ZOOLOGIST TO GIVE ALL-COLLEGE TALK

Dr. R. Phillips Dales from the University of London, who is serving on the staff of the NSF Institute in Marine Science this summer will give an All-College lecture next Tuesday afternoon at 3 p.m. in the New Classroom Lecture Hall on the subject, "On Living in Sand: Problems of Life on the Beach."

Dr. Dales, a zoologist, is teaching the course in marine biology, which is the core course in the Institute. He earned both his BS and PhD. degrees from Queen Mary College in the field of zoology and then worked as a post-graduate travelling fellow at the Scripps Institution of Oceanography in La Jolla.
