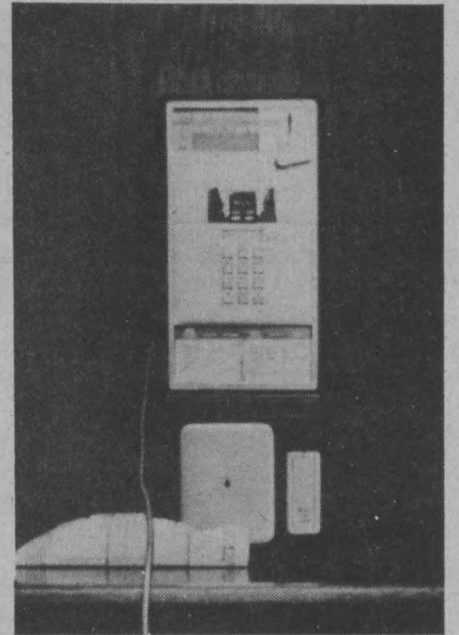

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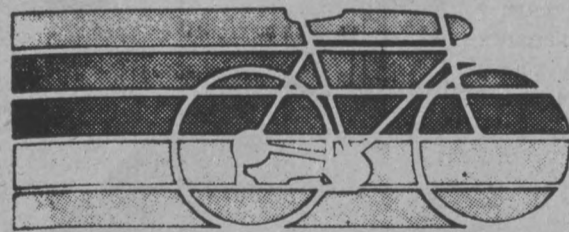
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# Dating Services: Space Age Matchmakers

Life used to be so simple: boy meets girl, boy likes girl, boy gets girl and they all live happily ever after. Today, that is not always the case. People often have trouble meeting other people, or finding people that they like, and even "getting" the person that they like. It is times like these when a dating service may come in handy.

Businesses that specialize in professional matchmaking are nothing new. In the past they were called "matrimonial bureaus" or "introduction services." It wasn't until the 1960s that computer dating became popular, particularly with college students who wanted more casual dating relationships as opposed to heavy commitments.

There are various types of dating services available for various needs and prices. There are services that advertise in the back of magazines offering a "pen-pal" type relationship with someone of the opposite sex possibly hundreds of miles away.

The more popular version is the computer type. To use this service, the applicant fills out a form or "personality profile" that asks questions about biographical information and personal preferences. The applicant then pays a fee, which varies from \$25-\$100, and in return the company sends a printout of names of people whom the computer found to be compatible with them. Compatibility is usually determined by the mutual of interests of the applicants. Some services guarantee a certain amount of names per week or month.

The success of the service all depends on the extent of the questionnaire filled-out by the applicants. Forms that have questions



allowing for intimate self-disclosure do a better job at matching people up, but dating services with more extensive questionnaires tend to cost more.

Another factor that influences the effectiveness of a dating service is the fact that some human traits are beyond technical evaluation. The computer may match up two people based on a few strong interests, but such subtle characteristics as manners may be bypassed. Conflict may develop if a couple is paired up and one finds the other socially ill-mannered.

A solution to this problem of overlooked human traits has partially been solved with the advent of video-matching services. One such service is Video Action Dating, located

on State Street in Santa Barbara. Since the business' opening one and one half years ago, the owner and the clients have had much success. The service caters to people of all ages, professions, and religions and boasts a record of being responsible for three marriages.

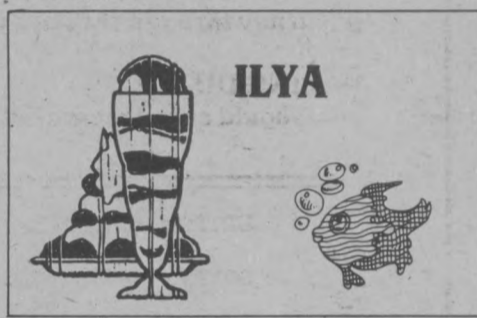
The video service functions much like the computer type of service. The single male or female client comes into the office and fills out a profile sheet describing their interests. Then a polaroid photo is taken, and the client is casually interviewed while being video taped. After the taping, he or she looks through a book containing photos and profile sheets of other clients of the opposite sex. When he or she finds someone

who interests them, they ask to see that person on video. If they wish to meet the person they saw on tape, they are given the phone number.

