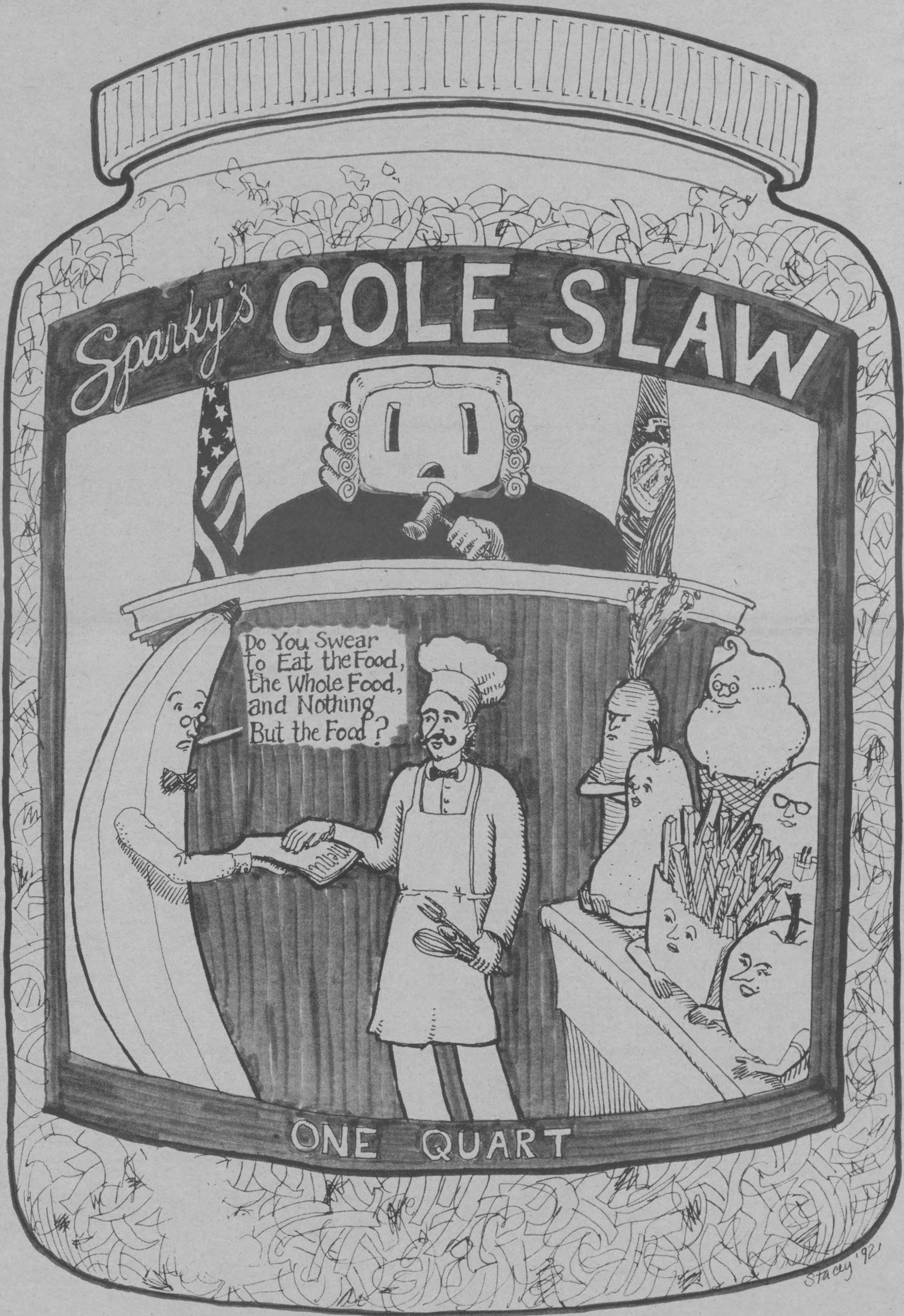

E-Bar is Above Par!

Perhaps it would be easier to begin with what the Elephant Bar is *not*.

