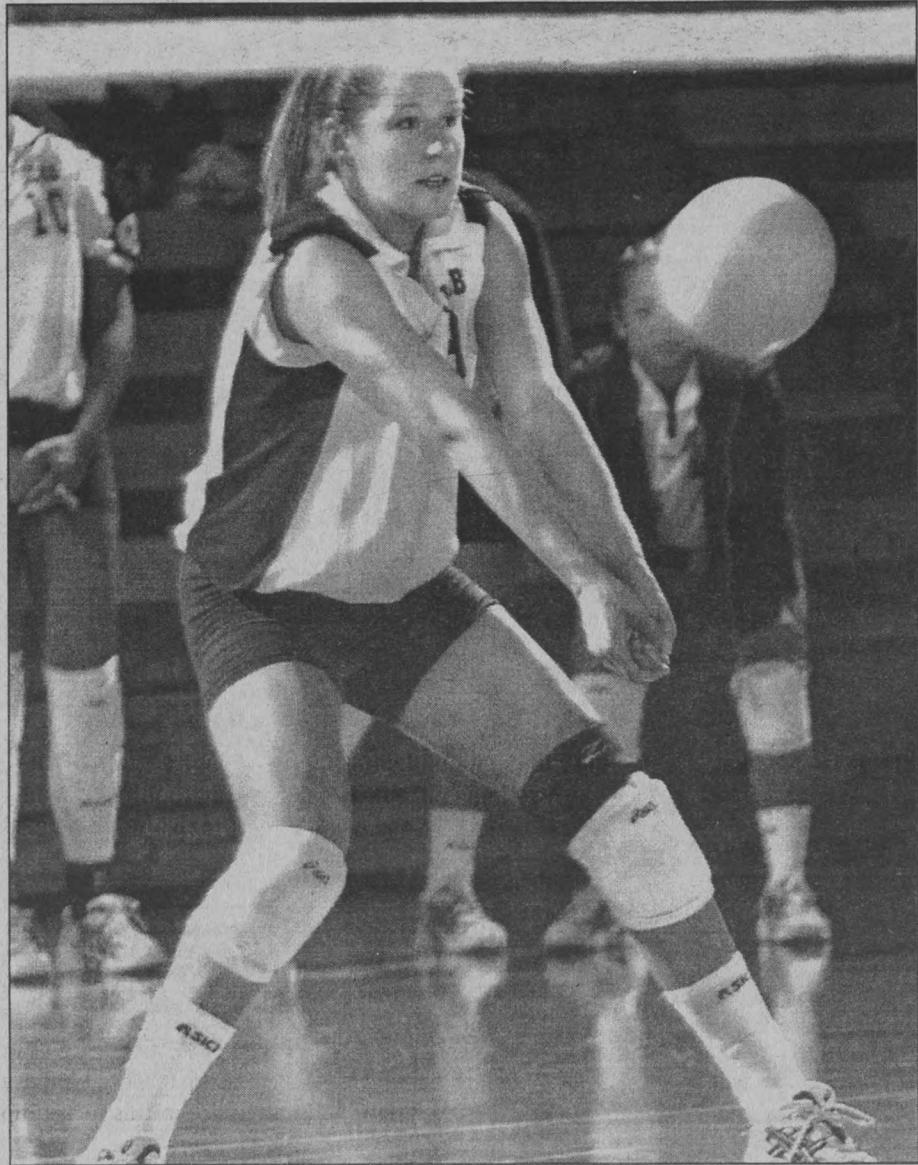

UCSB Bumps Fullerton, Irvine on Weekend Road Trip

The Gauchos had little trouble knocking off Cal State Fullerton on Friday night (5-15, 15-8, 15-8, 15-7), and swept UC Irvine on Saturday (15-10, 15-6, 15-8).

As the weather is starting to cool down in Santa Barbara, the #14 UCSB women's volleyball team is starting to get hot.