The service does not give out a woman's phone number without her consent, so if Oscar wants to meet Gertie, Video Action Dating will call Gertie and give her the opportunity to come in to the office and view Oscar's tape and consent or decline to allow the service to give him her phone number.

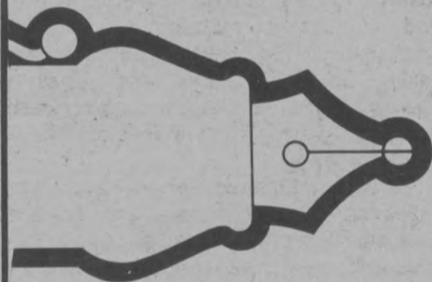
Video dating services do cost more than the usual computer service, ranging between \$100 and \$200. However, clients of the video dating service say that it is the best method because you get a good idea of what the other person is really like by seeing and hearing him or her.

All in all, using a dating service does contain a degree of uncertainty. Services claim that you have an unlimited choice of matches, but your choice is limited to the people included in their clientele. Nevertheless, if you are fed-up with singles bars, co-workers, or community groups, computer/video dating services are a definite alternative.

## Roots of Valentine Customs Buried in Ancient History

Everyone knows that St. Valentine's day is the time of year when friends and lovers express affection for one another. It's also a time when mounds and pounds of chocolate are consumed, when florists flourish and when the greeting card businesses put forth their most creative work. Lovers exchange gifts and romantic rhyme to their hearts content.

But let's stop a minute. Just who is responsible for inspiring such romance and merriment? From where and from whom does

Valentine's day come?

Only one thing is for certain: there are conflicting ideas about the origin of this festive holiday. In fact, no one is quite sure who this St. Valentine was, or more appropriately, who these Valentines were. The early lists of church martyrs reveal at least three Valentines, while other sources boost this number to eight, each of whom had his feast day on February 14.

Of the three most important Valentines, one is known only through the martyrdom which he shared with a group of believers.

The other two, a priest of Rome and a Bishop of Interamna, are said to have been beaten and beheaded by the Emperor Claudius II on February 14 in 269 A.D., and then buried along the Flaminian Way. The remains of one Valentine (which one is uncertain) are said to be buried in the church of St. Praxedes in Rome.

Tradition and folk tales have preserved several accounts of these Saints; yet some historians believe that the stories are of no historic value. Among these legends is the tale that during a period of imprisonment, Valentine cured the jailer's daughter of blindness. Another story, in an attempt to associate him more closely with Saint Valentine, tells of him falling in love with the jailer's daughter and sending her a letter signed, "From your Valentine."

Finally in 469 A.D., over 200 years after Valentine's death, Pope Gelisus set aside February 14 as the date honoring the Saint. As time passed, this new Christian holiday became a time for exchanging love messages and love tokens, and St. Valentine emerged as the patron saint of lovers.

The custom of sending valentines, however, probably had only an accidental connection with St. Valentine. One theory explains the sending of love notes with the medieval European belief that birds



began to mate at the start of the second fortnight of the second month. "For this was on Saint Valentine's day," wrote Chaucer in the *Parliament of Fowles*, "where every foul cometh there to choose his mate."

Chaucer's words describe the old custom in England and other parts of the continent of drawing names on St. Valentine's Eve. When a youth drew a girl's name, he wore it one his sleeve, attending and protecting her during the following year. She became his "Valentine," and they exchanged love tokens.

This noble custom continued in the 14th century, with men giving presents to women and often signing the gifts "with Valentine's love." By the 16th century Valentine's Day came to be marked by social gatherings; the eve of St. Valentine's day was often chosen as a time to hold elaborate balls.