The E Bar is not a loud, college "theme bar" with more TV screen-space than floor space, and perfectly useful surfboards hanging from the ceiling and, oh, sure there's a dinner menu, if you don't mind a choice between Bingo's Bodacious Buttersteak (the waiter's grudging favorite) and Annette's Fun-a-Jello, and you accept the truth that the only way you're going to get the food down is with generous helpings from the "Beachbreak Bar," which takes up half the place anyway.

Nor is the E Bar a hole-in-the-wall floofy-poofty Italian place named after a Portuguese painter, with four glass tables and a reservation list as long as the place is small, and the menu only has three dishes tonight, including "Starry Night Game Hen" and "Christine's World Fish Platter," and — is that *real granite* supporting the tabletop? — and why is the hostess dressed like Martha Graham, and if they serve espresso for their house coffee you swear

you'll just kill them, and ... (jaw goes limp) if you buy even the cheapest bottle of wine in the place, there goes the down payment on that R.V., and why can't you just get a couple-three margaritas?

Nor is the E Bar one of those chain "Family Restaurants" with full-color, laminated menus, sent straight from headquarters in Battle Creek, Mich., and cooks who sold their soul to be able to reproduce the photos *just right*, without regard for style or even taste, and do they only serve domestic beer, and shut that kid up, will you? Why is the waitress smoking?

The E Bar doesn't mess around with such frivolities or mediocrities; the people there are too busy putting out real food, big food, and sloshing up the sweetest, sourest margaritas this side of Ajijic.

When you walk into the E Bar, the mahogany sings to you, the copious foliage sets your vitamin count just so, the spacious decor fills your right brain with notions of the Indian subcontinent, and the sight of that bar — a wall of bottles, set off by two extravagant tusks — gets your mouth watering like monsoon season.

A look at the E Bar menu tells you instantly that you've come to a place where the cook has a personality, not a vengeance. And you can tell the back office isn't trying to break you with the prices.

A generous selection of easily priced burgers, a choice of hot and cold sandwiches, pastas and full specialty entrees all greet the picky diner with a wide selection of food and prices.

There is a waiter at the E Bar who goes by the name of "Rich." He'll bring you those margaritas I keep talking about, and he'll only charge you the happy-hour price, provided it's happy hour. I asked Rich if the salt for the cold, shimmering delights came from the mines of King Solomon. He assured me it did not. From the briny halls of Atlantis? No. I liked it anyway.

But the best thing about Rich, besides that he looks and talks like Kevin Kline, is that he'll bring you a plate of nachos the size of Pakistan. And if you order the char-broiled mustard chicken for a fraction of what you thought such a fine dish would cost you at a nice place like the E Bar, Rich will bring that to you, too.

And if you say you've

been to the E Bar before, but you're not sure the quality is up where it was in better times, let me assure you, the E Bar is still pumping out the great food and drinks for low, low prices, just like always. An elephant never forgets.

