




Young Gauchos Gear Up for '92 Playoff Run

Nothing less than perfection.
In short, that is what Head Coach Tad Bobak expects from his UCSB women's soccer team. That expectation might be stretched in 1992 for a Gaucho squad that lost six seniors from last year's 12-7-0 NCAA playoff team, but Bobak feels his new recruits have what it takes to compete at Santa Barbara's traditional place among the elite in

The new players are going to have to learn the demands of Division I right away," Bobak said. "They have to adapt to and cope with pressure they have never felt before."

The two most important returners to this year's squad will be the co-captains, senior lefender Lisa Ferragamo and junior forward Phronsie Franco. Franco returns as one of Santa Barbara's main offensive weapons. She scored 24 goals in her first two seasons and looks to improve on that total this season. Karen Eustaquio, a 5'2" senior, and sophomore midfielder Kristen Borland return to add speed to the Gaucho attack.

Another scoring threat on the front line will be Jeannie Crabb, a freshman from Portland, Ore. Portland delivers another freshman in goal, 5'8" Dana Visse, who has given up four goals in as many games this season. Not surprisingly, Bobak likes what he has seen from her already.

"Like most of the other players, she will have to learn quickly," he said. "She has great technique which will help her lack of experience."

Ferragamo will lead a veteran defense that may prove to be the Gaucho's greatest

Bushman joined the team at games and practices last week, walking without the use of crutches or even a brace.



yder Looks to Rebuild Dynasty

Their 1990 Big West championship and 23-9 mark now a distant memory, UCSB's water polo team opens the 1992 season with the task of rebuilding. Head Coach Pete Snyder, entering his 16th season, has been busy at work preparing the #6 ranked Gauchos for an improvement over last year's 11-20 record.

The rebuilding process begins with the players, and although the team has no standout recruits, it does feature several key returnees which Snyder hopes will help create team chemistry.

"The team is a very tenacious group, and we should be able to compete with most of the teams we face," Snyder said. "Our quickness is our biggest asset."

While team speed is a major strength, the team's de-

fense can always be improved.

"A large measure of a victory is at the defensive end,"
Snyder said. "We need to be able to shut down the opposing team consistently.

Although Santa Barbara has an unusual schedule in which they play 11 straight road games and then finish with five games at home — the Gauchos hope that finishing the season at UCSB could allow them to put together a winning streak as the playoffs near.

• Returnees:

It never hurts for a team to return its top three scorers. Included in this group is senior driver Tony Litwak, who finished last season with 37 goals and nine assists. Litwak and sophomore driver Doug Wierenga will serve as the team's co-captains. In addition, senior Scott Taylor and junior Matt Flanders will split the goal-keeping duties and help fortify the Gaucho defense.

The 1992 team does not feature any key recruits, but that does not mean that new players could not make an impact on the team.

Basically, we'll look at the freshman as they come in and evaluate them from that point," Snyder said. Strengths:

The team's key strength lies in their speed. A deep team and an emerging defense are also key factors. The Gauchos have already employed these in two victories over Chaminade University in last week's tournament in Hawaii.

Concerns:

Erratic shooting at times and the two-meter slot head the list of Snyder's concerns. The two-meter slot problem may be alleviated if senior Martin Asplund, a twotime JC All-American, is able to play. In addition, the defense must focus and strengthen itself as the season

Season So Far:

When the Gauchos traveled to Hawaii, they knew that they would have to face some tough competition. Along with #2-ranked Stanford, who defeated Santa Barbara in two games, they also faced Hurricane Iniki, which prohibited the team from traveling home together. Consequently, the incomplete team missed part of the 1992 Gaucho Round Robin Tournament, in which the games against #18 Loyola Marymount and #15 Claremont Mudd were demoted to scrimmages.

"The team will have quite a test this weekend in Irvine," Snyder said, referring to the Irvine Invitational. The Gauchos will face, among others, #4-ranked USC and #8-ranked UCLA. UCSB will face #9 UOP on Sept. 27, but will then start their long road trip. The team will return on Nov. 7 and will be home until postseason play



Lady Spikers Face **New Problem: No** Team Chemistry

It's that one word, the one that drives coaches crazy, that is being bantered about in reference to the UCSB women's volleyball team as the 1992 season gets

Potential.

The Gauchos appear to be in good shape, returning five starters from a team that finished a solid 22-10 last year while advancing to the second round of the NCAA playoffs. To this core of talent and experience, add a sprinkle of solid recruits and a heavy dose of a Hall-of-Fame coach, and you've got the recipe for a championship, right?

Not just yet.

"We're getting better, but we need to be more competi-tive," said Head Coach Kathy Gregory, who enters her 18th season at the Gaucho helm. "The team hasn't learned to play as a team. And physically, we have the potential to be much better."

It's the "physical" part that has Gregory concerned. Senior outside hitter Julie Pitois, who was an unstoppable force for the last five weeks of 1991, has been slowed

by a summer-long bout with mononucleosis.

"At this point, I'm still five or six steps behind everyone on the team," Pitois said. "My play has gone down considerably, and it's really frustrating for both Kathy and myself. I wanted to come in and play like I ended the season last year, and I can't."

At the same time, sophomore hitter Heather Collins, who was named to the All-Big West Freshman Team last season, missed the first week of practice due to an illness.