Finally, with an outbreak of creativity, the inventive began making and sending original valentines during the 17th century. It was not until about 1800 that commercial valentines appeared. Initially they were rather simple, but by the 1830s and 1840s experts had

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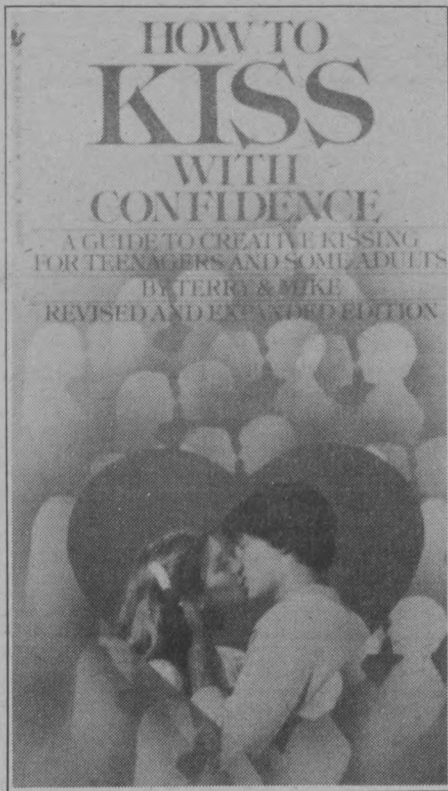
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## Creative Kissing Guide: Tips for Smooching

The fun of kissing can be approached from about a hundred different angles, but Valenti preferred the conventional approach and began at the mouth. Described as "a guide to creative

kissing for teenagers and some adults," the book outlines all the steps from the "First Kiss Experience," "Flirting" and "Developing Courage" to "Romantic Settings," "Sensitive Areas to Kiss," and "Kissing Around the World."

The first chapter, "First Kiss Experience" quotes different teenagers describing their first kiss. The quotes are atypically humorous examples of the first time.

Once you get past the introduction stage, the next step is to develop the courage to kiss. Valenti recommends repeating positive phrases such as, "I am an excellent kisser! The opposite sex is attracted to me!...I look neat, clean, and kissable at all times!" Imagine yourself sitting in front of a mirror repeating similar phrases. "As you say these phrases, think about them and believe them — and you surely will become a lovable, kissable person."

mastered the art of creating delicate artistic messages, such as "I fondly, truly love thee," or "Love protects."

By the middle of the 1880s the sending of valentines had become common practice in this country, and other derivations of the tradition emerged. Toward the end of the 19th century the "vinegar" or "comic" Valentine appeared as a satirical substitute. Conceived by New York printer John McLaughlin, who printed the cards on cheap paper in crude colors, their messages ridiculed certain types of people such as old maids or teachers. This custom, however, made many people unhappy, (especially old maids and teachers) and the fad began to wither. Sentimental greetings reappeared in the beginning of this century.

Of course the heavy sentimentality of earlier days has given away to a more modern, commercial approach. Today store-bought valentine cards usually accompany a more elaborate gift, such as candy, flowers or a Mercedes. No longer is a valentine limited only to lovers; greetings are made to be sent to nearly everyone — friend, relative and milkman.

## Traditional Valentine's Day Treat

Chocolate — that sensuous sweet which charms even the most calorie conscious — has long been a standard gift for lovers and friends on Valentine's day. Exactly why, no one seems to know, but confectioners across the county agree that the chocolate business is the place to be during this love-filled holiday.

"Good chocolate is a quality gift which will bring a smile to anyone's face," said Shirley Stickney, manager of See's candyshop in La Cumbre Plaza. "We are like a bartender, I guess; we help everyone leave our store a little bit happier, which makes us happier too."

In addition to making sugar crazed lovers happy, however, chocolate makers have a more profitable reason to smile. Valentine's day is their third largest season, following Easter and Christmas, with candy sales at least tripling.

Sweet chocolate (designed for eating, rather than cooking) was developed by the English firm Fry and Sons in 1847, when they found that a delicious new confection resulted from the addition of sugar and cocoa butter (vegetable fat) to powder made from roasted ground cocoa beans. In Switzerland thirty-two years later, Daniel Peters introduced

milk chocolate to the world when he added concentrated milk to the sweet chocolate.

Chocolate and Valentine's day go together like "Santa and Christmas," according to Karen Johnson, owner of The Chocolate Gallery in downtown Santa Barbara. According to Johnson it is not just the sugar and caffeine which give people such an energy boost; there is something a little magical which affects everyone when they eat chocolate.

According to legends passed through generations of chocolate makers, the sweet works as an aphrodisiac to tantalize and entrance the receiver. In other words, Johnson said, giving chocolate to your lover on Valentine's day will ensure a romantic and heart-warming holiday.

