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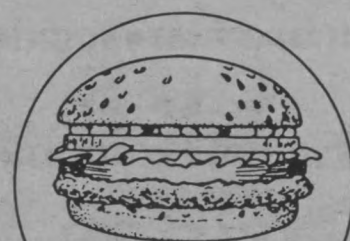
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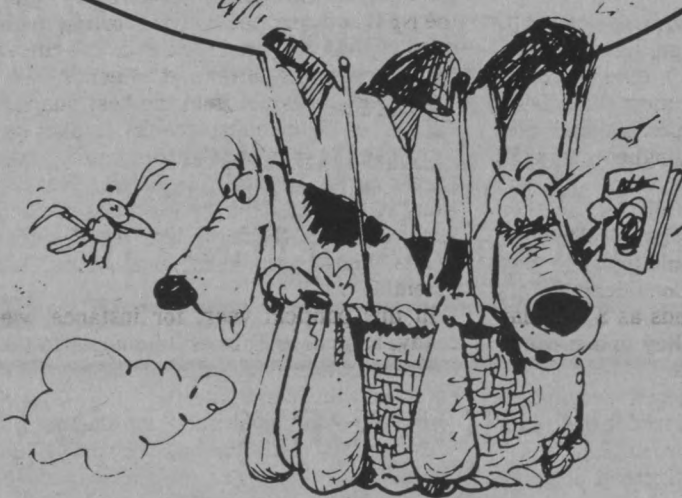
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# Greeks, All the Others Could Make Strides Toward Peace

We seem to get caught up in such petty squabbles and concerns that we lose perspective of what is really important: a ten-kiloton nuclear bomb should help establish this perspective.

One of the major flaws in the greek system, and I'm sure some people don't regard it as a flaw, is the inherent predisposition towards elitism, which I believe can be largely

attributed to the current rush procedure. I also believe that elitism is one of the major arguments against greek systems. Getting the greek system to radically change its rush program is not why I'm writing now, and I don't think it would occur too easily, but here's a possible solution anyway: an informal, year-long process, in which members extend invitations to people after they feel as though they truly know that person. Obviously friends of members will have an edge, but there is no competition. Other people interested can meet members at events such as lunches, dinners, sports events, parties, etc. With this process, a person's inner qualities will shine through according to their nature, and superficial choosing would be greatly curbed — and hopefully abolished.

I am trying to spread a message: let's be friends. Let's fill our lives with love instead of hate. Attitudes are self-fulfilling prophecies; we shape our own destinies. If we approach life and other people with negative vibrations and attitudes, we must take full responsibility for negative reactions. It is time to be brave; it is time for peace.

The greek letter wall is not so tall. It is time to overlook differences, and set our sights on unification. If we start it here, at UCSB, it will spread outward, as is true of good vibrations.

# ays, Who Cares? Just be White in the NFL

mpstead High School in New York was the nation's second best college player and quarterback.

Recognition ordinarily would lead to a contract in the National Football League. Here is this six-footer, fleet and hand-eye coordinated by everyone's assessment is an exuberantly gifted leader. More than any other player in the Syracuse field, McPherson was selected for his team's undefeated regular season.

College teams besides Syracuse, eager to increase their winning percentage, have strayed from the years and fielded black quarterbacks. Individual sinners have most often been repentant before turning professional and joining the National Football League — as wide

regard against being drafted for another "acceptable" for blacks, McPherson would have signed with any of the NFL teams that he would agree to play as a quarterback. Considering his situation, this necessity stands as a singular example of that apartheid policy under which chooses its quarterbacks.

McPherson's courageous serving of the Cincinnati Bengals offered to draft him for a safety, wide receiver or running back. He was offered and paid the price. Instead of going to the Bengals, the best quarterback in the NFL in America was the 149th player selected in the draft.

Not drafted as a quarterback, McPherson signed up in the NFL's unwritten racial quota system. The team that drafted him, the Philadelphia Eagles, already has one of the three black quarterbacks.

There has been no outcry from the media or the fans to their silent consent to this racist policy. The lesson football teaches blacks in the NFL case is repeated a million times in the

larger society: You will be humiliated for excelling at a profession for which the dominant society has judged you unfit. When it comes time for blacks to be judged for positions of power, glamor or influence, their achievement and skill, to say nothing of their potential, are vetoed by race.

