VISITING SCULPTOR TO GIVE UNIVERSITY TALK

Dr. George Rickey, nationally known sculptor and visiting professor of art at UCSB this summer, will give the third talk in the Summer Session University Lecture Series on Tuesday at 3 p.m. in the Classroom Building Lecture Hall. Dr. Rickey's subject will be "Head and Heart in Modern Art - The First Generation." Admission is free.

The university lecturer has recently been awarded the coveted Guggenheim Fellowship for the coming year enabling him to conduct studies of the physics of motion in relation to creative sculpture. During this Summer Session, Dr. Rickey is participating in the interdepartmental program, "The Practice of Criticism in the Arts." During regular session, he holds the position of Professor of Art at Newcomb College at Tulane University.