Scientifically, chocolate has been proven to be an excellent source of energy due to its rich content of carbohydrates and amounts of the stimulating alkaloids theobromine and caffeine. Unfortunately, however, other than these chemicals which help eliminate brain depression, chocolate has never been proven to contain any romance-enhancing substances.

Over the past three years the mysterious attraction of chocolate has captured so many people, and seems to be growing continuously. The sugary treat resulting from simple cocoa beans, vegetable fat, and sugar has become a cultural addiction with Americans arguing over who can eat the most Kona mochas in one sitting. With the current state of the economy

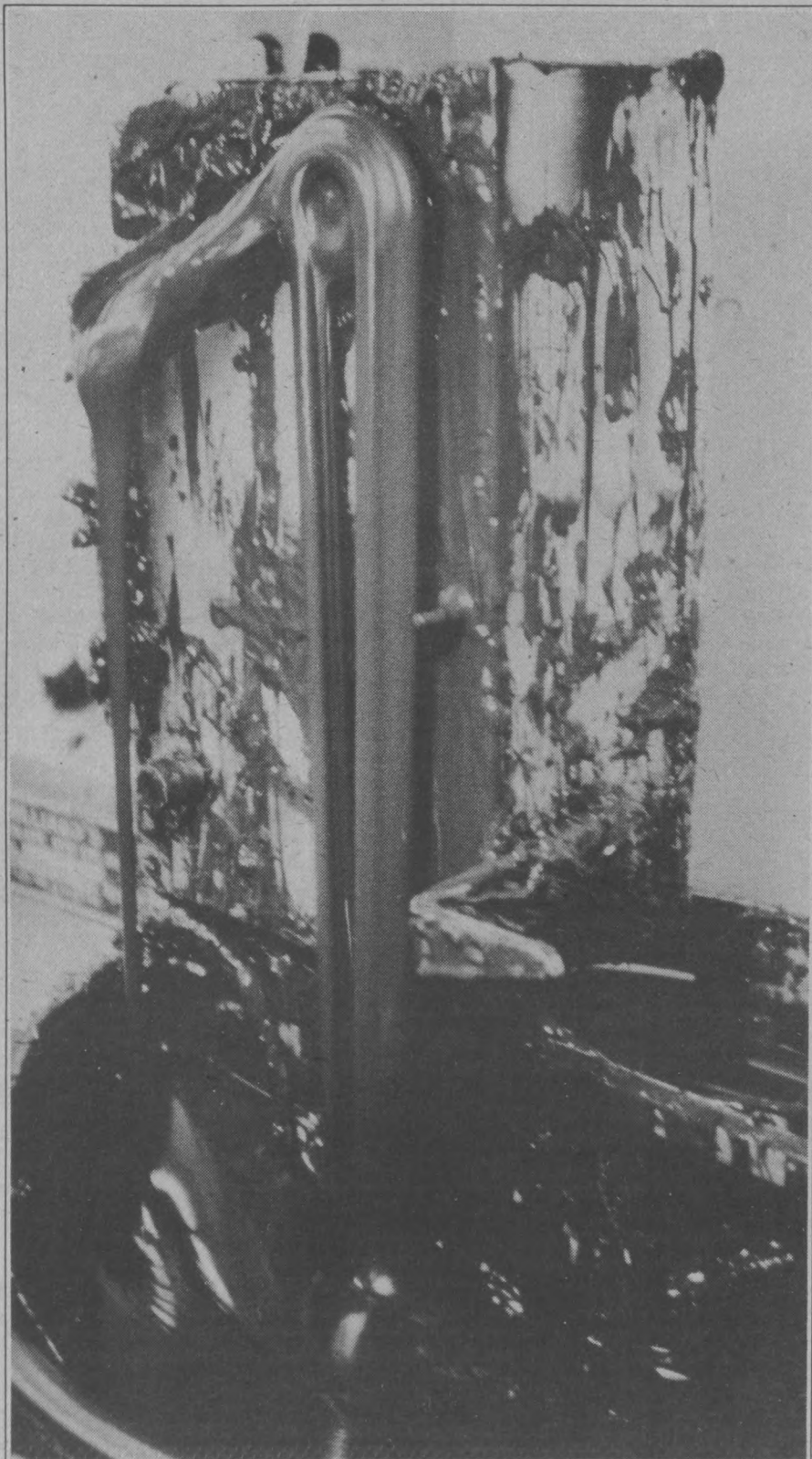

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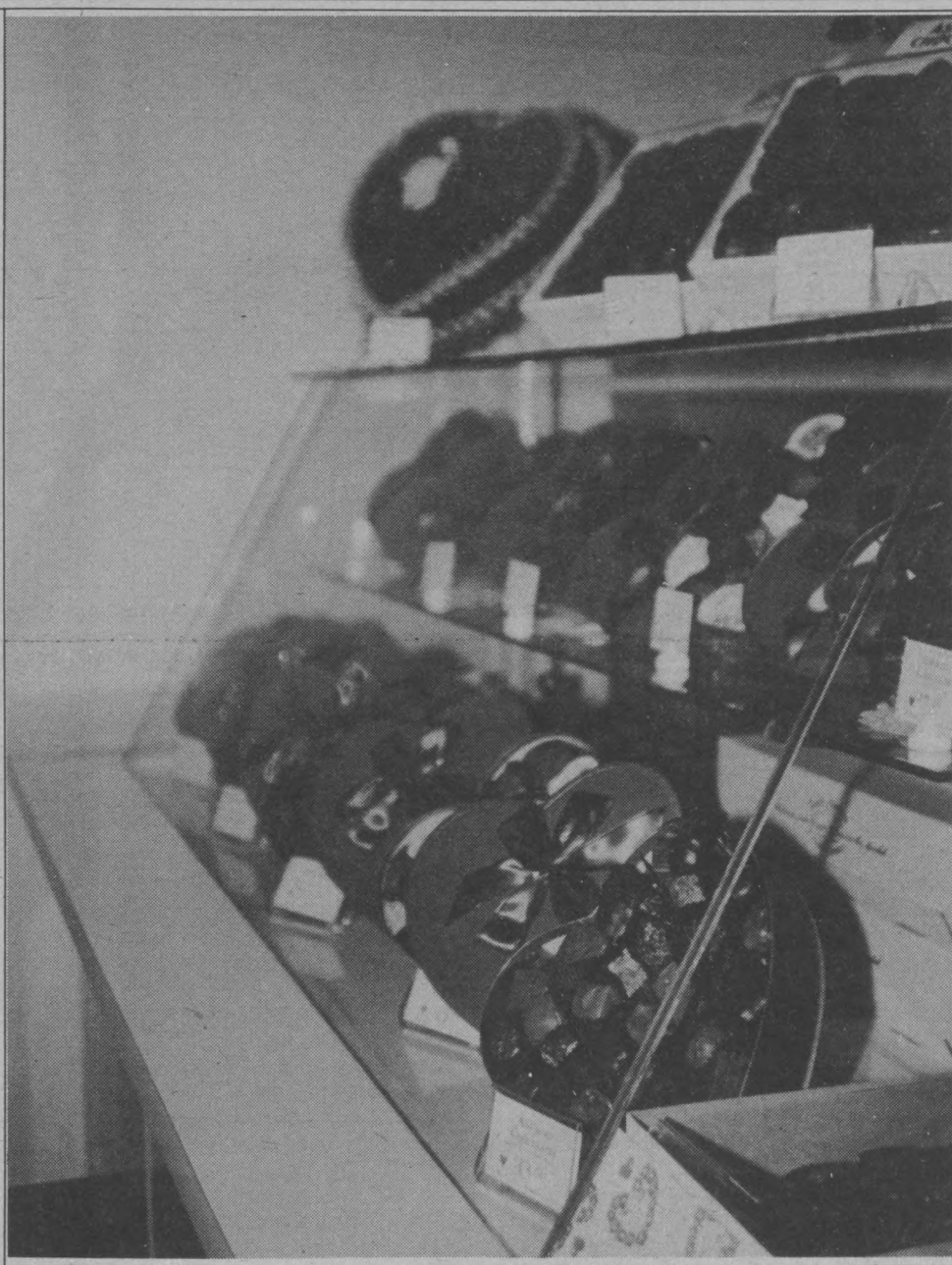

While the proprietors are not big on chocolate, they boast the largest variety of that burgeoning phenomenon

— the Jelly Belly — in Santa Barbara. The Jelly Belly is a trade name for what is rumored to be Ronald Reagan's favorite candy, the indispensable jelly bean. The Belly is the world's original gourmet style confection, characterized by its smaller size, shape, brilliant colors, and unusually delicious flavors.

