereabouts need look no further.

Handily commencing August third is the two-week 27th annual Institute of Nature Study and Conservation, offered by University of California Extension in cooperation with the Santa Barbara Botanic Garden and the Santa Barbara Museum of Natural History.

Headquarters will be the Museum grounds. Daily sessions will be held, Monday through Saturday, with a top-flight teaching staff recruited to instruct in seashore life, native birds, elementary science methods, rocks and minerals, astronomy, native plants, ecology, conservation, and western trees.

Aside from morning classroom work, afternoon sessions will feature field trips, films on wild life and conservation, tours of Montecito estates and gardens.