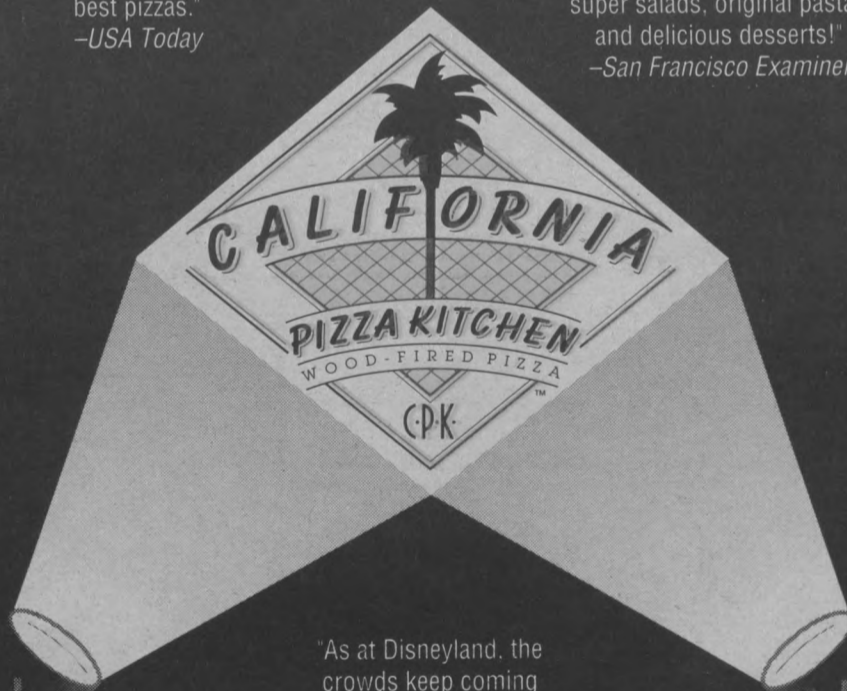

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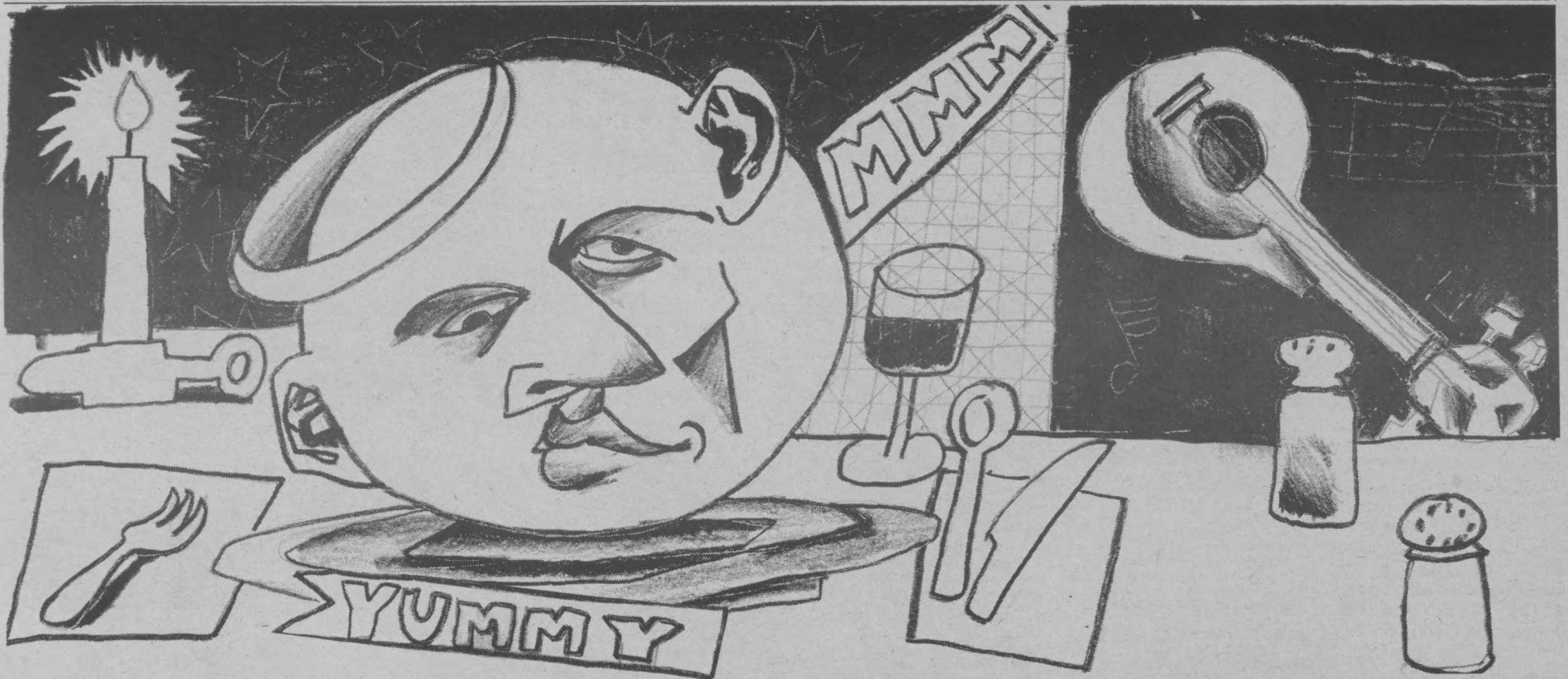

Steff just kept on looking at that menu.