As laws have been stripped away, the customs are still rigidly enforced. There exists no law, for instance, preventing blacks from playing quarterback, but the custom is vigorously enforced by the NFL and certified by the sporting media, who have virtually ignored the issue. The rules are set to preserve white power and influence.

The NFL does not field the best quarterbacks, but the best white quarterbacks. It takes no genius to foresee how a McPherson might just be the player to do for the Los Angeles Raiders what Doug Williams did for the Redskins. We will never know, for the Raiders, like the 25 other NFL teams, chose skin color over talent, skill and potential.

In this political year, for instance, we stand ready, as in recent times, to quarter in the White House not the best potential president, but the best potential white candidate.

In this, I do not disguise an argument for the presidential qualifications of Jesse Jackson. Rather I speak against an American system that has denied a million Jacksons that opportunity to acquire prerequisite experience. This same system, when faced with black candidates who, despite the obstacles, have miraculously met all prerequisites — like McPherson or Tom Bradley when he ran for governor of California — rejects them despite their qualifications.

What results is a system based not on meritocracy but on apartheid. This more than any other disease accounts for America's rapid fall from grace and world power.

## Softball So Close, Drops 2 to Fresno, 1-0, 1-0

*Pitchers Serrano and Reed Have Stellar Outings, Householder Bows Out*

FRESNO — The career of a competitive athlete is fleeting. Hundreds, probably thousands end every day. Many athletes leave their sports without so much as a whisper, while others are honored for their dedication and hard work; and a precious few bow out in a blaze of glory.

For UCSB softball catcher Kristi Householder, a native of Fresno, the stage was set for an emotional culmination to her four-year Gaucho career.

In their final games of the season, the last place Gauchos played the PCAA-leading and 3rd-ranked Fresno State Bulldogs in front of 750 partisan fans. A sweep by the Bulldogs would clinch them a tie for the league championship, giving the Gauchos a

chance to play spoilers.

But despite Householder's parents and fiancé in the stands and outstanding efforts by pitchers Andrea Serrano and Ronelle Reed, UCSB dropped the double-header. The catcher had to be content that her team played even with one of the best squads in the nation, before falling by scores of 1-0 in both games.

"I wasn't disappointed in the way we played at all,"

Householder said. "Considering the way the season's gone, I don't think I could have expected anything better, but it would have been real nice to have an upset. My only disappointment is that I didn't hit well; had I done that, then I would have no regrets whatsoever."

Serrano, who was the "hostess" on the bus ride to San Jose (where games were rained out) and

## UCSB Triathletes Benefit from Class

The reasons for entering have nothing to do with winning.

For the second straight year, UCSB has established a major milestone in the world of triathlons by being the first university in the nation to integrate the sport with the classroom.

Rich Powell, a former triathlete and current UCSB lecturer, instructs the "tri-class." He was part of the nucleus that helped originate the triathlon in the early '70s in San Diego.

"I wanted to share my

interest and love for the sport with students," he said. "I began the class because I wanted to see students working on becoming ultra-fit and incorporating triathlon training as part of their lifestyle."

The class involves scheduled workouts of running, biking and swimming, as well as Wednesday lectures.

"I base my lectures upon

my personal experience as a triathlete, as well as utilizing outside resources such as UCSB cycling coach, Wayne Stelly, and UCSB's men's cross country track coach, Pete Dolan.

"We've also had professionals speak to the students about how they've made a career from their interest in the triathlon, such as the chief editors of *Competitor* and *Triathlete* magazine as well as a race

director and professional triathlete. This exposure allows the students to explore ultra-fitness career possibilities while studying at UCSB."

Many of the students have already competed in triathlons and use the class to enhance their training with scientifically based methods provided by Powell. Others are in the class to develop and refine basic skills; however, all the students participate in the class to achieve a well-balanced lifestyle.

Powell is currently working with one student interested in establishing a

# GaUCHO Netters Finish a Topsy-Turvy Season, Breaking Even at End

The Dow Jones. An Eric McArthur pump fake. An earthquake registering 6.3 on the Richter. Billy Martin's mood swings. Michael Jordan and UCSB women's tennis.

