Jerome has therefore insisted upon the immediate decision of the question, and offers to prove the illegality of the marriage, and the dissolution of it by the church. The Pattersons, on the other hand, deny the authority of the decree of 1805, which, they contend, intimated no doubt of the legality of the marriage, on which only a civil court could decide, but merely forbade it to be recorded in the public registers of France. They refer, also, to their uninterrupted and unquestioned position as legitimate heirs and on the good faith of Elizabeth Patterson in contracting her marriage with Jerome Bonaparte.