Made with only natural ingredients, some of the less run-of-the-mill flavors we sampled included Baked Cinnamon Apple, Chocolate Pudding, Cotton Candy, Guava, Jalapeno, Mai Tai, Passion Fruit, Pina Colada, and Strawberry Daiquiri. Is all this just a passing fad? Probably. The real pleasure rests in their imported gummy bears — chewy and moderately sweet, these little critters will brighten up anyone's V-Day!

**Overall Rating:** 3 stars.

**The Chocolate Gallery — State Street, S.B.**

The Gallery is one of the most popular sweet spots in Santa Barbara, and for good reason. The entire shop is permeated with the rich aroma of chocolate. Interior design is utilitarian, to say the least. It appears that little thought was given as to how things are displayed — instead the overwhelming concern is simply getting as much chocolate as possible out on the shelves for the customers' perusal.

Chocolate does more than just taste good at the Gallery, it almost takes on life, molded into forms as diverse as motorcycles and bowling balls, alligators and puppy dogs, airplanes and human skulls. The most popular taste treats in the shop are listed below:

**Overall Rating:** 3.9 stars

**Nibbler's — Calle Real, Goleta**

Nibbler's is of the modern variety of candy shops, clean and color coordinated, and well-stocked with much more than candy. Items on the shelves included a large variety of coffees and teas, kettles, mugs, music boxes, V-Day cards and other assorted knick-knacks. Shaw's brand chocolate is featured, along with an unusually wide variety of jelly beans in flavors similar to those produced by the Jelly Belly folks. Nibbler's is kind of the Sav-on of the Santa Barbara candy world — the place is a little too bright and airy, a little too carefully decorated. The silly little name reflects the milieu of the shop.

**El Paseo Sweet and Smoking Shoppe, Anacapa St., S.B.**

Proclaimed by its shopkeeper to be "the only candy store in Santa Barbara," this old-style life savers and meerscham shop typifies old middle west candy counters: there is a carefully arranged throng of jars with the "finest available" candies from around the world, plus tobaccos — that's it. The personable nature of the proprietress far exceeded the minor limitations of the slow-moving supplies. Of what we sampled, well...

Once you get past the forboding sanitization-white of the shops — their trademark — you will discover that their candies are everything that chocolate should be: rich to the point of over-satiation, full of all the finer embellishments in nature, and not too expensive. 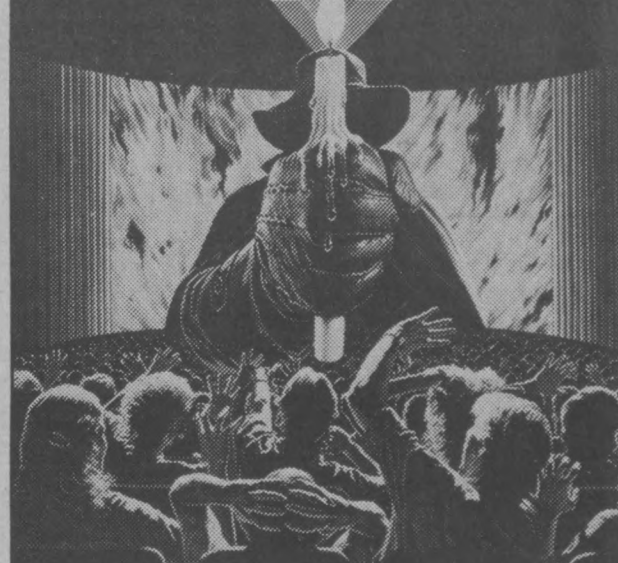

Of course, this isn't always the way that things work out. A lot depends on how well the couple knows one another, where they decide to go, and the expectations of both parties. But more college students, on this campus at least, are expressing the feeling that the person who does the asking on a first date should take the responsibility of paying as well.