Say what? Yes, GaUCHO tennis ran an up-and-down pattern during the 1988 campaign, but its 11-11 overall record and 4th place PCAA tournament finish will serve as a foundation to be built on next year.

There were some shoes to be filled at the start of the season. The team lost starters Becky Barmore, Hemel Meghani, and Lori Jonas. It lost Jill Thomson at the beginning of the regular season, so Coach Lisa Beritzhoff fielded a young lineup with five freshmen among her top nine players.

The year started off on a dubious note. Mediocre showings at the Ed Doty Invitational and the Rolex Tournament last fall left UCSB with doubts as the regular season approached.

And the start of the regular season wasn't one they wanted to write home about, either. Losses to national powerhouses, UCLA and USC, put a damper on GaUCHO spirits, leaving them 0-2 early.

But UCSB bounced back for three straight wins, capped by a 6-3 win over the Univ. of San Diego, a top-25 team. The squad hovered around the .500 mark for the rest of the season, but the pinnacle of the year was achieved during a 3-match win streak where the GaUCHOs knocked off Colorado and two top-25 squads: Harvard and PCAA foe San Diego State. The win over SDSU, a team UCSB had never beaten, was "the biggest win in school history," according to Beritzhoff.

After a regular-season ending loss to UC Irvine, the GaUCHOs tuned up for the PCAA Championships with a mediocre showing at the Ojai Tournament. But the GaUCHOs were still confident going into April 28th's PCAA Tournament in Hawaii.

They had a mission to accomplish. In 1986 and 1987, despite strong showings, the Blue and Gold placed second behind rival SDSU. With a regular-season victory over the defending PCAA champs, the GaUCHOs were optimistic about their chances to this time take the title away from the Aztecs.

However, the road to the PCAA Championship took a U-turn. The GaUCHOs started off strong on day one, trailing San Diego State by only four points, but were outplayed on the second day, ultimately finishing in fourth place overall.

"We came together and we were prepared. We just didn't rise to the occasion," Beritzhoff said. "We didn't play to our potential, but then we didn't play terribly either. It was a case where on a given day, some players just played better. Five teams had a chance to win it. Look at UC Irvine; We lost to them twice and they finished fifth. It was really close."

Some players echoed Beritzhoff's statement that some players just performed better in the PCAAs.

"It just wasn't our day. We tried as hard as we could but we didn't have our best tournament," freshman Julie Coakley said. She and Liz Costa were favored to win the #3 doubles title, but lost in the finals. "We had a tough match and we gave it our best shot, but they played a little bit better," she added.

Tracie Johnstone, the team's #1 singles player, lost a 6-1, 6-

 semifinal match to San Diego State's Sondra Mitchell, saying that Mitchell played better on key points.  
 "I lost 6-1 in the first set, but six of those games went to 3-3. It was a long, close match. I felt I played well, but she played the key points better so I don't feel bad at all."  
 Despite the disappointing finish, Beritzhoff characterized the season as being a positive one.  
 "At the beginning of the season, we set four goals for ourselves," she said. "Our first goal was to make the season a positive, learning experience. Our second goal was to beat teams in dual matches that we had lost to the year before. We wanted to become more cohesive as a unit and our final goal was to take the PCAA title."  
 "We didn't win the tournament, but I think we ac-

complished our other three goals. For the first time in the two years I've been here, I felt the team really came together. We pulled for each other and we carried each other as a team. We also beat some teams we haven't beaten before like Harvard and San Diego State. The girls were motivated throughout the whole season and they worked hard. I give them a lot of credit."  
 Individually, some Gauchos had outstanding years. Franki Heron had a magnificent year in the #6 singles spot. She posted a 15-6 singles record during the regular season, but was on top of her game in the tournament. The junior from Oxnard finished second at the Ojai tourney and captured the #6 singles championship in Hawaii. Add in her tournament matches and her record blossomed to 22-7.  
 "Franki had an outstanding year. She is disciplined and determined, and she offered a lot of

leadership," Beritzhoff said. "She was a great asset to the team and she played great all year. Franki deserved the championship."  
 Johnstone had a good year also. The freshman from Scottsdale, Ariz. assumed the #1 singles spot in February and recorded two wins over Sondra Mitchell and top-15 player Ginger Helgeson. She'll be back to lead the Gauchos in 1988-89.  
 The doubles tandem of Coakley and Costa had an almost perfect year. The twosome did not lose a single dual match all year and despite having the year tarnished by a season-ending loss in the PCAA tournament, they still ended the year at a sparkling 20-4.  
 Next season begins this summer, with some members of the team participating on the amateur circuit. Beritzhoff noted that two recruits should add to the team's depth next year, with UCSB offering tough competition in the PCAA.