The Gauchos are in the midst of their longest winning streak of the season, five in a row, and are coming off two big wins over Cal State Fullerton and UC Irvine this past weekend.

On Friday night, the Gauchos (14-4 overall, 5-1 in the Big West) overcame the Titans in four games, 5-15, 15-8, 15-8, 15-7, and then swept the Anteaters on Saturday night, 15-10, 15-6, 15-8.

"We didn't show up to play at all in the first game," sophomore outside hitter Brooke Niles said. "But after that wake-up call, we regrouped, and I thought that we came back well. Everybody contributed after that first game, and that made all the difference for us. When we play with unity we are a really tough team to play."

Fullerton (6-12, 1-5) came out strong in game one and led by as many as 11. Despite a small rally by the Gauchos, the Titans rolled to a 15-5 game-one victory.

Game one served as the Gauchos' wake-up call, and they then proceeded to crush Fullerton in games two, three, and four behind their trademark tough serving and stingy defense.

The statistic that told the tale of the game was total team blocks, where UCSB held a 10-4 advantage over the Titans at the end of the match.

"The start was rough for us, but after that I think we settled down well," junior setter Brooke Rundle said. "That is a

team we should beat in three, but we will take the victories on the road however we can get them."

On Saturday night, Santa Barbara refused to let the Anteaters into the match. The Gauchos started off slow, winning the first game by only five points, but refused to let up. Sophomore middle blocker Danielle Bauer, who was huge earlier this season against Long Beach State and the University of the Pacific, dominated the net against Irvine. Bauer tossed in a match-high 20 kills, while hitting at .548 and adding 16 digs from the back row as well.

Even though Bauer stole the show Saturday, the Gauchos needed steady performances from Rundle, freshman outside hitter Erica Menzel and 6'2" freshman middle blocker Simone Kuhn in order to pull out the victory. Menzel, a Santa Barbara native, had 10 kills and eight digs on the evening. Team captain Rundle set the tone for UCSB, distributing 33 assists, nine of which went to Kuhn for kills in the middle.

The wins over Fullerton and Irvine were important, but the Gauchos now have bigger fish to fry. This coming week the Gauchos square off against perennial league powers #13 UOP on Thursday night in Stockton, and then against #18 Long Beach State in Long Beach on Saturday.

"Those were two wins that we needed badly," Niles said. "Every win we can get in our league is crucial. We feel good as a team, though. We are playing well, and if we can take the two matches this next week from Long Beach and UOP, we will be in great shape heading into the home stretch."

Gauchos Outdone in Overtime

On a cold and foggy Sunday evening, the UCSB men's soccer team fell short of knocking off perennial powerhouse Cal State Fullerton. The Gauchos kept the game scoreless until the end of regulation, yet lost on a header by Fullerton senior mid-fielder Art Hernandez in the 11th minute of overtime.

The 1-0 defeat marked Santa Barbara's third overtime loss of the season and second loss in a row. UCSB slides to 6-8 overall and 1-2 in Mountain Pacific Sports Federation play, while CSUF improves to 9-4-1 overall and 2-0-1 in the MPSF. The Gauchos have not beaten the Titans since

'94, and likely will have to wait until next season for another shot at breaking the streak.

Santa Barbara was out-shot 6-4 in the first half and 8-2 in the second. Junior forward Jaime Ambriz led the Gaucho attack with two shot attempts.

UCSB played tough defense and created ample shot opportunities, but could not convert. "We played well against a very good team. ... I feel they are better than UCLA," Head Coach Tim Vom Steeg said.

