

UNIVERSITY EXTENSION COURSE

Improvement of Reading Ability will be a University of California Extension Course to be offered each Monday evening beginning July 6, for five weeks at 7 p.m. in Studio 5, Community Center, 914 Santa Barbara St.

Dr. Lester B. Sands, Associate Professor of Education, will be the instructor. The course will include study and practice under supervision in methods of increasing effectiveness in reading, especially for adults. It is designed for those who wish to increase reading speed, comprehension and build a vocabulary.

It is a self improvement course, with no credit given. Registration may be accomplished at the first class meeting or at the UC Extension Office, 906 Santa Barbara St.