 Fresno, passed out chocolate-covered Oreos, red vine licorice, Bavarian pretzels, yogurt-covered nuts and beef jerky to hungry Gaucho snackers, but gave absolutely nothing to Fresno State in the first game.  
 In a stellar performance, the freshman held the Bulldogs scoreless through six innings. The only time FSU hit the ball out of the infield was via harmless singles.  
 But in the bottom of the seventh inning, visions of a Gaucho upset were wiped away. With Fresno runners on second and third bases with one out, Bulldog Jill Polanco singled up the middle to end it.  
 As the ball raced into centerfield, the runner crossed the plate and was engulfed by jubilant teammates. Serrano turned and walked slowly to the Gaucho dugout with the look of a season of frustration on her face.  
 The Gauchos collected just two hits against Fresno's all-time win leader Malanie Parrent (88-37 career, 24-9 this season). Unfortunately for UCSB, it would face Carie Dever (24-5) next.  
 Dever baffled the Gauchos all day, striking out 11 batters, including the first six she faced, pitching a two-hitter of her own.

But Reed was holding her own on the mound until the Bulldogs loaded the bases in the bottom of the fifth inning, and with two outs, FSU's RaeAnn Fiferini hit a dribbler back to Reed. In what Reed called "a major breakdown," instead of going to first for the inning-ending out, she threw too late to homeplate. The run gave Fresno a 1-0 lead, a lead Dever wasn't about to give up.  
 "I'm usually more of a finesse pitcher," Dever said. "I usually don't average as many strikeouts as I had today, but I was really on, and my ball was really moving. But (the Gauchos) were 100 percent improved since the last time we played them. They played a fantastic game today. They made some really good plays. They were definitely three or four times stronger than when we saw them last time."  
 Reed gave much credit for the Gauchos' strong showing to Householder.  
 "The one word I can think of to describe 'House' today is intense," Reed said. "Before the game she went over the last time we played them and the pitches we threw and what they hit and didn't hit. She knew exactly who could hit what. She was calling really well and kept (the Bulldogs) off balance."  
 Although Householder ended her career with losses,

she was satisfied with her team's growth this season.  
 "I think we improved tenfold since the beginning of the season. Compare the Bakersfield games (the Gauchos' third and fourth of the season) with the Fresno games, and there's no comparison, it's a totally different team, no doubt."  
 Householder also reflected on her career, one in which she caught 215 games for the Gauchos.  
 "It was a satisfying career. I learned a lot from the people on the teams and from the coaches. I learned a lot about dealing with people in a team situation, tempers and pitchers' personalities. I think you learn a lot more from those kinds of things than you do from textbooks."  
 Finally, Reed put the season into perspective as she reclined in her car on a lonely road somewhere between Fresno and Santa Barbara.  
 "Our whole team wanted to win so bad but winning wasn't everything — just playing well was; we just don't give up," she said. "Look at our record and look at how we played today. Our team worked so hard this year, and, even though we don't win, we don't give up. I guess that's a sign we're a good team. Although our record (6-50) doesn't show it, our perseverance does."

 UCSB triathlon club beginning next year.  
 "I'm hoping that some students will be interested in participating with other universities intercollegiately," Powell added. "The 1988 Illinois National Collegiate Tri-Championships is in September, and I'd like to send some of our students to represent UCSB. If we are able to achieve an intercollegiate level of competition, the sport will have progressed far more than I would have ever expected."  
 Influenced by the class, six

students participated in last week's Wildflower Triathlon, a total of a half-mile swim, an 11-mile bike ride and a 4.5-mile run.  
 The short-distance triathlon is known for its challenging course. "The 30-knot wind factor along with the intense hills in both the bike and run were enough to question my sanity during the race," competitor Kathy Dickerson said.  
 Out of 900 participants (350 women and 550 men), UCSB's tri-students finished well. Michael Baldwin placed 13th in his age division, 125th overall, and Willie Elsass was close behind with a 14th in age