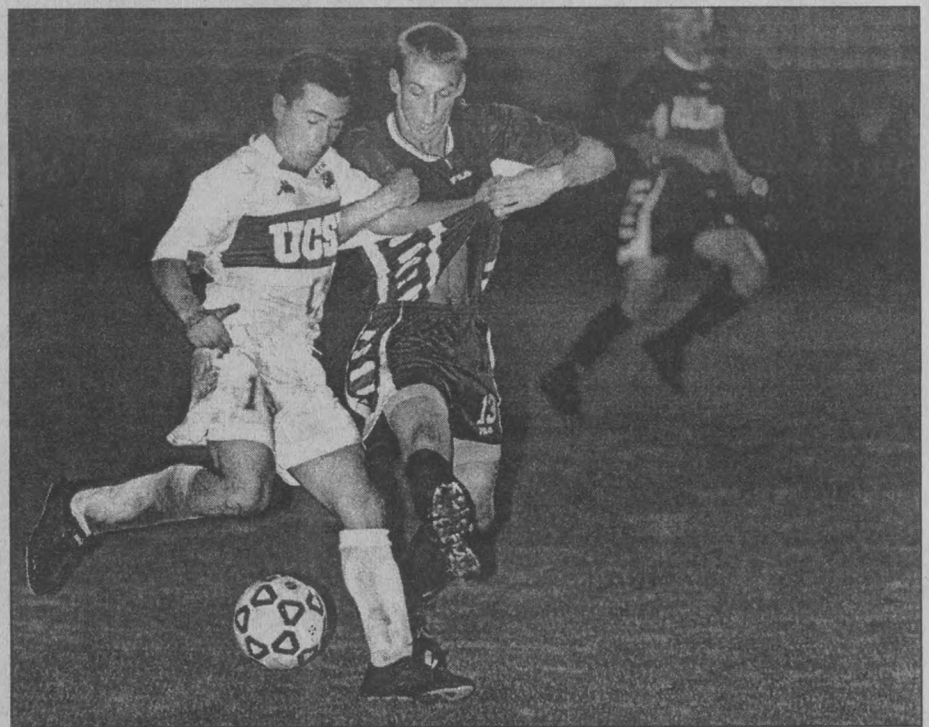
Freshman goalie Erik Stolhandske left the game at halftime with a 102-degree fever, and 5'7" back-up Jeremy Pruzin

stepped in to defend the first net of his career. Pruzin made two crucial saves in the second half to keep Santa Barbara in the contest, but was unable to deflect the winning ball that flew over his head in the 101st minute of play.

The pivotal loss dampened hopes of a league championship for UCSB, but playoffs are not out of question. "To go to the postseason you got to go 5-2 in league. We are now out of losses and it's not the position we want to be in, but the season is not over yet," Vom Steeg said.

Santa Barbara will take on UC Irvine on Friday at 6:00 p.m. in Harder Stadium.

Women's Soccer Drops Two in Idaho

The UCSB women's soccer team headed up to Idaho last week aiming to improve its record two notches, only to receive a two-game shaft.

In their first match against Big West rival University of Idaho on Friday, the Vandals took advantage of the Gauchos' defensive deficiency, outscoring UCSB 3-1.

The Vandals came on strong in the first half, scoring all three goals and shutting out the Gauchos' offensive attack. UCSB came back firing, as Emily Todd scored her first goal of the year just over six minutes into the second half, cutting the deficit to two.

UCSB continued to put pressure on UI for most of the second half by keeping the ball in the Vandals' half of the field, but Idaho prevented any further charges from materializing.

The Gauchos' next stop landed them in Boise, where they met the Boise State

Broncos. UCSB spurred the action in the first half when sophomore Beth Ramos shot the ball, sending it toward the left side of the goal where it was deflected past Boise's goalkeeper.

Boise rallied in the second half to even the score 1-1 when freshman Mauren Meyer stole a clearing attempt and drove a shot past Gaucho defense and into the goal.

The Bronco's Brittany Zoellner eventually broke the 1-1 tie when she drove into the Gaucho's 18-yard box and was taken down by UCSB's Meghann Phillips to set up the penalty kick. Zoellner sent the penalty kick to the left of Gaucho goalkeeper Mary Gleason to claim the Bronco 2-1 victory.

After two disappointing losses, UCSB came home with a record of 6-8-1 overall and 1-3-0 in the Big West.

