We will never know, for the Raiders, like the 25 other NFL teams, chose skin color over talent, skill and

In this political year, for instance, we stand ready, as in recent times, to quarter in the White House not the best potential president, but the best potential white candidate.

In this, I do not disguise an argument for the presidential qualifications of Jesse Jackson. Rather I speak against an American system that has denied a million Jacksons that opportunity to acquire prerequisite experience. This same system, when faced with black candidates who, despite the obstacles, have miraculously met all prerequisites — like McPherson or Tom Bradley when he ran for governor of California — rejects them despite their qualifications.

What results is a system based not on meritocracy but on apartheid. This more than any other disease accounts for America's rapid fall from grace and world power.

Softball So Close, Drops 2 to Fresno, 1-0, 1-0

Pitchers Serrano and Reed Have Stellar Outings, Householder Bows Out

FRESNO - The career of a competitive athlete is fleeting. Hundreds. probably thousands end every day. Many athletes leave their sports without so much as a whisper, while others are honored for their dedication and hard work; and a precious few bow out in a blaze of glory.

For UCSB softball catcher Kristi Householder, a native of Fresno, the stage was set for an emotional culmination to her fouryear Gaucho career.

In their final games of the season, the last place Gauchos played the PCAAleading and 3rd-ranked Fresno State Bulldogs in front of 750 partisan fans. A sweep by the Bulldogs would clinch them a tie for the league championship, giving the Gauchos

chance to play spoilers.

But despite Householder's parents and fiance in the stands and outstanding efforts by pitchers Andrea Serrano and Ronelle Reed, UCSB dropped the double-header. The catcher had to be content that her team played even with one of the best squads in the nation, before falling by scores of 1-0 in both games.

"I wasn't disappointed in the way we played at all,'

Householder said. "Considering the way the season's gone, I don't think I could have expected anything better, but it would have been real nice to have an upset. My only disappointment is that I didn't hit well; had I done that, then I would have no regrets whatsoever."

Serrano, who was the "hostess" on the bus ride to San Jose (where games were rained out) and

Women's Tennis Wrap-up

Gaucho Netters Finish a Topsy-Turvy Season, **Breaking Even at End**

The Dow Jones. An Eric McArthur pump fake. An earthouake registering 6.3 on the Richter. Billy Martin's mood swings. Michael Jordan and UCSB women's tennis.

Say what? Yes, Gaucho tennis ran an up-and-down pattern during the 1988 campaign, but its 11-11 overall record and 4th place PCAA tournament finish will serve as a foundation to be built on next year.

There were some shoes to be filled at the start of the season. The team lost starters Becky Barmore, Hemel Meghani, and Lori Jonas. It lost Jill Thomson at the beginning of the regular season, so Coach Lisa Beritzhoff fielded a young lineup with five freshmen among her top nine players.

The year started off on a dubious note. Mediocre showings at the Ed Doty Invitational and the Rolex Tournament last fall left UCSB with doubts as the regular season approached.

And the start of the regular season wasn't one they wanted to write home about, either. Losses to national powerhouses, UCLA and USC, put a damper on Gaucho spirits, leaving them 0-2 early

But UCSB bounced back for three straight wins, capped by a 6-3 win over the Univ. of San Diego, a top-25 team. The squad hovered around the .500 mark for the rest of the season, but the pinnacle of the year was achieved during a 3match win streak where the Gauchos knocked off Colorado and two top-25 squads: Harvard and PCAA foe San Diego State. The win over SDSU, a team UCSB had never beaten, was "the biggest win in school history," according to Beritzhoff.

After a regular-season ending loss to UC Irvine, the Gauchos tuned up for the PCAA Championships with a mediocre showing at the Ojai Tournament. But the Gauchos were still confident going into April 28th's PCAA Tournament

They had a mission to accomplish. In 1986 and 1987, despite strong showings, the Blue and Gold placed second behind rival SDSU. With a regular-season victory over the defending PCAA champs, the Gauchos were optimistic about their chances to this time take the title away from the Aztecs.

However, the road to the PCAA Championship took a Uturn. The Gauchos started off strong on day one, trailing San Diego State by only four points, but were outplayed on the second day, ultimately finishing in fourth place overall.

"We came together and we were prepared. We just didn't rise to the occasion," Beritzhoff said. "We didn't play to our potential, but then we didn't play terribly either. It was a case where on a given day, some players just played better. Five teams had a chance to win it. Look at UC Irvine; We lost to them twice and they finished fifth. It was really close."

Some players echoed Beritzhoff's statement that some

players just performed better in the PCAAs. "It just wasn't our day. We tried as hard as we could but we didn't have our best tournament," freshman Julie Coakley said. She and Liz Costa were favored to win the #3 doubles title, but lost in the finals. "We had a tough match and we gave it our best shot, but they played a little bit better," she

"I base my lectures upon

sport with students," he triathlete, as well as utilizing UCSB cycling coach, wayne Stelly, and UCSB's men's cross country track coach, Pete Dolan.

"I lost 6-1 in the first set, but six of those games went to 3-3. It was a long, close match. I felt I played well, but she played the key points better so I don't feel bad at all."

Despite the disappointing finish, Beritzhoff characterized the season as being a positive one.