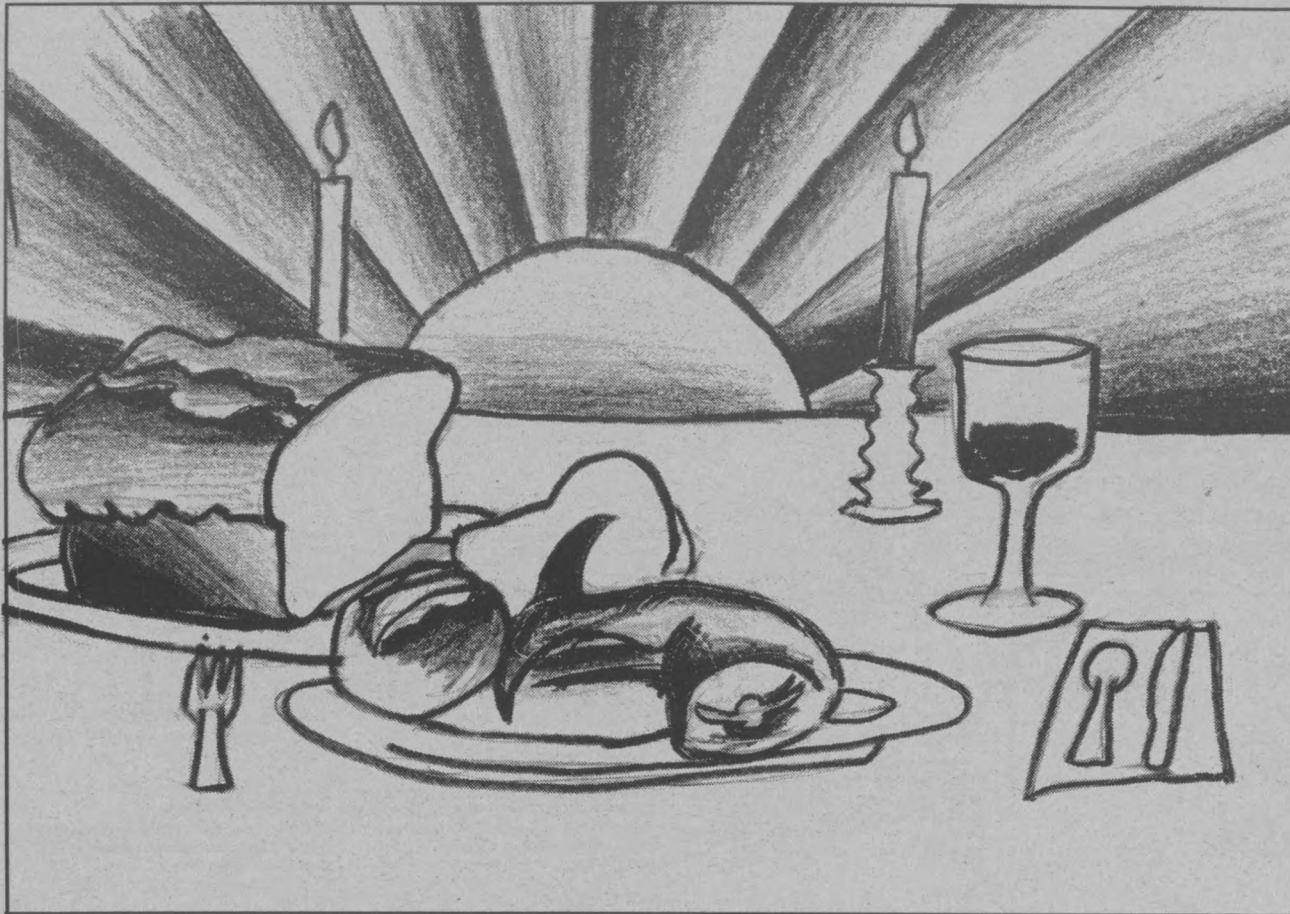

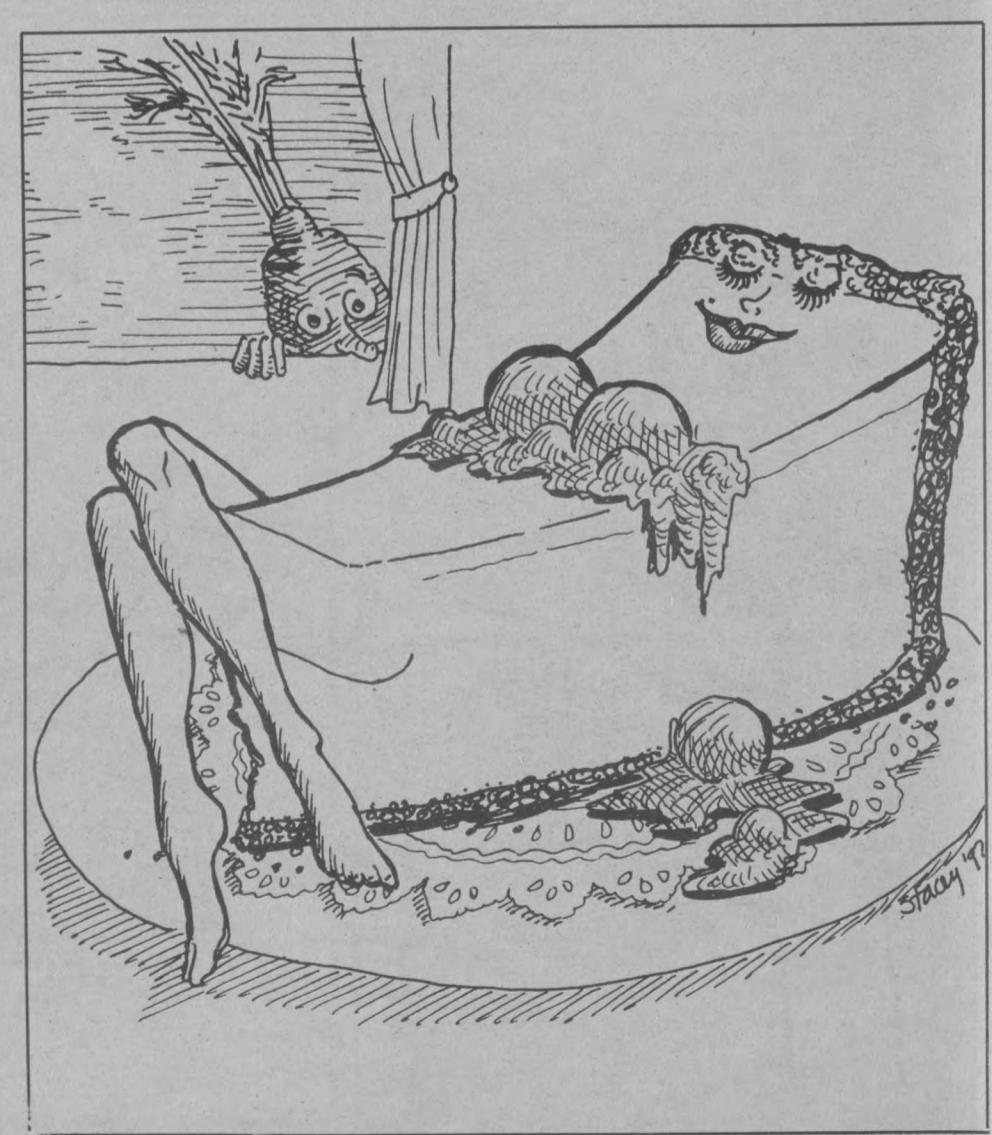

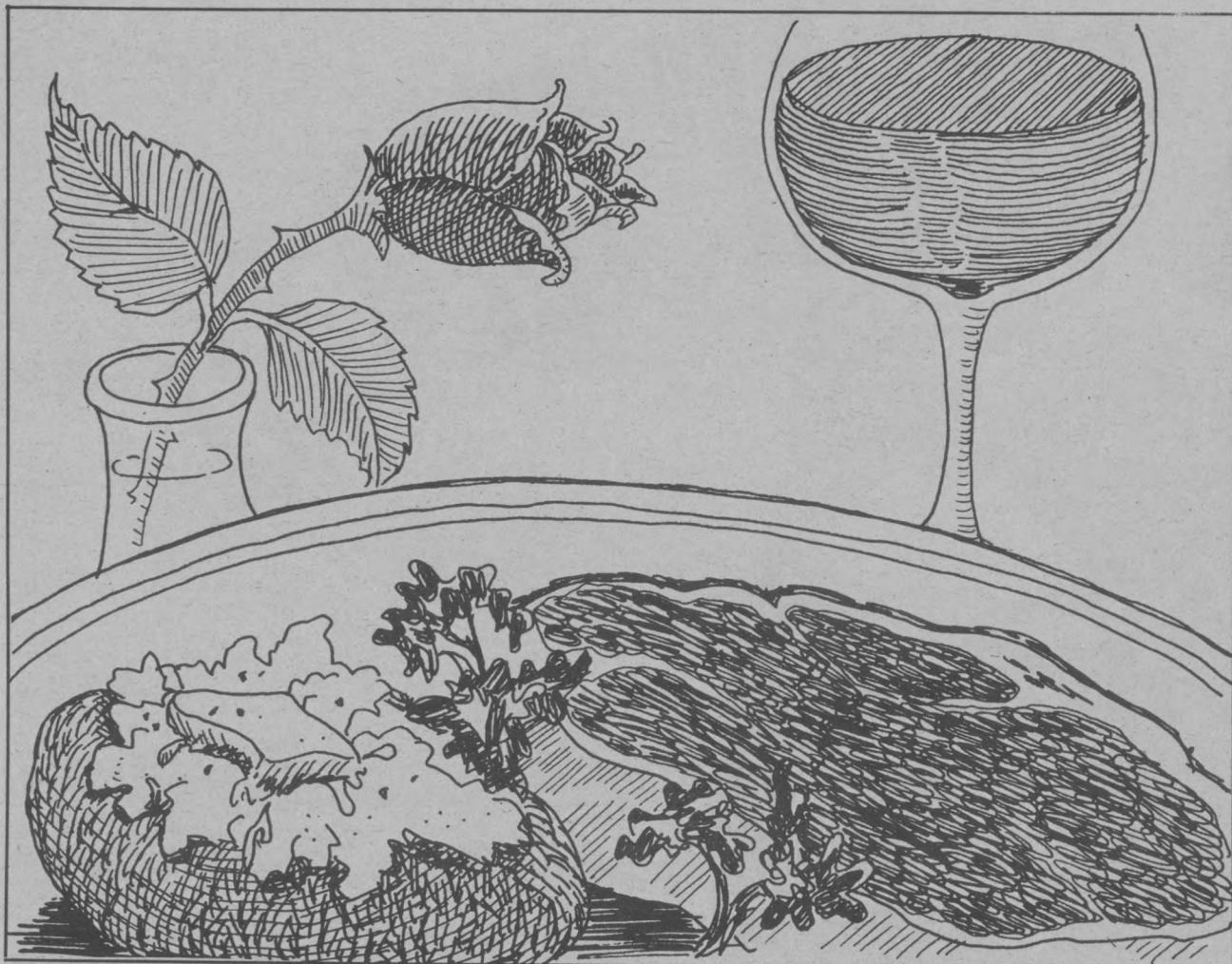

When was the last time you had a really good steak?

You know, a steak that's not about Slim-Fasts or VCRs or George Michaels or \$20 smog-checks. A steak that's not about Gulf Wars or the incredible new inflatable shoes or "Amazing Discoveries" or Julia Roberts. A steak that's about dinner, about beef, about tender, about food, about medium-rare, about a half-pound thick.