The results of an informal Nexus survey showed that fewer people feel that guys should bear the financial burden alone anymore. "If a woman doesn't at least offer to pay for her share and is passive about it,"

commented one undergraduate woman, "it's almost like she's accepting her traditional sex role."

Traditionally, it has always been the man who asks the woman out and naturally paid for the entire evening. Now, however, more women feel that it is a perfectly acceptable practice to break with tradition and be the first to initiate the relationship by asking a man out. They also feel that if they make this first move, it is up to them to pay for the date.

Many of the men surveyed agreed that if the woman asks them out on a first date, she should be the one to pay for it. Yet some of them expressed their discomfort at this reversal of roles. Many said that even if the woman asked them out, they would at least make the offer to pick up the tab; others said they would insist on paying.

This relatively new trend of rejecting the accepted cultural norms and having women take the responsibility for initiating relationships has arisen for a number of reasons. For years the traditional custom of the male paying for dates was convenient for the woman on the one hand, but also had underlying, insidious implications.

In years past and even today women have expressed the feeling that if a guy shells out a lot of money on their date, they feel that there is some unspoken "obligation" on the part of the woman. This obligation, as we all are aware, refers to s-e-x.

Granted, you don't assume that if a guy treats you to a Burnardoz triple scoop you actually owe him anything to remember you by, but some women have said that if you go out to dinner and to a movie or a concert and he spends forty or fifty dollars on you...well, let's just say that many women would rather go dutch in a situation like this.

Now some of you guys are probably thinking, "Who are you kidding? I've never had that happen to me! She just lets me go right ahead and pay without even offering to contribute financially!"

Well, there were those women who said that even if they didn't like the guy who asked them out, they figured, "Well, hey--

it's a free meal and movie, so why not?" Not very ethical. Most said that they would not feel uncomfortable with the guy paying if he asked them out to a movie, but given the average college students' budget, when the expense approached astronomical proportions most thought that it made much more sense to go dutch.

"That way," said a woman expressing another point of view, "if you didn't like him you don't have to feel guilty about him spending all that money on you when you have absolutely no intention of seeing him again."

Around UCSB, Casual Capital of California, there aren't that many formal, traditional "dates" to speak of anyway. Men and women both said that if you're interested in someone, it's pretty easy to ask that person to do something casual and informal that doesn't involve a three-piece suit and half of your last paycheck: a Burnardoz or Borsodi's study break or

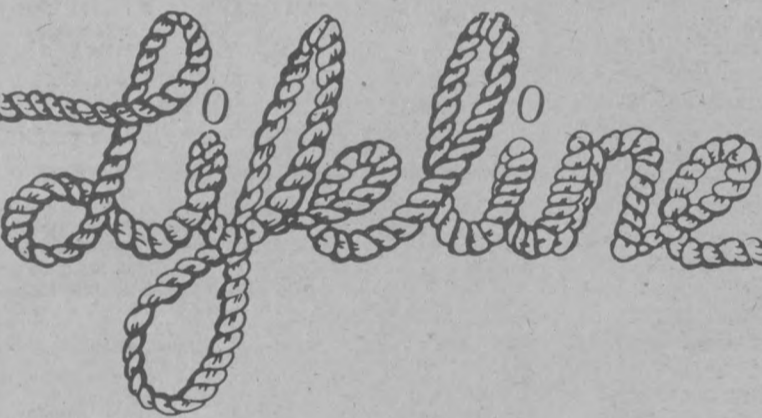
maybe "Return of the Killer Tomatoes" at Campbell Hall. Then, paying for the "date" isn't that big of a deal and no one has to feel obligated or taken advantage of or that their ego has experienced major deflation.

Well, how do the men feel about all this? For the most part they are pretty comfortable with a woman paying for her share of the date if she offers, or for the whole thing if she asks him out.

Almost all of the men questioned said that they would expect a woman who asked them out on a first date to pay, particularly if they went out to a restaurant or to an event requiring tickets. Still, they said that their wallets would be ready in the event that they should get stuck with the whole bill. Many also said that they would offer to pay as a polite gesture, but hopefully she would take care of it if she did the asking.

Then, there were those poor souls who said that regardless of who asked who out,