"At the beginning of the season, we set four goals for ourselves," she said. "Our first goal was to make the season a positive, learning experience. Our second goal was to beat teams in dual matches that we had lost to the year before. We wanted to become more cohesive as a unit and our final goal was to take the PCAA title.

"We didn't win the tournament, but I think we accomplished our other three goals. For the first time in the two years I've been here, I felt the team really came together. We pulled for each other and we carried each other as a team. We also beat some teams we haven't beaten before like Harvard and San Diego State. The girls were motivated throughout the whole season and they worked hard. I give them a lot of credit."

Individually, some Gauchos had outstanding years. Franki Heron had a magnificent year in the #6 singles spot. She posted a 15-6 singles record during the regular season, but was on top of her game in the tournament. The junior from Oxnard finished second at the Ojai tourney and captured the #6 singles championship in Hawaii. Add in her tournament matches and her record blossomed to 22-7.

"Franki had an outstanding year. She is disciplined and determined, and she offered a lot of

leadership," Beritzhoff said. "She was a great asset to the team and she played great all year. Franki deserved the championship.

Johnstone had a good year also. The freshman from Scottsdale, Ariz. assumed the #1 singles spot in February and recorded two wins over Sondra Mitchell and top-15 player Ginger Helgeson. She'll be back to lead the Gauchos in 1988-89.

The doubles tandem of Coakley and Costa had an almost perfect year. The twosome did not lose a single dual match all year and despite having the year tarnished by a season-ending loss in the PCAA tournament, they still ended the year at a sparkling 20-4.

Next season begins this summer, with some members of the team participating on the amateur circuit. Beritzhoff noted that two recruits should add to the team's depth next year, with UCSB offering tough competition in the PCAA.

Fresno, passed out chocolate-covered Oreos, red vine licorice, Bayarian pretzels, yogurt-covered nuts and beef jerky to hungry Gaucho snackers, but gave absolutely nothing to Fresno State in the first game.

In a stellar performance, the freshman held the Bulldogs scoreless through six innings. The only time FSU hit the ball out of the infield was via harmless singles.

But in the bottom of the seventh inning, visions of a Gaucho upset were wiped away. With Fresno runners on second and third bases with one out, Bulldog Jill Polanco singled up the middle to end it.

As the ball raced into centerfield, the runner crossed the plate and was engulfed by jubilant teammates. Serrano turned and walked slowly to the Gaucho dugout with the look of a season of frustration on her face.

The Gauchos collected just two hits against Frenso's alltime win leader Malanie Parrent (88-37 career, 24-9 this season). Unfortunately for UCSB, it would face Carie Dever (24-5) next.

Dever baffled the Gauchos all day, striking out 11 batters, including the first six she faced, pitching a twohitter of her own.

But Reed was holding her own on the mound until the Bulldogs loaded the bases in the bottom of the fifth inning, and with two outs, FSU's RaeAnn Fiferini hit a dribbler back to Reed. In what Reed called "a major breakdown," instead of going to first for the inningending out, she threw too late to homeplate. The run gave Fresno a 1-0 lead, a lead Dever wasn't about to give up.

"I'm usually more of a finesse pitcher," Dever said. "I usually don't average as many strikeouts as I had today, but I was really on, and my ball was really moving. But (the Gauchos) were 100 percent improved since the last time we played them. They played a fantastic game today. They made some really good plays. They were definitely three or four times stronger than when we saw them last

Reed gave much credit for the Gauchos' strong showing to Householder.

"The one word I can think of to describe 'House' today is intense," Reed said. "Before the game she went over the last time we played them and the pitches we threw and what they hit and didn't hit. She knew exactly who could hit what. She was calling really well and kept

(the Bulldogs) off balance." Although Householder she was satisfied with her team's growth this season.

"I think we improved tenfold since the beginning of the season. Compare the Bakersfield games (the Gauchos' third and fourth of the season) with the Fresno games, and there's no comparison, it's a totally different team, no doubt."

Householder also reflected on her career, one in which she caught 215 games for the Gauchos.

"It was a satisfying career. I learned a lot from the people on the teams and from the coaches. I learned a lot about dealing with people in a team situation, tempers and pitchers' personalities. I think you learn a lot more from those kinds of things than you do from text-books."

Finally, Reed put the season into perspective as she reclined in her car on a lonely road somewhere between Fresno and Santa Barbara.

"Our whole team wanted to win so bad but winning wasn't everything - just playing well was; we just don't give up," she said. "Look at our record and look at how we played today. Our team worked so hard this year, and, even though we don't win, we don't give up. I guess that's a sign we're a good team. Although our record (6-50) doesn't show it, ended her career with losses, our perseverance does.

Out of 900 participants (350 women and 550 men), UCSB's tri-students finished well. Michael Baldwin placed 13th in his age division, 125th overall, and Willie Elsass was close behind with a 14th in age

division and 128th overall.

For the women, Jamie Nielsen placed 11th in her age division and 30th overall, while Kathy Dickerson placed 16th in age division, 39th overall. Sheri Lee and Lisa Hybarger also participated but did not finish due to flat tires on the bike course.

The class's next triathlon will be on May 23 starting at 8 a.m. at Campus Pool. It will consist of a 500-yard swim, a 12-mile bike ride and a three-mile run and will finish at the bike racks by Rob Gym, which is also the transition point between the swim and bike portions of the event.

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
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




