### **Bocci Team Tests Positive for** Viagra, Is Penalized by NCAA

Gauchos Must Forfeit League Win Over Friendship Manor

In a long and hard season that has been marked by ins, outs, ups and downs, the UCSB bocci team was forced to swallow a bitter verdict from the NCAA after several Gaucho players tested positive for the wonder drug Viagra.

Santa Barbara (7-2, 0-2 "Big" West) must forfeit its conference win over the Blue Hairs of Friendship Manor, and the offending Gauchos must sit out the next six conference games as a result of the positive tests. A sweep of the two games is mandatory if the Gauchos hope to have any real chance of getting to the NCAA playoffs. Despite this hard assignment, the Gauchos remain positive in their outlook.

"We can slide right in (to the playoffs)," junior Rosie Kweif said. "We can mount offensives that are unrelenting, and just pound and pound our opponents. It can be very painful for them, and sometimes we take them out for drinks afterwards because we feel guilty."

Even before the Viagra verdict, it has been a long time since UCSB has gone all the way in the NCAAs. The Gauchos have wilted under pressure for the last five seasons, failing to rise to the occasion when the spotlight was on them. However, Santa Barbara consoles itself by realizing that these things happen to all teams, and anyone who competes on a regular basis is going to occasionally experience failure.

"We've been doing it all year long in practice," McCrack said. "We just need to perform when the pressure's on. If we just relax, take a few deep breaths and have confidence in ourselves, we'll be fine."

UCSB is on the road this weekend, but the Gauchos will return to Santa Barbara next Monday for a rematch with Friendhip Manor.
