What's CAB?





PR Co-Chairs



Volunteer Everywhere!

Welcome to a new and exciting year with the Community Affairs Board! There are wonderful opportunities waiting for each and every one of you. Come check out CAB's computer database which will make finding the right volunteer opportunity for you a breeze.

Here are just some of the categories you have to choose from:

Law and Politics

If you are a "take charge" individual who enjoys responsibility and isn't afraid to make hard decisions, then consider becoming a legal or political volunteer. You will gain practical knowledge of processes and institutions, as well as develop contacts and mentors within the legal and political profession. CAB places volunteers in a variety of agencies including the Santa Barbara County Probation Office and the Legal Aid Foundation, as well as private practices and corporate volunteer programs. Begin examining your career options within the legal and political profession.

Hunger/Homeless

The hunger/homelessness issue is another area in which volunteers get satisfaction from working with the local community. Volunteers are dedicated to helping meet the basic needs of people in Isla Vista and surrounding communities by working with such organizations as Transition House and The Food Bank of Santa Barbara. There are many ways to get involved. You can help organize a food drive, keep a shelter running efficiently, or get really creative with your concerns and come in with your brainstorm on new ways to help. You can use your skills, commitment, and concern to really make a difference!

Health & Medical

If you are a pre-med student and haven't yet been exposed to the reality of emergency rooms, nursing homes or medical laboratories, CAB has an opportunity for you! Our medical volunteer positions give students the chance for "hands on" experience in health related fields. Volunteers work at many agencies including St. Francis and Cottage Hospitals, Goleta Valley Hospital, and I.V. Health Projects, as well as in medical laboratories. You can learn basic skills in taking patients vitals, observing medical surgery, emergency room services, performing basic laboratory tests, and interacting with physicians in these various medical environments. As a student, these volunteer opportunities allow you to experience various medical career options before making decisions about your future.

Counseling

Lend an ear, some advice, and some time as you develop interpersonal skills and become involved in important social issues. CAB will connect you with a social service agency of your choice such as Helpline, C.A.L.M., Transition House, Council on Alcoholism & Drug Abuse, or the Rape Crisis Center. You will receive up-to-date training in counseling techniques. By working with professionals in the community, you can gain valuable experience as you counsel those seeking direction and growth.

Senior Citizens

Do you miss your grandparents at home? Do you want to make friends with someone who's not from your generation? Whatever

the reason, you will build lasting friendships. As a volunteer be a senior escort and accompany seniors on trips to the symphony, zoo, or the beach. Adopt a grandparent and develop a special friendship. Bring along your guitar or best "star" voice and join in a weekly sing-a-long at Friendship Manor in Isla Vista. You can also volunteer at other retirement homes in Santa Barbara or at the home of a local senior citizen. Seniors need your friendship, energy, and cheer. Make a friend and meet a senior!

Environment

Oil spills, toxic waste, and air pollution are not the things many of us want to pass on to future generations. CAB has volunteer opportunities which allow students to do their share in saving the Earth. Program such as CalPIRG, Community Environmental Council, and Santa Barbara Botanic Gardens encourage volunteers to work on local environmental issues in the Isla Vista, Goleta, and Santa Barbara communities. Students working with these agencies will increase their knowledge of environmental problems on a broad scope while directly working on their own individual projects.

Youth & Childcare

A little of your time can make a BIG difference in a young person's life! Take advantage of the many opportunities CAB has to offer. You can provide companionship and academic enrichment for children. Volunteer a few hours a week with the Boys and Girls Club, Girls Inc., Isla Vista Youth Projects, Klein Bottle Youth Programs and various others. Now is your chance to experience the many rewards of being a special friend to a young child. Do you want to teach? You can also form important relationships as a child's tutor. As a tutor you can build your self-esteem and confidence as a teacher, and also help a child to improve academically. Experience the satisfaction of watching a child's grades improve and their future grow.

Animal Care

Do you love animals...dogs, cats, monkeys, elephants? Well, whatever your fancy, CAB's animal volunteer opportunities can fit the bill. The Dog Adoption and Welfare Group program allows students to help stray and abandoned dogs receive the love and care they so greatly need. Cats need people too, and the Santa Barbara County Animal Shelter has them. Not enough? How about spending some time at the Santa Barbara Zoo as a tour guide, zoo educator or feeder? There are plenty of needy animals out there, so stop by CAB and we'll help you find the right opportunity for you.

Advertising & Publicity

Get involved and gain hands-on experience in public relations and promotion. Work with various organizations such as Family Service Agency of Santa Barbara and Direct Relief International to create flyers, posters, ads, brochures, newsletters, etc.

Special Education

By volunteering in the special education area, you will have the opportunity to enhance the lives of numerous Santa Barbara County residents. By working with organizations such as Recording For the Blind, Hollister Schools' Special Education, Santa Barbara's Therapeutic Riding Academy, and Special Olympics, you will have the chance to learn more about people, develop a better understanding of physical and mental disabilities, and help others work in an educational forum.

Mayor and City Council Office, Alzheimer's Association, Arthritis Foundation, Big Brother/Sister of Santa Barbara, Goleta Valley Community Hospital, Klein Bottle Youth Programs, Legal Aid Foundation, Santa Barbara Natural History Museum, Stop Aids Now, and the American Red Cross.

Business & Economics

Want to gain some great hands on business and economic experience while working with interesting people and important issues? The Community Action Commission, CalPIRG, Women's Economic Ventures, Adoption Center of Santa Barbara, and even the Community Affairs Board are all looking for student volunteers to help on business and economic issues. Art & Cultural


Getting Started


Volunteering is as simple as. . .