The biggest obstacle, however, is one that Gregory and the Gauchos haven't faced in quite some time: a notable lack of team chemistry. In years past, UCSB has been known for its superior communication and defensive play, two facets of the game that need some improvement on the current Gaucho squad. Ironically, it is an abundance of talented players that has partially led to the team's early struggles.

"People are nervous due to our depth," Gregory claims. "Everybody wants to play, so they're always looking over their shoulders at who's behind them. We need to learn to be more aggressive and competitive."

One player who has her spot locked up is Gaucho mainstay Kristie Ryan, entering her final year. The outside hitter will be called upon to help out offensively, but it is on defense where Ryan rises to the top, keeping countless rallies alive with her relentless play.

Returning to bolster the middle is senior Tina Van Loon, UCSB's career leader in blocks. Van Loon is looking to improve her offense for her final season.

"My goal is to be a threat offensively, both in hitting and in serving," said Van Loon, who led the team in service aces last year. "My serving has improved — I think it's a little better."

Lending help to both the middle and the outside is junior Ana Elisa Franca, who made a big splash for the Gauchos last season in her first year with the team. Franca, who hails from Brazil, ranks among the strongest hitters in the Big West.

Newcomers:

Running the offense will be setter Chrissy Boehle, who takes over for the departed Stephanie Cox. Gregory speaks highly of Boehle, a sophomore who worked hard in the off-season to prepare herself for the quarterback

"Chrissy is a very good setter," Gregory said. "She needs a little more experience, but her defense is getting a

Gregory focused on three top recruits during the offseason and landed each one. Making the biggest impression thus far is Kim Keys, who gives a much needed dimension to the Gaucho middle with her strong attacking skills. Also expected to contribute are outside hitter Haylee Red and blocker Tammy Stiner.

"Kim is a great athlete and she's very quick," Gregory said. "She's a good middle attacker and all-around player. And Haylee is a great hitter."

Once again, UCSB can be counted on to give its opponents a run for their money with its tough defensive play. Ryan and Collins lead a slew of players who are adept at digging almost everything. Also, the Gauchos are gifted with quite a few skilled players. Depth shouldn't be a problem this season. And many of the strengths are, as yet, untapped. It's the dreaded P-word again.

"We have a lot of potential," Van Loon said. "We've got some good recruits, and a lot of depth we haven't had

Thus far, UCSB has had trouble with its ball control. Part of this is a reflection on the lack of communication and chemistry. However, this weakness cannot be trivialized because passing problems can ruin the entire



Things Can Only Get Better as Arya Makes Changes

After a disappointing and turbulent 1991 campaign in which it finished 4-13-2, the UCSB men's soccer team returns in 1992 with a new coach and a new outlook. Former U.S. National Team member Mark Arya, who had coached the Foothill JC squad for the past three seasons, has taken over as the Gauchos' head coach, and while the results have so far been modest, the players insist that under Arya the program is on the rise.

"It's just a huge improvement from last year," team captain Kendall Fargo said of the 1992 season. "We realize that the team is young and we're going to make mistakes, but we keep improving every day. Things are only getting better."

Things will have to get a lot better for

Things will have to get a lot better for the Gauchos if they expect to challenge in the very competitive Mountain Pacific Sports Federation's Pacific Division, which features UCLA, UNLV and Cal State-Fullerton, but Fargo seems confiden

"It's going to take a while for everything to come together, but I think we're going to surprise a lot of teams," Fargo said. "I don't think there's a team in the conference that we can't play with."

Although Arya expects to do better than the seventh place that is predicted for UCSB in the preseason coaches' poll, he has his sights set on seasons to come. "With a year of nurturing, next year and the year after, we should be a team to be reckoned with," he said.

• Returnees:

Although the top scorer for UCSB in 1991 — Sean Redmond — won't be back this season, Fargo, junior midfielder Mike Schaupp, senior midfielder Jason West and senior sweeper Stefan Gudmundsson are all returning starters.

Newcomers:

Santa Clara University junior transfer Patrick Griffen leads the list of Arya's first recruiting class at UCSB. A midfielder, Griffen is already one of the Gauchos' top

• Season So Far:

The Gauchos stand at 3-1, having taken third place in their own UCSB Collegiate Classic tournament last weekend. The three wins aren't bad; it's the one loss that's giving everybody trouble. The Gauchos dropped a tournament match to Cal State-Northridge, a team that hasn't beaten UCSB in 12 years.

• Upcoming Events:

Big West play will begin Monday at New Mexico State for the Gauchos. Gregory believes that most of the team's problems can and will be corrected with time, and, she adds, the rest of the conference may not be as strong this season.

"The Big West is a little

· Outlook:

The teams UCSB will be looking to beat include usual powers Long Beach State and Hawaii, along with UCSB's old nemesis, the University of the Pacific. The road to the conference title is long and difficult, but UCSB has something in its favor the other teams may not have: potential. If the Gauchos can fully realize their talents, it could be a fruitful season in Santa Barbara.

• Concerns:

The team's greatest weakness is in its lack of experience. Six freshmen and three sophomores take up nine of the 14 spots on Bobak's roster, but Ferragamo doesn't believe it will be that much of a factor.

"The players that were recruited have a lot of good qualities," she said. "I think they know what it takes to play at this level.

• Season So Far:

UCSB has a 3-1 record in 1992, but the one loss was a disappointing 3-0 defeat at San Diego State on Sept. 11. It was the first loss to the Aztecs in the program's history.


