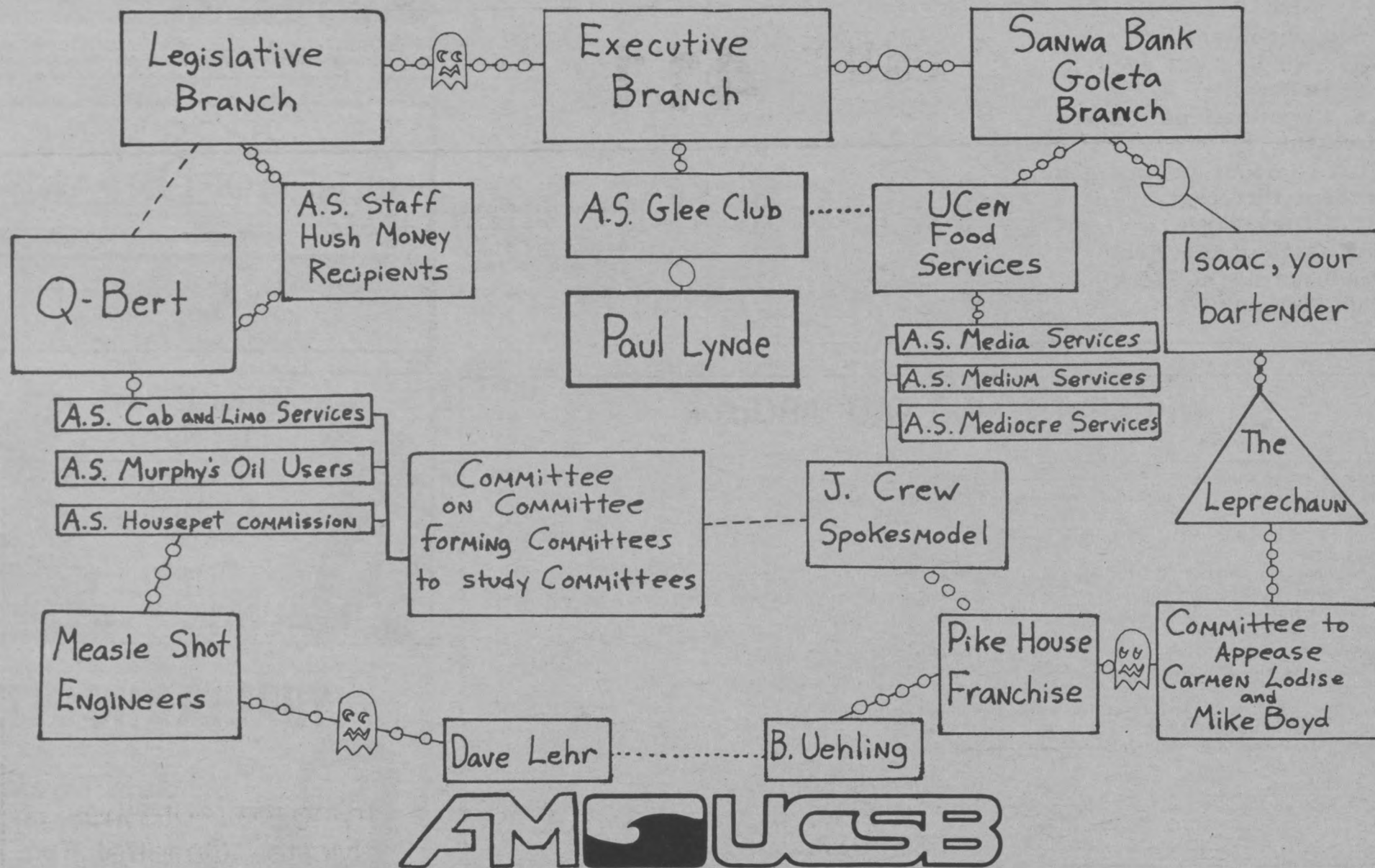

First Aid at a Glance

POISON

The following signs could indicate that the victim has ingested toxic substances:

UCSB Guide to an Emergency

What can you do to be prepared for a disaster?

There are a series of documents which outline the campus Emergency Operations Plan, as well as action/fire emergency plans. In case of a real emergency, fill out form 10X172, take it to the Cheadle Office of Emergency Paperwork, and ask for a catalog of emergency procedures. Make sure you get the call number for the most recent version of the plan. Fill out the quick response request sheet and hand it to the person behind counter number seven. You should receive the emergency plan in six to eight weeks.

Environmental Health and Safety is always standing by to conduct a safety survey of your office or department. On request, they will come by and test the safety of your office using flame throwers, toxic chemicals, and building shaking equipment. If your office survives these tests, one of the up and coming Vice Chancellors will probably move in.

A disaster preparedness training session may seem irrelevant at first, but you haven't lived until you've had a bunch of people dressed in white smocks throwing smoke bombs around the office, yelling earthquake, and putting "dead" and "arm missing" tags on all your workers.

How can you help in the event of a disaster?

Activate the department Emergency Action/Fire Plan, order pizza.

Do not make non-emergency calls. Other people need to order pizza too.

REMEMBER: Don't Panic, if you're still

alive by now you could last for days. (Don't forget about radiation poisoning though.)

- Review the campus policy and A.S. position on earthquakes. The campus is opposed, while A.S. has endorsed small quakes.

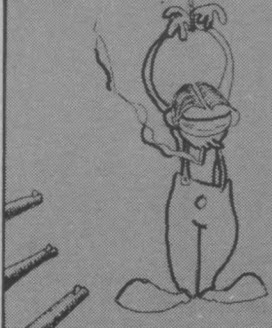