division and 128th overall.  
 For the women, Jamie Nielsen placed 11th in her age division and 30th overall, while Kathy Dickerson placed 16th in age division, 39th overall. Sheri Lee and Lisa Hybarger also participated but did not finish due to flat tires on the bike course.  
 The class's next triathlon will be on May 23 starting at 8 a.m. at Campus Pool. It will consist of a 500-yard swim, a 12-mile bike ride and a three-mile run and will finish at the bike racks by Rob Gym, which is also the transition point between the swim and bike portions of the event.

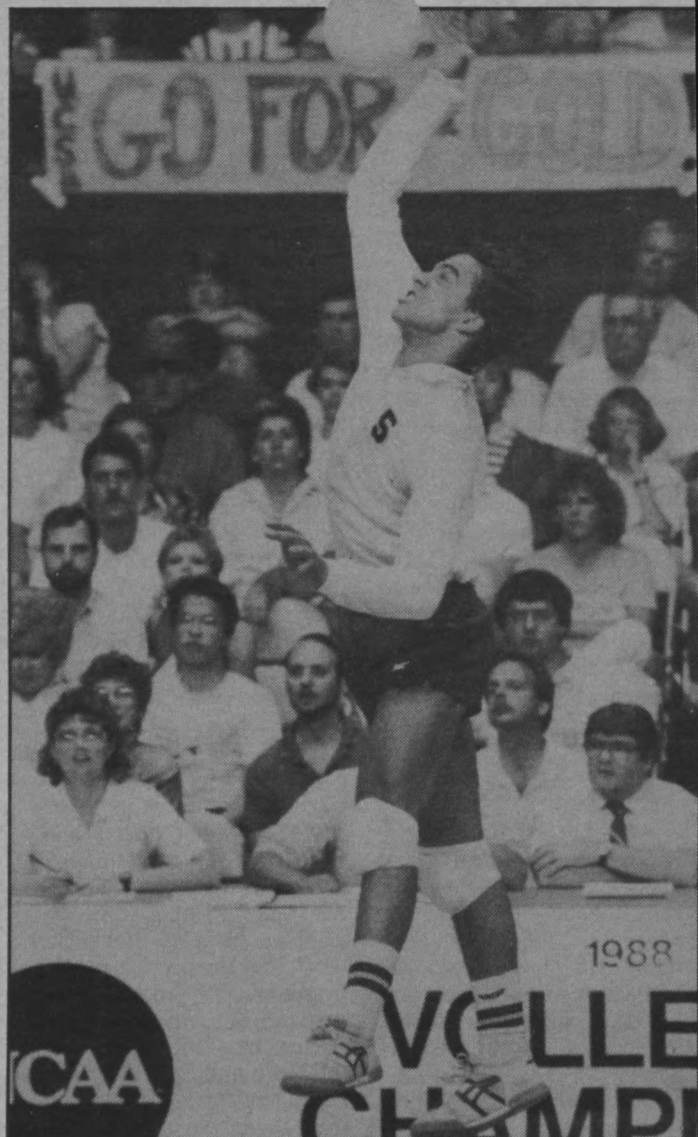

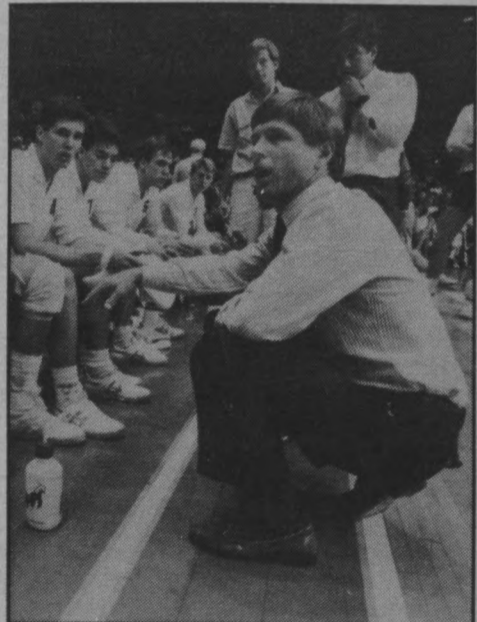
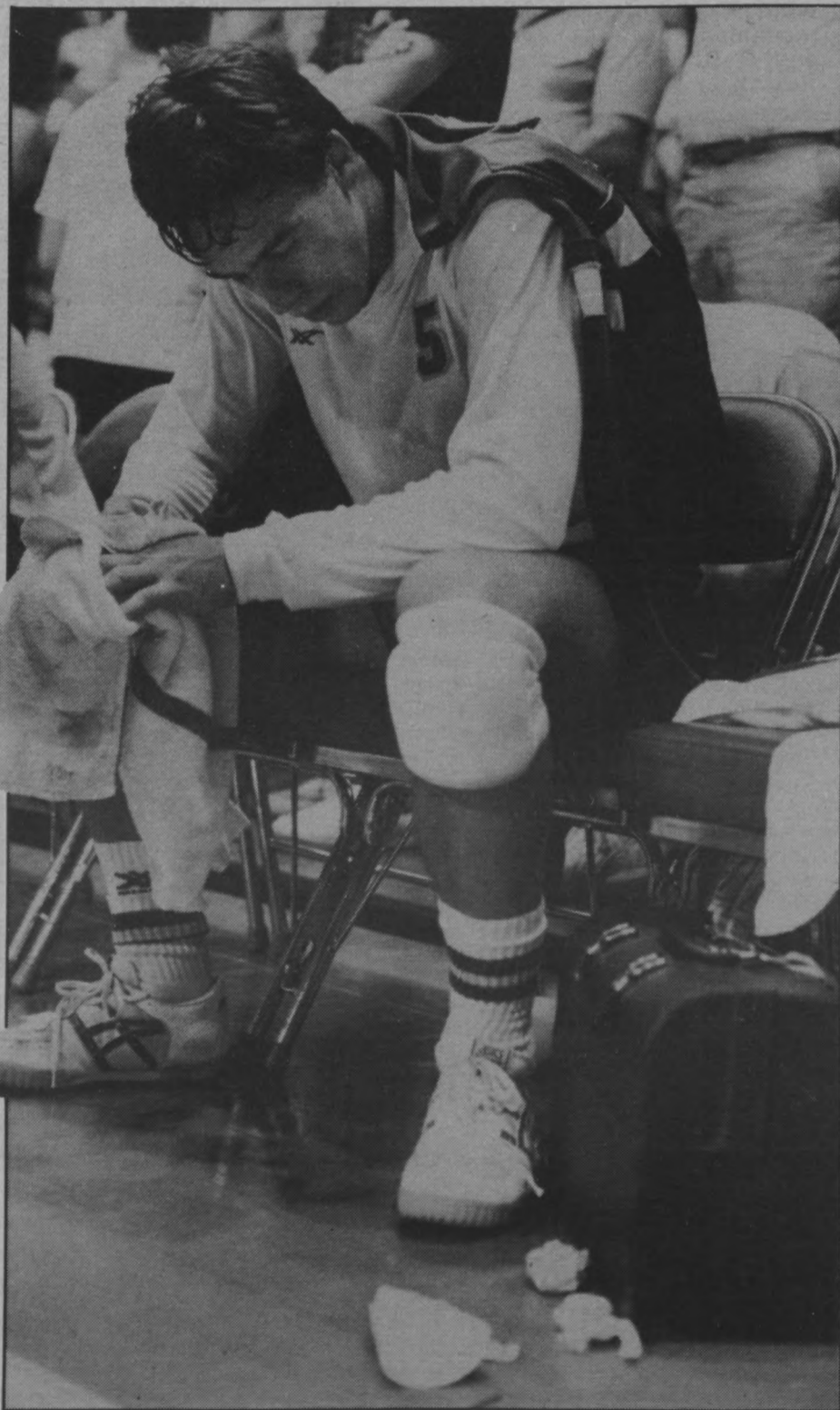