If you've been to Cattlemen's in the last 20 minutes then the answer is "20 minutes ago."

Cattlemen's Restaurant and Saloon, located close to La Cumbre Plaza on State Street, is a restaurant that

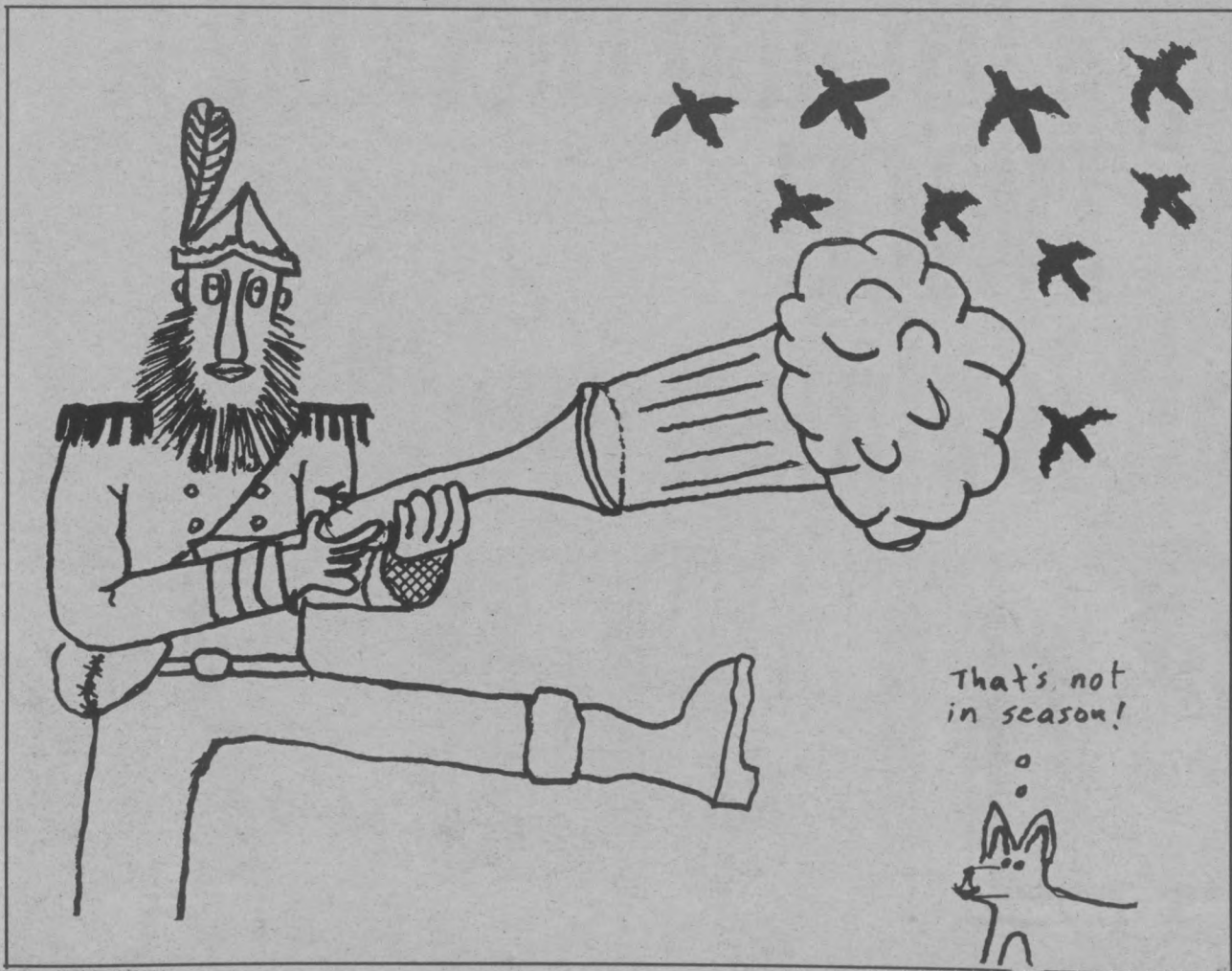

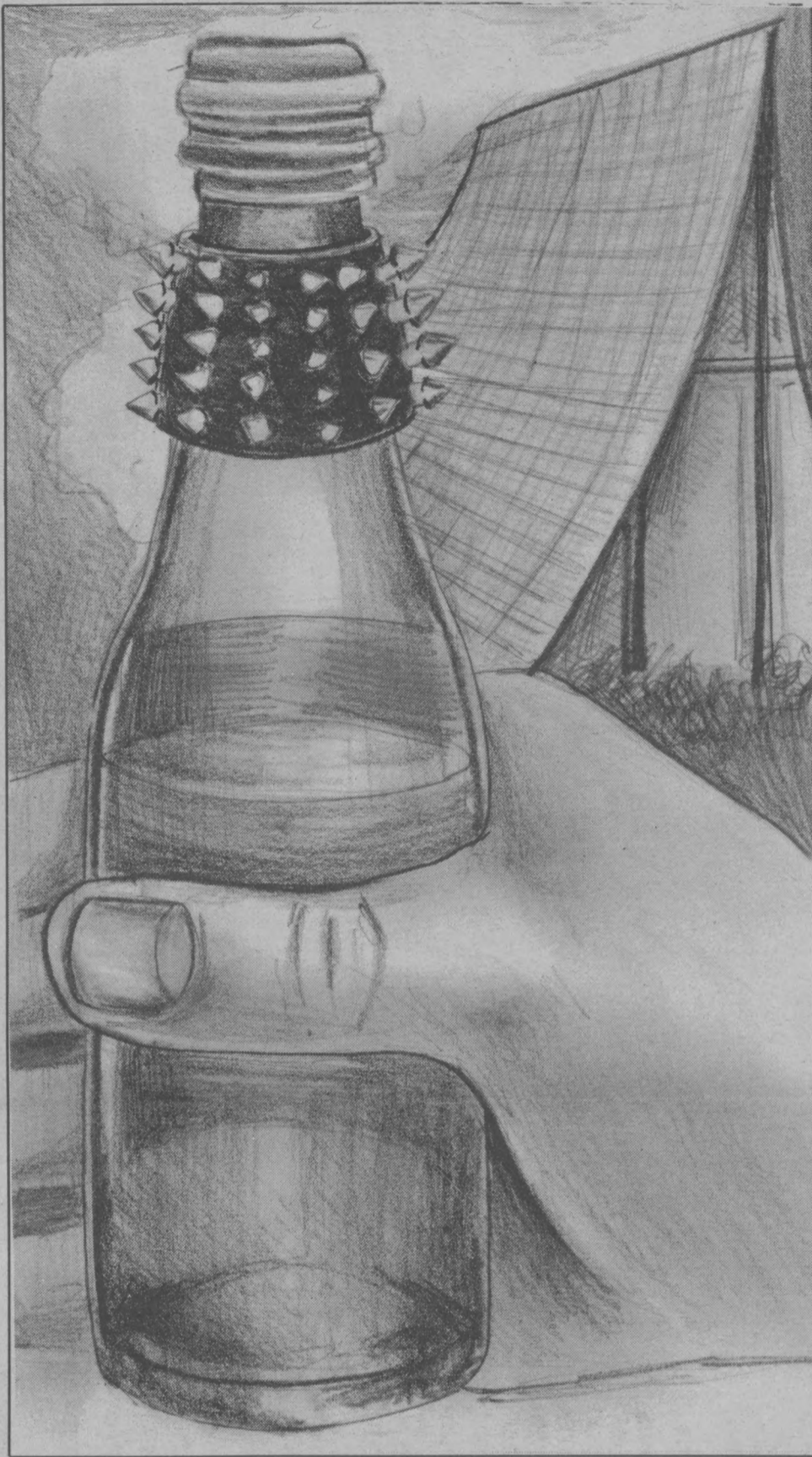
