## Cafe au Lait Is Fine French

Hey — who put the Paris in Goleta?

Rising from the puckish, mauvish pastiche of the La Cumbre mall in scenic Goleta is Cafe au Lait, as tidy and shiny a bit of Europe as you're likely to find this side of the Aleutian Islands.

And just where is Jacques Yves-Cousteau, anyway?

As its name implies, Cafe au Lait is about coffee frothy, gooey, steaming, rich coffee goodness served in bowl-size mugs, the perfect accompaniment for earnest discussions about The Future and snobby people who work in law offices and guys who brought food to high school in a G.I. Joe lunch box. Yeah, your basic Paris mindset, except no one (what a relief!) was speaking French.


That's what happened to me this week at Cafe au Lait, and let me just tell you something: the crepes did not get in the way.

Oh sure, there were the requisite high number of suspiciously bearded middle-aged men lounging around the Cafe's outdoor patio and glass-walled interior, but that was not a distraction. And the crepes, no, they were not in the way.

No, there was no distracting me and my companion from diving tongue-first into a steaming cauldron of "sinus-clearing" black bean soup — perhaps the finest black bean orgasm this side of a three-bean salad. Imagine grandpa's baked beans, only better, a touch more tangy and robust, a bit fuller in form. That's Cafe au Lait's black bean delight.

I should watch what I say about the crepes. My stigma with the brown, streamlined pigs-in-a-blanket type goodies stretches back to an overly enthusiastic stepfather looking for a gimmick at Sears to keep my mom impressed. You get the idea, but sadly it didn't work; I do gotta be honest.

But I mean, here we were, ladling up big mouthfuls of the black bean soup, and I'm staring through the quasi-marble pillars at a large, pastel painting of what appears to be many men imagining themselves to be Prince or Robert De-Niro hoisting platters of spaghetti at a small cafe, and I'm thinking, "Why not crepes? Why the heck not the

crepes?"

I checked the crepes listing once more on the menu (my sinuses really clearing up now) and focused in on the crepes: salmon and spinach; chicken with artichoke; and shrimp with black beans and cheese in provencale sauce. I sighed and took in another delicious mouth-heaping of black beans, for the first time in recent memory considering the relative merits of shrimp. The quandary, a river of saliva putting me in an eerie dog-like position.

There was too much, far too much, to choose from at least more than I expected from an establishment that nominally billed itself as a coffee house. A quick check of side one of the menu fills you in on the usual caffeine business, but person, how was I to expect salads, fresh pastas, individual pizzas, grilled sandwiches and those deadly, rapturously forbidden triple-folded

And here's the kicker: Nothing — and I mean nothing, save the occasional daily special or two (which, of course, includes fish) goes for more than seven dollars. Dude!

Cafe au Lait may be the ultimate snack place check that, the penultimate snack boutique. It's the perfect glass hollow for a pre-evening on the town coffee pick-me-up and exquisite, tasteful and classy cuisine. It's the kind of place you'll go to in order to steel yourself for an afternoon of shopping right there at the

When I say the food is classy, it's not due to the inherent class-consciousness that comes with coffee obsession nor with Impressionist painters. It has to do with excellent, even exotic food, at the right price.

Cafe au Lait is definitely health conscious, and that improves the finesse and


verve of their menu. Try finding a three-lettuce salad with enoki mushrooms somewhere in Isla Vista. Pinpoint where they serve linguine in peanut sauce with roasted eggplant. And pizza — I dare you to find me a place closer than the La Cumbre mall that serves you three kinds of great, inventive pizzas: the eggplant, olive and goat cheese combo; the button mushroom and artichoke heart combustion; and the smoked chicken with rosemary pesto. Like I thought.



### City Broiler Is Definitely a Santa Barbara Classic

The City Broiler just might win your heart!

We walked into the City Broiler around 6:30, and figuring it was a bit early for dinner, Kim and I had a drink and talked a bit.

About work. Men and women, her fixation with power. San Diego, planned communities, that stretch of Highway 101 going north where there's absolutely nothing - for a long, long time and how weird that is the first time you drive it.

Politics, parents, pre-pubescent junior high dances when AC/DC was the only music to listen to, and then suddenly your little brother's going to college. Strange. About getting older, and life after

And we imagined that City Broiler is the type of place we'll probably hang out at after we graduate. Sitting there for four or five hours, eating and drinking and talking (above the sounds of a cool jazz trio that I'm told plays regularly), you really get to know someone. Just the reason for this sort of date and this kind of restaurant.

As I said, we got there too early for dinner, or at least it seemed too early to us. It was one of those temperate Santa Barbara days, sort of chilly-sunny, so we went inside rather than sitting on the patio, which looked pretty inviting through the restaurant's full length

We watched the sun as it started to kind of creep away, the way afternoons lazily drift into dusk and line, become night. No, it's Santa Barbara, so let's call it evening. The City Broiler is an evening sort of place.

Our server was about as relaxed as we were, letting us dine at our own pace. By the time the sun had completely set, and the strings of lights had turned the patio into something like a giant effervescent atrium, we were munching on garlic bread (server's suggestion!) and salads.

The appetizers looked great — stuff like breaded and fried calamari frittata and escargot — but we decided to hold back on the first course and go all out on the main entrees.

One thing to keep in mind about City Broiler is in the name: broiler. That's right, the place has a broiler in the heart of the restaurant, and you can even sit at it and watch the cooks do their thing. We were at a table, but their show was still sort of audible, even from afar.

Unlike my date, who ordered the fettucine primavera (white cream sauce, garlic and fresh vegetables; chicken or prawns optional), I wanted to take advantage of the trademark broiler. After listening to the specials of the day, I ordered: broiled halibut in a champagne tarragon cream

Just say it, champagne tarragon cream sauce; it even sounds good, doesn't it? That's why it's a "special," or so we guessed.

Entrees are served with a side of rice or fresh vegetable of the day, and we added even more City

own touch - for effect. Now mind you, it may seem that we made our choices easily, but that is far from the truth.

There was linguine, and angel's hair pasta a la lori (basil, fresh roma tomatoes, garlic and olive oil), and lasagna, and cannelloni, and steaks and herbal chicken, and a whole bunch of other seafoods to choose from. Sounds a bit overwhelming. Overwhelmingly good, that

Just when it seemed the feasting had to come to an end, up walks this dessert tray, crammed with - count 'em - four cheesecakes, three different apple pie/ torte things, glazed strawberries, and chocolate, chocolate, chocolate! Wow!

They really threw down on the desserts. The cheesecake and apple pie things we split were ... amazing, decadent, heavenly. I can't say it enough, we're talking serious indulgence, the perfect end to a grand dining experience.

So we hung out after it was over, sipping coffee, listening to jazz and talking. About her, and me. Past dates (didn't match up), other places, the amazing plants serpentining their way around the interior of the restaurant, "and wouldn't that rubber tree look great in my place?"

And wouldn't we like to come back to City Broiler again? And again, and again, and again.


I drove Ms. Strongbody