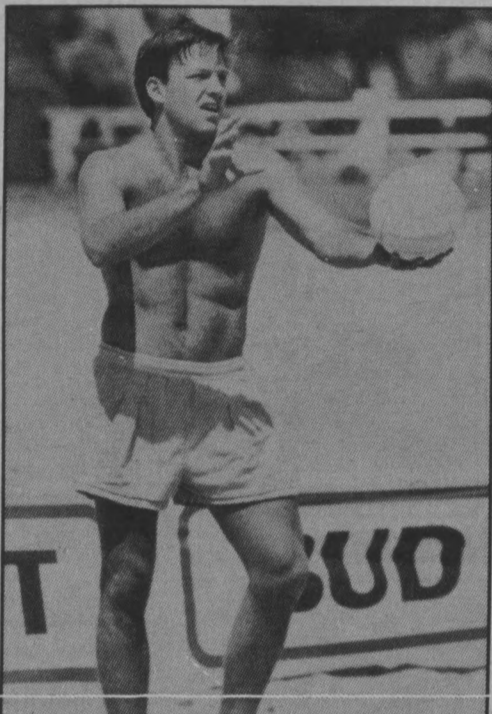
## Sigma Chi Dominates 'B' Bracket

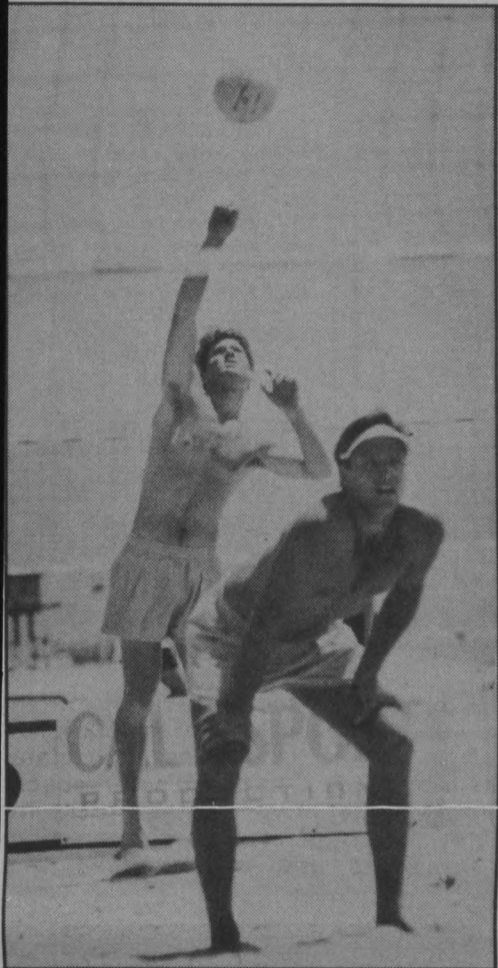
As expected, Stanford's #1-seeded Delta Theta team Ryan O'Hara and Parker Blackman defeated USC's Beta Theta Phi team Adam Johnson and Doyle Richmond in the A final, 11-7.

After being dropped to the lower bracket due to a third-round upset to Anthony Curci and Steve Bunce of UCLA's Sigma Chi chapter, UCSB's A division #6-seeded Sigma Chi team Joe Meisbaur and Matty Matheissen advanced to the semifinals by defeating Greg Eilber and Steve Goon of UCLA's Phi Kappa Psi chapter, and then UCSB's Phi Delta Theta brothers Frole and Alzina. But Meisbaur and Matheissen lost to Stanford's Sigma Chi team of Melton and Hinkle.

