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The annual INSTITUTE OF NATURE STUDY AND CONSERVATION to be given by University of California Extension is scheduled for Aug. 9-21. Students with a bachelor's degree or a teaching credential are eligible for this interesting course which utilizes all the museums and the many outdoor laboratories in and around Santa Barbara. It also provides an opportunity to enjoy Santa Barbara's famous Fiesta. Field classes in seashore life, native birds, insects, native plants, western trees, rocks and minerals and elementary science methods will be included in the offerings this year. SBC faculty members and other local scientists will participate in the Institute. Applications may be obtained at the UC Extension Office, 906 Santa Barbara St., or phone 29118. Undergraduates will be admitted with permission of department chairman and divisional dean.

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THE PACIFIC COAST FESTIVAL AND INSTITUTE commenced June 24, and will continue daily through July 4. Information regarding this outstanding musical event with its exceptional offering of educational entertainment may be obtained by calling the headquarters at the Santa Barbara Biltmore Hotel, phone 92261.

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REGISTRATION PROCEDURE—The registration lines will form at 9 a.m. today, with nonveteran students reporting to North Hall and veteran students reporting to the auditorium in the administration building. Those who have not yet obtained a copy of the Summer Session Bulletin which includes all classes scheduled, may secure a copy at the Registrar's office in the Administration Building. For the 1954 Summer Session there is no minimum load, however $6\frac{1}{2}$ units constitute the maximum load without petition. Excess loads may be granted in exceptional cases by petition when Aug. 1954 or Jan. 1955 graduation would otherwise be hindered. Need for excess programs is to be established by the student and his adviser with approval by the appropriate academic dean. Classes will begin Mon. June 28, and class enrollment cards will be filed with instructors on that day. Completed registration books will be collected at the office of the Registrar Thurs. and Fri., July 1 and 2. Cover of registration book must be signed by department chairman or adviser and by Dean of Men or Dean of Women. Health examinations are not required for the Summer Session.

HOUSING--Velma Morrell, housing supervisor, says there is ample housing available for Summer Session students. Anyone needing assistance in finding a place to live should contact her office.

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STUDENT PARKING--Students will not be permitted to park in the faculty parking areas during the summer session, according to Captain of Police, Floyd Bernard. Cars will be tagged on violation of this regulation.

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BOOKSTORE-Beginning today, the College Bookstore will be open from 8 a.m. to 1 p.m. during the registration period. After registration, the hours will be 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. The store will be closed July 1 and 2 for inventory.

LIBRARY HOURS--Main Library: 8-5, Monday through Friday; 9-12 on Saturday; closed Sunday. Reserve Book Room: 8-5 Monday through Friday; closed Saturday and Sunday. Mesa Campus Branch: 8-5 Monday through Friday; closed Saturday and Sunday.

LOST AND FOUND--The University of California Police maintain a lost and found service, located near the stairway to the library in the Administration Building.

GRADUATE MANAGER'S NOTES--Robert Lorden, Graduate Manager for the Associated Students, announced that personal checks up to \$25 will be cashed by his office for all registered students. As of July 1, job listings will be posted on the bulletin board outside the Graduate Manager's office for men students seeking part-time employment. The Graduate Manager's office is situated in Ebbets Hall.

STUDENT HEALTH SERVICE—During the entire summer session the Student Health Service will provide medical service to students on a 24-hour a day basis.

SNACK BAR--All food will be served outdoors in the California tradition this summer at the Lone Pine Snack Shack, near Ebbets Hall. Beginning today, the Shack will be open from 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. for the duration.