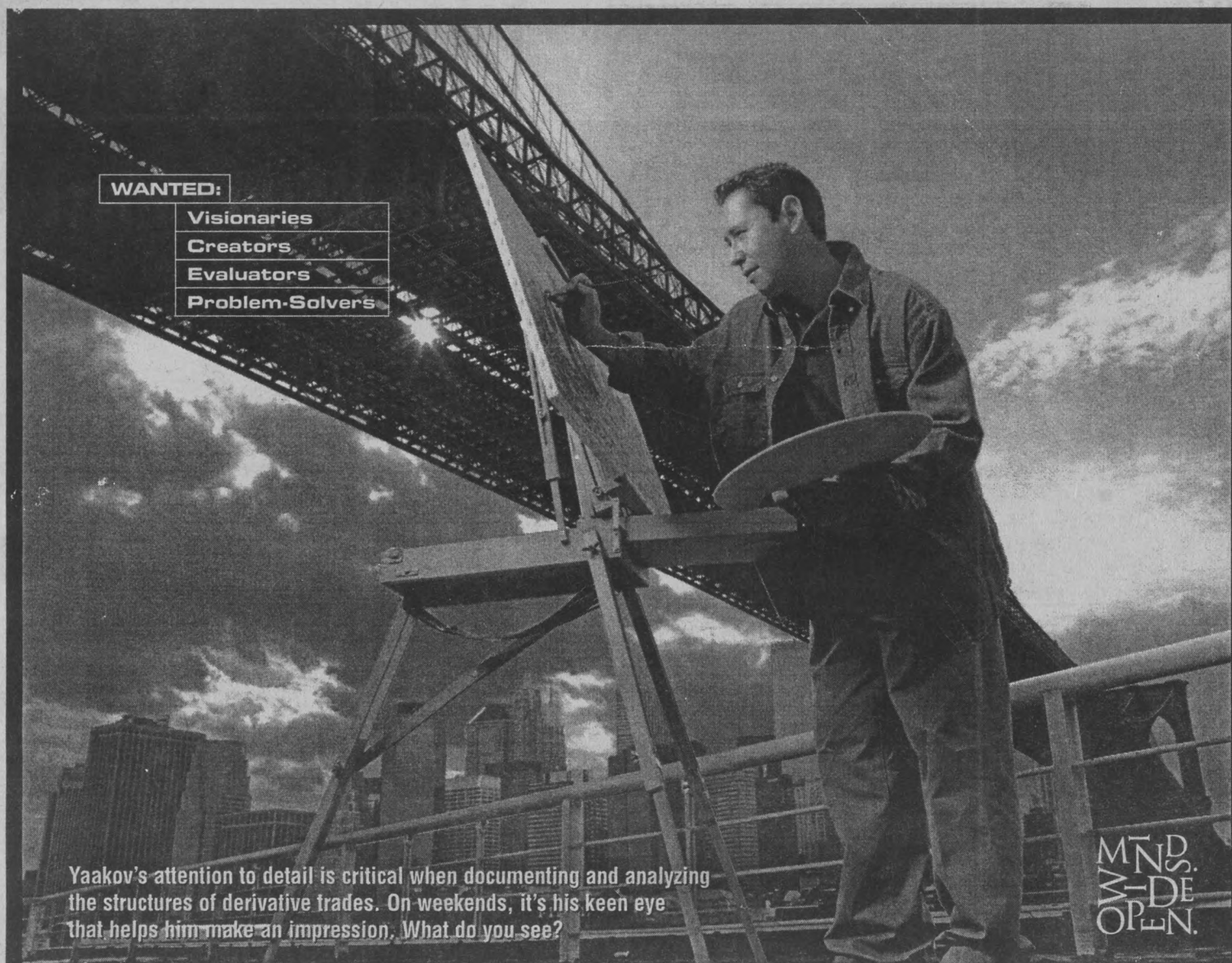