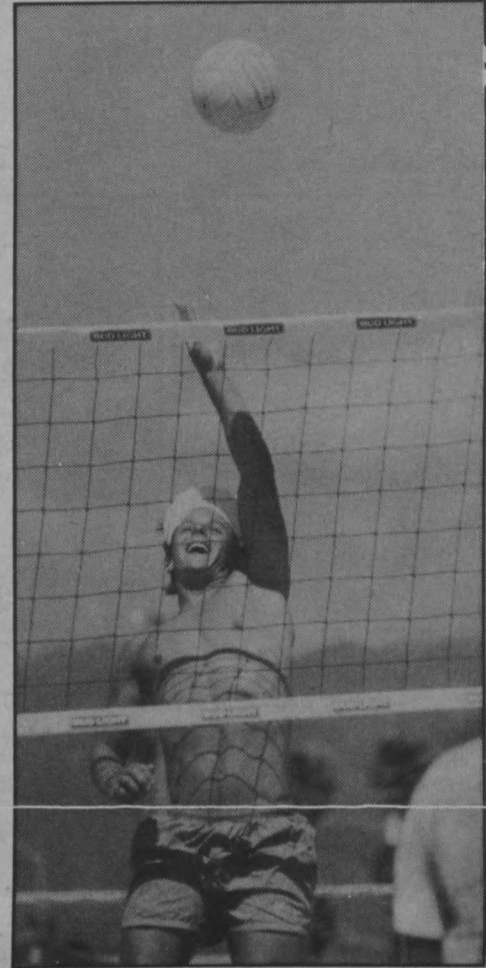
Phi Delta Theta's Mark Dawson and Sean Wilson, also UCSB A-division hopefuls, advanced to the quarterfinals in the upper bracket, but they were defeated by #1-seeded Stanford. 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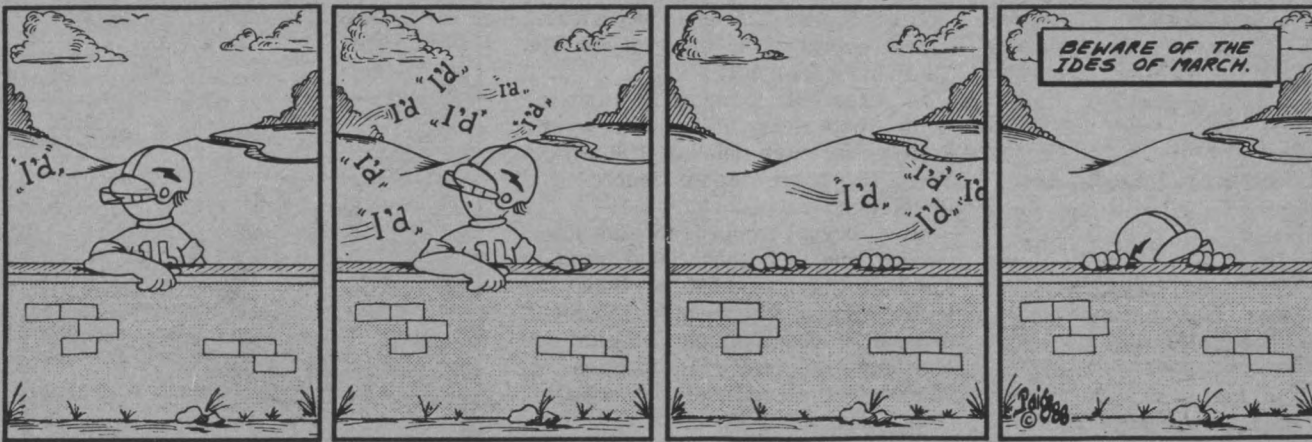

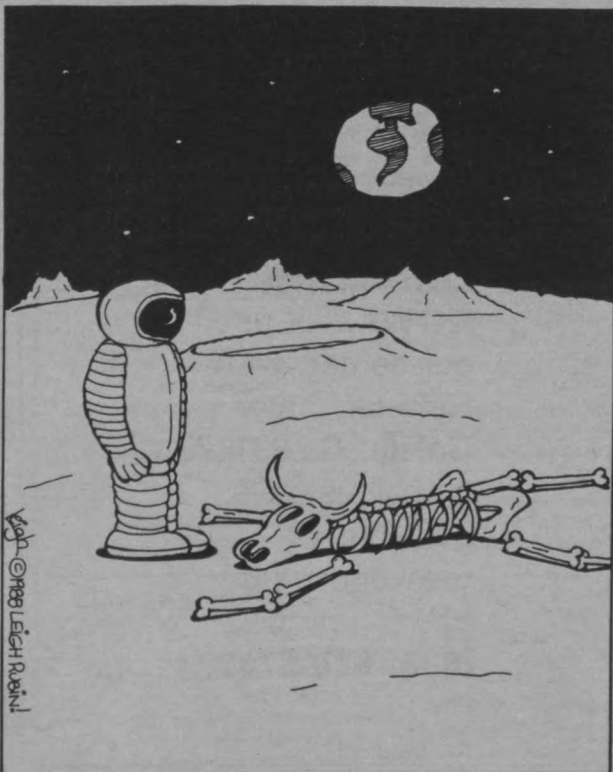
